Grabovica

Hague Tribunal investigators came to B&H today. They will investigate atrocities committed against Bosnian Croats in Grabovica. Grabavica is located between Mostar and Jablanica. Paul Risley, Chief Prosecutor spokesman confirmed for OBN. Vedran Persic produced the report.

Mostar

Vice President of Croatian Government, Goran Granic, visited Mostar without official announcement.

Mr Granic met City Authorities and talked about co-operation between Mostar and Zagreb. They dicussed implementation of agreements achieved during the recent visit of Croatian Prime Minister, Ivica Racan.

Sarajevo

Announced resignation of Alija Izetbegovic, B&H Presidency Chairman, is still under question. There is no formal

confirmation of this decision. Slobodan Maksimovic produced the report.

Sarajevo

Establishment of Ministry of Work and Employment was initiated during the meeting of B&H Prime Minister and B&H Trade Union representatives. This Ministry will suggest creation of State Labour Law immediately. Amarildo Gutic produced the report.

World

At least 15 people are killed in a car explosion in the capital of Indian — administered Kashmir.

Belgrade will not ask <u>OSCE</u> representatives to monitor elections, said Vice President of Yugoslav Government.

Officials are finally given access to two Britains and two Canadians accused of spying in Yugoslavia.

US President, Bill Clinton, offered \$ 30 millions to Croatia for continuation of reforms in this country.

Supporters of Basque separatist group ETA protested in support of four members killed by their own bomb on Monday.

OHR is concerned because of obstructions made by Miro Jovic, Deputy of Federal Ministar of Education and Nenad Suljic, Ministar of Education in RS. Their activities are politically motivated and they do not contribute to school reforms. OHR requests from Federal and RS Government to stop discrimination in schools. Dragan Stanimirovic reported.

Sarajevo

<u>UN</u> Mission will donate DM $500\ 000-1$ million to Factulties in Sarajevo. This money should be used for enterances (for wheelchair), elevators and other facilities for invalid persons. Sevko Bajic produced the report.

Sarajevo

Program "Peacetrailes" started last year. People from 18-26 participated in this project.
