<b>Humphreys says EC would support any RS Government elected in accordance with laws</b>	<b>SRNA, RTRS, BH Radio, RHB</b> - The Head of EC delegation to BiH, <b>Michael Humphreys</b> said EC would support the election of any government in RS, which has been elected in accordance with the Law and is committed to reforms. He gave the statement following today's meeting in Banja Luka with the outgoing RS Premier, <b>Dragan Mikerevic</b> . He announced he would also meet <b>Pero Bukejlovic</b> today.
<b>Ivanic will not support Karavelic's appointment</b>	<b>RTRS</b> - <b>Mladen Ivanic</b> , the outgoing BiH Foreign Minister, will not sign the proposal on the appointment of <b>Vehid Karavelic</b> to the position of BiH Ambassador in Pakistan.
<b>FBiH HoP in session today</b>	<b>BH Radio</b> By Ljiljana Radl, <b>RHB</b> - The FBiH House of Peoples holds session in Sarajevo today. As expected, the discussion on the draft Law on purchase, allocation and return of apartments was taken off the agenda. Delegates also discuss the draft Law on returnees to FBiH, noting that refugee status not to be limited to 6 months. Instead, returnees should be able to continue receiving assistance after that period.

<b>RS NA holds regular session today</b>	<b>BH Radio</b> By Radmila Grubisa -The RS National Assembly has continued with the 23 regular session in Banja Luka today discussing the draft law on treasury, public attorney's office and court experts in RS. Delegates will also consider the draft law on employment and RS Pension and Disability Fund, which is expected to cause heated discussion. Later in the day, RSNA will also hold 24 <sup>th</sup> session, and SNSD already announced it would demand discussion on situation in Trebinje and Vlasenica municipalities to be included in the agenda.

