German Foreign Minister Klaus Kinkel will arrive tomorrow in the RS for an official visit. He is to hold separate meetings with the RS President Biljana Plavsic and the RS Prime Minister Milorad Dodik in Banja Luka tomorrow. After the press conference, according to the protocol, there will be a cocktail at the hotel "Bosna". Afterwards, he will meet with the heads of the religious communities in B&H – with the Banja Luka Orthodox Bishop Jefrem, Catholic Bishop Franjo Komarica and Mufti Ibrahim Halilovic. During his one-day stay in Banja Luka Klaus Kinkel will also be present at the presentation ceremony of the computer equipment which is a gift of the German government to the RS government.
