<p>BiH Court seeks IC help in processing war crimes cases</p>	<p><b>BH Radio 1</b> <u>Mirsad Bajktarevic</u>, <b>RS Radio</b> – BiH Court needs the assistance from the International Community to solve the key problem in processing war crimes cases and arresting persons indicted who hide in neighboring countries, stated the President of the Court <b>Meddzida Kreso</b> at the conference “In Search after Justice”. She stressed that the main problem is that the majority of suspects have double citizenship which disables the extradition. The conference organized by the Balkans Investigative Network gathered the judicial experts and NGOs. The BiH Court officials also warned that out of 21 prison cells they have only one is empty, whereas one of the priorities is to build a detention center with capacity of 300 places. BH Radio reports that the ICTY Chief Prosecutor, <b>Carla Del Ponte</b>, most probably will not attend the conference as her plane was prevented from landing in Sarajevo due to fog, but instead had to land in Dubrovnik .</p>
<p>BiH authorities without information on Australian terrorism suspect</p>	<p><b>BH Radio 1, RS Radio</b> – BiH Foreign Affairs Ministry and BiH Embassy in Austria still have no information whether <b>Mirsad Mulahalilovic</b>, arrested in Australia under suspicion of terrorism, is a BiH citizen. Ministry’s spokesperson, <b>Nebojsa Regoje</b> stated that official Australian authorities have not approached BiH on this issue.</p>

<p>Guardian reveals US plan for BiH constitution</p>	<p><b>BH Radio 1, RS Radio</b> – UK daily Guardian published the article which reads that the Americans have written a new constitution transforming BiH into a centrally governed parliamentary democracy for the first time, adding US, backed by Europe, strongly pushes to have the blueprint agreed by BiH political leaders within the next fortnight. The blueprint has been developed during seven months of secret negotiations between US experts and officials and BiH politicians, and it apparently enjoys the full backing of the US state department. The crunch session of negotiations comes this weekend, when leaders of the main eight governing and opposition parties in BiH will gather in Brussels to discuss the concept which stipulates a national parliament with full legislative powers, central government and cabinet enjoying full executive power, and a titular head of state.</p>

<p>EC's Humphreys handed to BiH CoM Chair Terzic report on BiH's progress on its road to the EU</p>	<p><b>RHB, Pink, BHT, Hayat, FTV, RTRS, Oslobođenje</b> 'Talks to start on November 21?', <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 2, mentioned on cover 'Humphreys: BiH is now one of the countries that will join EU', <b>Dnevni List</b> pg 2 'Humphreys submitted to Terzic report on progress' by D.P.M., <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 5, announced on cover 'Organized crime is a threat to stability' by M. Cubro [EC report on progress of BiH towards EU], <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 5 'The Balkans countries are facing a long and difficult road to Europe' by Srna [EC report on western Balkans], <b>EuroBlic</b> pg RS2 'Economy is weak spot of BiH' by D. S. – The head of the European Commission Delegation to BiH, <b>Michael Humphries</b>, presented on Wednesday to the chairman of the BiH Council of Ministers, <b>Adnan Terzic</b>, an annual report on BiH's progress on its road to the EU and a document titled 'European Partnership for 2006.' <i>"BiH is now one of the countries that will join the EU,"</i> Humphries told reporters after a ceremony in Sarajevo. He added that there were indications that EU talks with BiH on SAA might start on November 21. On the basis of the report of the European Commission, the Council of Ministers should make a list of tasks that must be done in the process of beginning talks on stabilisation and accession with the EU. Humphries said that progress was made in BiH last year in building and strengthening institutions, developing democracy, protecting of human rights, the rule of law, cooperation with the ICTY, police reform and reform of public RTV service. <i>"In the future, much more attention must be paid to economic development, increasing employment, reducing the foreign debt and deficit, more intensive and efficient privatisation and recovery of state companies, reinforcement of the judiciary, especially in the area of liquidation proceedings and commercial law,"</i> said Humphries. Terzic said that the members of the BiH Council of Ministers are aware that BiH is faced with a lot of work on its European road. <i>"The report of the European Commission will be the basis for finding ways for BiH to begin quick and efficient talks on stabilisation and accession with the EU, which will be the primary task of the Council of Ministers and the Entity governments,"</i> said Terzic. The European Commission is preparing annual reports on progress for each country, which has ambitions to become an EU member, and Humphries said that similar documents will be today presented to the governments in Belgrade and Zagreb.</p>

