

After Dayton: OHR and OSCE Launch Photo Exhibit of Regional Artists

On the occasion of the fifth anniversary of the signing of the Dayton Peace Agreement, the Office of the High Representative and the OSCE Mission to Bosnia and Herzegovina are pleased to announce the launch of a photographic exhibit featuring artists from across the Former Yugoslavia, entitled "The Aftermath".

These photographs chronicle the historic events of Southeast Europe through the last decade of the twentieth century, which have forever changed the political and social landscape of this region. These works represent some of the best photographic talents in the ex-Yugoslavia, and have been published in such internationally renowned publications such as Time, Newsweek and The Guardian.
