Ambassador Hancock has had a distinguished career in the Canadian Foreign Office and has extensive professional knowledge of the region. In recent years Ambassador Hancock has held a number of high level positions, serving as Canadian Ambassador to Poland, the German Democratic Republic, Turkey, Georgia and Azerbaijan.
