Nevenka Trfkovic , PDP Secretary General, has stated that there is a possibility of seeing PDP official re-assume their duties at BiH CoM. She has also noted that PDP officials would leave Neum meeting if the issue on constitutional changes was raised, as speculated in media lately. PDP President, Mladen Ivanic , will hold a press conference at 12:00 hrs at Kula near Sarajevo, where Ivanic would present PDP stances regarding settlement of BiH COM's crisis. Borislav Bojic , SDS Vice President, has noted that if the issue of constitutional changes were raised, SDS officials would leave the meeting.
