2-Of nine satisfied CoE accession tasks requiring adoption of legislation (that excludes the task under Heading 3 the full compliance with decisions of the human rights chamber, Ombudsperson and Commission for Displaced persons and Refugees by the State authorities) only three – *the BiH Law on Immigration and Asylum*, *the BiH Revised Law on Citizenship* and *The [RS] Laws to Establish Independent Selection Procedures for Judges and Prosecutors and Priority to Adequate Judicial Salaries* – were adopted by relevant governmental bodies. The other five were imposed. Out of the six laws imposed, only one, the *State Law on Citizenship*, was subsequently passed by the BiH Parliamentary Assembly.
