

## **Remarks by Senior Deputy HR Werner Wnendt at an Event organized by the NGO “Children – the Pillars of the World”**

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I would like to congratulate the NGO, “Children – the Pillars of the World”, on launching this event.

It is especially interesting that the opening comes just as another great and significant cultural event for Sarajevo – International Festival Sarajevo Winter – is closing.

Events such as these show that Sarajevo is one of the most active and lively cities in Europe when it comes to cultural activities. They are important because they draw positive attention to Sarajevo .

What sets this event apart from others is the fact that it is dedicated to children. Children really do represent the pillars of every society, as the name of your organization stipulates, and as such they deserve our special attention. I wish you every success in the activities you plan to implement and hope that this will only be the beginning of many similar events to come.