## Crime: investigations/ indictments

<b>Bileca municipality demands police further action following the rape case</b>	<p><b>BHT 1</b> - Following the extraordinary session, Bileca Municipality Assembly demanded from the police, prosecutors and a court to undertake all necessary steps in order to punish rapists of 23 years old girl from Bileca. Great number of Bileca citizens protested due to the fact that three out of four persons arrested under suspicion of raping the girl were released after two days in prison. Citizens also demanded for perpetrators to be arrested, their families moved out from Bileca, police commander to explain the reasons why release was so quick, etc. Police claims that everything was done in accordance with the law, and that there was no reason for the persons to be held detained any longer. The Deputy of the RS Police Director, <b>Nijaz Smajlovic</b>, said that the police was not responsible. If citizens' requests do not be fulfilled, they are going to request for police leadership to be dismissed. <b>BiH Prosecutor indicts Hasan Cengic for office abuse</b>	<p><b>Vecernji List</b>, front pg splash 'Indictment against Hasan Cengic' and pg 2 'Cengic organized productions of arms in BiH', <u>not signed</u> - The BiH Prosecution raised an indictments against <b>Hasan Cengic</b> (SDA), an MP in the BiH Parliament, on Monday. VL learns that the indictment covers the period when Cengic was Deputy Defence Minister of FBiH, when <b>Ante Jelavic</b> was the Minister. In that context, VL learns from "confidential sources" that Cengic is charged with abuse of office/authority, namely that he gave a permission to certain company to produce arms for the needs he would decide about. By doing so, Cengic overstepped the authority by failing to inform the Minister, and his decision was never sanctioned by the BiH Presidency and SFOR.</p> <p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> cover splash 'Indictment against Hasan Cengic', pg 2 'Indictment against Hasan Cengic raised' by <u>S.N. - A.M.</u> - The indictment against Cengic was signed by Prosecutor <b>Jonathan Schmidt</b>. Cengic comments for DA that he did not know that the indictment was raised against him: <i>"I don't think that crime occurred in [that case]. That company had nothing to do with me, and the permission mentioned has to do with the BIO foundation under my chair at the time. Permission was given in a capacity of 'permission in advance' to enable registration of occupation... <p><b>Caucus of Center supports Bukejlovic</b></p>	<p><b>RHB, BHT1, RTRS, Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 5 'Club of Center promised to support Bukejlovic' by <u>J.S.</u>, <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 4 'Support of Caucus of Center' by <u>O. Vukovic</u>, <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 4 'Club of Centre demands participation in authority from Bukejlovic' by <u>V. Popovic</u>; <b>EuroBlic</b> RSpG 1 'Bukejlovic heard views of Club of Centre' – Representatives of four parties in the RSNA making up the Caucus of the Centre – DNS, DS, Pensioner's Party and 'Spas – are prepared to conditionally support the appointment of the new RS Government led by <b>Pero Bukejlovic</b>. During talks with Bukejlovic representatives of the caucus said that they would make a decision in the next several days. Representatives of the caucus said that they would support Bukejlovic's government if it gets at least the necessary 42 votes, but without SDA in the new Government, and if the new Government will work on the economic and social recovery and the improvement of the position of pensioners.</p>
<p><b>SDP: We'll not support Government with SDS in it</b></p>	<p><b>RHB, BHT1, FTV, Oslobodjenje</b> pg 3 'We will not support the Government with SDS in it', <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 4 'SDP refused to talk with Bukejlovic' by <u>V.P.</u> – SDP leader <b>Zlatko Lagumdžija</b> sent a letter to RS Prime Minister-designate <b>Pero Bukejlovic</b> on Monday informing him that SDP would not take part in consultations on the establishment of the future RS Government scheduled for January 27. SDP did not support nor will support neither the existing nor the new Government consisted of SDS and their coalition partners from the BiH Council of Ministers, SDP stated.</p>
<p><b>DA int w/ Bukejlovic: 'There is no dilemma whether we should cooperate with ICTY or not'</b></p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 5 'It is our obligation to lift off the mortgage of non-cooperation with the Hague' mentioned on cover 'There is no dilemma on whether we should cooperate with the Hague or not' by <u>Jasmina Stojanovic</u> – RS PM designate <b>Pero Bukejlovic</b> is of the view the Dayton Agreement should be respected and additionally developed with consent of all three peoples. He has stated he would like to have less and less imposing by the international community. With regard to the cooperation with ICTY, Bukejlovic says there is no dilemma on whether there should or should not be cooperation with the Hague and he has expressed his surprised over the fact institutions recently established at BiH level do not participate more actively in cooperation with the Hague. He said the cooperation with the Hague should foresee a reciprocity – such activities should simultaneously be carried out in the Federation of BiH as well. Asked if he had the support of Assembly majority, Bukejlovic replied that the issue of CoM should be resolved urgently in order to be in a position to do this. Inset 'Ashdown's conduct was correct' – With regard to the crisis in RS and BiH, Bukejlovic commented that HR <b>Ashdown's</b> conduct was correct since he gave an opportunity to the authority to test their maturity in resolving the problem.</p>
<p><b>Blic int with Stojicic: 'New RS Government by 15 February'</b></p>	<p><b>EuroBlic</b> cover 'Government must have full support' and RSpG 4 'Government by 15 February' by <u>Marija Jandric</u> – The lead of a page-long interview to the paper of <b>Dusan Stojicic</b>, RS NA Speaker, is the establishment of the RS Government, on which he expresses his view that new RS Government should have been established by middle February (and within the stipulated deadline of 40 days which started on 8<sup>th</sup> January). He also says: <i>"It is clear that the final BiH interest to accept European standards involves the ultimate goal, which is more or less hidden. And that is that total and final abolishment of RS. I am convinced we have enough strength to oppose to that, because we do not demand anything we do not have, but instead we demand preservation of what we have been guaranteed by the Dayton and Constitution."</i> He is also of the view that April would not see any new political sanctions against RS and that the times when sanctions were used as a means to accomplish the final gal are behind us, since they brought no good. He refuses to speak about change of Dayton Agreement, stressing that over the past years, RS has done a lot on implementation and superstructuring of Dayton Agreement.</p>

Cardzic</u> – Upon the statement of SDS delegate <b>Momcilo Novakovic</b>, who has said no SDS representative would attend CoM session scheduled for February 1, SDS delegates have stated no person has invited them not to attend the session. BiH Justice Minister <b>Slobodan Kovac</b> has stated: <i>'Novakovic can say SDS Ministers will not attend the session, it is his right, but I am not a member of SDS'</i>. It is not as yet confirmed whether Deputy Minister for Safety <b>Dragan Mektic</b>, Defense Minister <b>Nikola Radovanovic</b> and PDP members would attend the session.</p>

