OHR RTRS News Summary, 27 Novembe 2000

RT RS News Headlines:

- OSCE announces final, PEC technically certified election results: in RS presidential race, SDS candidates Sarovic and Cavic win with 50.2% of the vote;
- In election race for RS National Assembly, SDS wins 31 seats, SNSD 11, PDP 11, SDA 6, SPRS - 4, DSP - 4, SDP BiH - 4, Party for BiH - 4, DNS - 3, SNS - 2, DSRS - 1, NHI - 1 and RS Pensioner Party - 1;
- In election race for BiH House of Representatives (combined results for delegates from RS and BiH Federation), SDP has 9 seats, SDA – 8, SDS – 6, HDZ – 5, Party for BiH – 5, PDP – 2, and so on;
- In election race for BiH Federation Parliament, SDA has 38 seats, SDP 37, HDZ 25 and Party for BiH – 21
- Sarovic and Cavic meet with <u>OSCE</u> Head Barry; Barry congratulates them on election victory; they discuss implementation of election results and establishment of new authority and institutions in RS
- BiH Presidency [Croat] member Ante Jelavic meets with Barry and <u>NATO</u> Deputy Commander for Europe Rupert Smith to discuss implementation of election results
- BiH Presidency [Bosniak] member Halid Genjac hold talks in Sarajevo on Monday with Barry on implementation of general election results
- Radisic meets with Rupert Smith on Monday to discuss stabilisation of political situation in Yugoslavia, which will contribute to stabilisation of political situation in region
- Zivko Radisic meets with UK ambassador to BiH Graham Hand to discuss election results
- Radisic meets with delegation of International Association of Co-operatives in Sarajevo on Monday

- RTRS reports <u>SFOR</u> soldiers and several civilians attempted to arrest Slobodan Sevo in village of Donja Piskavica near Prijedor on Sunday at 18:40 because <u>SFOR</u> soldiers though they were arresting Zeljko Mejakic, an indicted war crimes suspect; Belgrade-based BETA news agency reports attack perpetrated on Sevo by mistake
- Return of Bosniaks to Srbinje Municipality started seven months ago and 400 have returned so
 far; German <u>SFOR</u> contingent assisted this return by financing reconstruction of five Bosniak
 houses in Srbinje settlement Donje Polje, which refugees use for interim accommodation
- BiH Minister for Civil Affairs and Communication and representative of Japanese Development Agency sign Transport Master Plan Agreement in Sarajevo; agreement to regulate transport within entities, between entities and between BiH and other countries
- Christmas fast for Orthodox faithful to start on 28 November and continue for 40 days
- First snowfall this year in RS recorded on Mount Lisina on Monday
