Serbia has intensive contacts with EU member countries in its neighborhood, which is good, of course, because regional cooperation and good neighborly relations are an essential part of the process of Serbia's movement towards the EU, which stands at the position that a stable and prosperous Serbia, fully integrated in the European family, is of great importance for the stability of the whole region.