Cubro</u> – NN reports it has learnt from unofficial sources that <b>Paddy Ashdown</b> has harshly warned <b>Mladen Ivanic</b>, over his insistence not to attend the session. NN attempted to get a comment from Ivanic, but it failed since <b>Ivanic</b> was not responding to phone calls.</p>
<p><b>US Ambassador: 'New elections is necessary if new RS Government is not elected'</b></p>	<p><b>Nezavisne Novine</b> cover and pg 2 'New elections is necessary if new RS Govt is not elected' by <u>M. Cubro</u> – In FTV programme "60 minuta" Monday evening, <b>Douglas McElchany</b>, US Ambassador to BiH, stated that the RS Government had to be created according to the wishes of people, who elected them, adding: <i>"If this were not the case, new elections would take place, at which people would make new deliberation. What I would like to see is that BiH CoM functions, that Ministers return to their posts, take a seat and start working. Paddy Ashdown said it is their duty to come to the Government session. If they failed, we would see what we would do."</i></p>

<p><b>WWII veteran refuses to attend anti-fascism ceremony with Paravac</b></p>	<p><b>Oslobodjenje</b> cover pg splash 'Raif Dizdarevic does not want to go to Moscow with Paravac' and pgs 4-5 'Raif Dizdarevic does not want to go to Moscow with sympathizer of Chetniks' by <u>Azhar Kalamujic</u> – the article carries an announcement that reads BiH Presidency Chairman <b>Borislav Paravac</b> would lead the state delegation that would attend 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of victory over fascism, which will be marked in Moscow. One of SUBNOR members, <b>Raif Dizdarevic</b>, has stated he would not travel to Moscow under the leadership of Borislav Paravac because: <i>'I am an anti-fascist while he is a neo-Chetnik'</i>. Inset 'Paravac will lead BiH delegation' – reads BiH Presidency Chairman <b>Borislav Paravac</b> will lead BiH delegation at the ceremonial marking of the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of liberation of the Auschwitz-Birkenay concentration camp on January 27 at the Auschwitz-Birkenay Museum.</p> <p><b>FTV, BHT1, Dnevni List</b> pg 2 'Paravac at anniversary of Auschwitz liberation' by <u>NINA</u> – also reports on Paravac trip to Auschwitz.</p> <p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 8 'Masovic: if I were in his shoes, I would have felt punished' by <u>L. Sinanovic</u> – reports on the same matter and carries statements of SDU President <b>Miro Lazovic</b>, SUBNOR President <b>Jure Galic</b> and Chairman of FBiH Commission for Missing Persons <b>Amor Masovic</b>, all saying <b>Paravac</b> is inappropriate person to lead this delegation, due to his family "background".</p>
<p><b>BHT 1 on abolishment of visas for BiH citizens</b></p>	<p><b>BHT 1</b> – BiH Council of Ministers Chair <b>Adnan Terzic</b> should meet European Commission representative in March 2005 to discuss, among other issues, visas regime for BiH citizens. Greece delegation to the European Commission proposed the regime regarding BiH to be less rigid, while EC says that BiH had several more tasks to accomplish for visas to be abolished. EC Spokesperson <b>Emma Udwin</b> said: <i>"Once, BiH meets all [Feasibility Study] 16 conditions... it will take several months for Brussels to react."</i> Terzic expects BiH citizens to under free visa regime by fall 2005. But analysts claim that chances for this to happen are extremely low.</p> <p><b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 5 'No visa free regime without the rule of law' – EC Spokesperson <b>Frane Maroevic</b> said EU will not consider the possibility of cancellation of the visa regime for BiH until BiH authorities prove the state is committed to fighting all forms of crime and that it has full control of its borders.</p>

