## Banja Luka

A bomb exploded in a warehouse with medicines and medical equipment last night. One person was injured. The police are still searching for the attacker. Reported by Igor Pozgaj.

## Bijeljina

The RS Army General Staff moved from Bijeljina to Banja Luka. The Third Corps of the RS Army will stay in Bijeljina, Aleksandra Zdravkovic confirmed.

## Sarajevo

The Second Assembly session of the New Croatian Initiative in B&H (NHI) took place in Sarajevo. Kresimir Zubak was re-appointed as the Chairman of the party. They offered HSS and HNZ to form a coalition with them. They demanded that the Croatian Government provide funds for the return of 80 000 Croats in B&H. Reported by Damir Kaletovic.

## World

Eight people died in a crowd at the concert of Pearl Jam near Copenhagen.

9 Russian soldiers died and 11 were injured when a Russian convoy ran into a land mine in Chechnia.

Rebels in Sierra Leone killed two [UN](#) soldiers and wounded four of them.

The Revolutionary Court in Iran sentenced 10 Iranian Jews and two Muslims to several years in prison. They were accused of being Israeli spies.

Fear in Northern Ireland is growing because of the forthcoming traditional Orange march.

France took over the [EU](#) lead from Portugal.

The famous American actor, Walter Matthau died in Los Angeles. The piece on current world events was produced by Mladen Maric.

## **Velika Kladusa**

Amarildo Gutic reported on the current situation in the company "Agrokomerc" in Velika Kladusa. The equipment was sold off, and it is still unknown where 140 vehicles which survived the war are. Hundreds of families in this area are in a very difficult situation, because people lost their jobs.

## **Pozarnica**

About 250 pre-war inhabitants of Pozarnica, near Tuzla visited their homes for the first time. They will start preparing their houses for reconstruction. Muhamed Berbic produced the report.

## **Banja Luka**

A public discussion was organised today in Banja Luka. The theme was: "The role of refugee organisations and civil groups

in refugee return “. Participants concluded that property restitution and the return process were very slow. The report was produced by Nedeljka Breberina.

## **Tesanj**

Citizens are not satisfied with changes that new municipal authorities made after the elections. According to the current structure of authorities, future decisions will be made only after sharp discussions. Rifa Vilasevic produced the report.

## **Travnik**

Foreign ambassadors in B&H visited Travnik today. The Federation Prime Minister, Edhem Bicakcic was their host. Bihac is their next destination. Reported by Slobodan Maksimovic.