Vukadin</u> – Reports that, pursuant to decision of the Presidency of HDZ BiH, the person in charge of Tomislavgrad branch of HDZ BiH, <b>Dr. Ivan Bagaric</b> , dissolved all 11 party branches in municipality of Tomislavgrad. SD notes that the decision is not a surprise given the poor election results in last local elections and inter-party conflicts that had been shaking the HDZ in the town.
<b>NN says HR met Matijasevic to discuss police reform</b>	<b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 5 'Talks on police reform' by <u>A. Sisic</u> – NN has learnt from the sources close to the RS MOI that <b>Darko Matijasevic</b> , the outgoing RS Mol, at OHR in Sarajevo Monday, met with <b>Paddy Ashdown</b> , HR to BiH, and discussed the options of the future police organisation. The same source notes that the meeting is just one meeting is a series of such to follow on the same subject, as previously announced by HR <b>Ashdown</b> .
<b>Dizdarevic says human rights are violated in BiH</b>	<b>FTV, RHB, BHT 1</b> – President of Helsinki Committee in BiH <b>Srdjan Dizdarevic</b> has stated Mostar paid a high price for bad moves of the international community. He also stated: <i>"Everything that is of minority in BiH is exposed to authorities' strikes, which don't pay attention to minorities' position"</i> . <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 7 'Everything that is of minority is at strike of authorities' by <u>Fena</u> , <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 13 'Dizdarevic spoke about human rights in BiH' by <u>N. H.</u> – report on Dizdarevic's statements.
<b>Oslobodjenje op-ed on political parties</b>	<b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 9 'Getting out from trenches' by <u>Zija Dizdarevic</u> – The author writes about political developments in the country and claims the current crisis is a product of the crisis of the Constitutional model, but also an evidence on powerlessness to establish an efficient democratic alternative. According to Dizdarevic, a potential does exist primarily in social-democratic option, however neither SDP nor SNSD accept SDU. He explains his views of the mentioned political parties and claims SDP and SNSD have formed a political alliance, which is contradictory due to differences in their characteristics. He also referred to SDS, SDA and HDZ individually and commented on their relations by saying that this is an exploited formula of ruling in BiH and an obvious obstacle to its social – economic progress. The author concludes by saying that the crucial question is whether one wants to have the state of BiH or not. <i>'with regard to this, it is necessary that the international authorities definitely break the illusion on the possibility of separation of RS from BiH'</i> , the author concludes.

<b>January pensions in FBiH increased for 4.54%</b>	<b>FTV, Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 2 'January pensions increased for 4.54%', mentioned on cover 'Pensions officially increased too' by <u>L.S.</u> , <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 3 'January pensions increased for 4.54%', mentioned on cover, <b>Dnevni List</b> pg 6, mentioned on cover, 'New increase of pensions after April was announced' by <u>V. Soldo</u> , <b>Vecernji List</b> pg 2 'Smallest pension amounts to 161 KM' by <u>ra</u> , <b>Slobodna Dalmacija</b> last pg 'Pensions in FBiH to be increased by 4% as of February 1' by <u>Z. Zekic</u> – The Governing Board of the FBiH Pensions – Disability Fund has approved the increase of the pensions in FBiH for 4,54%. After this increase, minimal pension in FBiH rose from 154 to 161 KM, average pensions to 218 KM and the highest is 728 KM. Payment of January pensions will start on February 1. <b>BHT 1</b> – According to the plan, by the end of the year, pensions should be increased by 6 %. FBiH Minister of Labour and Social Policy <b>Radovan Vignjevic</b> said that the Government also plans to ensure funds to pay out the overdue pensions. Pensions in RS will not be increased, for the time being.

<b>Investment summit commences in Sarajevo</b>	<p><b>RHB, BHT1, RTRS, Dnevni List</b> pg 3, mentioned on front, 'Increased influx of foreign investments to BiH' by <u>D. Polovina-Mandic</u>, <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 15 'Terzic: to strengthen cooperation in the South-east Europe' by <u>Fena</u>– The second Business-Investment Summit for BiH, organized by Foreign Investment Promotion Agency (FIPA) and Argonauts Consultants Limited from Cyprus started in Sarajevo on Monday. 185 companies from 10 countries of the Southeast Europe attend the Summit. Opening the Summit Chairman of the BiH CoM <b>Adnan Terzic</b> stated: <i>'Our country is ready to respect standards of developed, democratic countries guaranteeing security to foreign capital.'</i> FIPA Director <b>Mirza Hajric</b> stated that a record number of foreign investments was marked during the last 13 months.</p> <p>FTV – "In the upcoming period, we expect to maintain inflation at the current rate of 1% annually, economic growth of 6–7% per annum and to reach gradual stabilization of the payment balance. We will introduce 17% single rated VAT this year, which will additionally enhance the fiscal discipline and revenue collection and create preconditions for funding the necessary social programmes", said Terzic.</p>

Petrovic</u> – During its session held on Monday the FBiH Government passed the decision according to which 67 % of the state capital in company 'Energoinvest' will be privatised through a public tender.</p> <p><b>FTV, Vecernji List</b> pg 2 'To make possible launching of Air Bosna' by <u>E. Oslobodjenje</u> pg 3 'Recovery of Air Bosna' says that the Government also passed few decisions with regard to the concept of recovery of the public company 'Air Bosna'.</p> <p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 9 'Foreign companies participate in privatisation under the same conditions as the local' by <u>M.