<p>DA int with Ashdown: I admit I was brutally harsh in some cases; DA: UK wants opening of SAA talks on 21 Nov, Brussels skeptical</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> cover splash, pg 5 'I admit I was brutally harsh' by <u>Sead Numanovic</u> – In an interview to DA after the meeting with the ICTY Chief Prosecutor <b>Carla Del Ponte</b>, the HR <b>Paddy Ashdown</b> says that the pressure to arrest <b>Radovan Karadzic</b> and <b>Ratko Mladic</b> must be increased to ensure their arrests to happen as soon as possible, by Dayton anniversary or his departure from BiH. Announcing Del Ponte will meet BiH officials in Sarajevo today, Ashdown says that the cooperation with the ICTY has been improved. On speculations that the SAA could start as early as 21 November, HR commented this would be very tight and difficult to achieve, but added no date is soon enough for him. Inset 'Negotiations with BiH could start as early as 21 November?' – daily learns that the United Kingdom, which also presides over EU this year, is very interested to launch the talks on the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the DPA, i.e. 21 November. However, according to DA, Brussels is very skeptical about this possibility due to slowness in the procedure to appointing BiH chief negotiator and a team, but also of the EC apparatus. Washington apparently supports London's intentions directed at announcing SAA talks with BiH on date of DPA anniversary, which would make BiH the country which started SAA talks with EU within the shortest time span. In an interview, HR says: <i>"Some people criticize me for being brutally harsh in the past three years when implementing some processes. I admit – I was! But, I've done that for one reason only: I am passionately fighting to ensure BiH is on its European path... we did not waste time in past three years and this should not happen in a future either."</i> Talking about his priorities in the last three months of the mandate [inset 'Priorities in last three months'], HR says that while a lot has been done, there were several things not achieved: in addition to the uncompleted cooperation with the ICTY, but a number of smaller things such as law on obligations, state fiscal council and implement of Mostar plan should be finished. <i>"I soon plan to travel to US to submit my last report to the [UN] Security Council as the HR,"</i> says Ashdown adding he will also meet with <b>George Bush</b>'s Administration on DPA. <i>"Main message at these activities is that BiH moves from one to some other phase... IC in that situation becomes more of a friend, advisor, an advocate, and less someone imposing solutions,"</i> adds Ashdown.</p>

<p>High Representative Meets ICTY Chief Prosecutor Carla Del Ponte</p>	<p><b>Pink, Hayat, RTRS, Oslobođenje</b> pg 3 'Ashdown to again give his testimony in trial of Slobodan Milosevic?', <b>Dnevni List</b> pg 6, mentioned on cover 'Del Ponte comes to get Karadzic again' by <b>I. Following the meeting, the High Representative, pointing to the increased cooperation with the Tribunal seen in the past 11 months, noted that the International Community is now watching closely to see that this process continues. <i>"That means that all remaining individuals indicted for war crimes, including Radovan Karadzic and Ratko Mladic, are transferred to the ICTY without delay,"</i> he said. <i>"The journey will not be complete until every indicted individual is in The Hague,"</i> said Ashdown. Ashdown expressed his readiness to again appear as witness in trial of <b>Slobodan Milosevic</b> if necessary and clarify details of his mission to Kosovo in 1998.</p>
<p>SNSD leader Dodik received OSCE Head Davidson: Abolishment of HR's powers would complicate political life in BiH</p>	<p><b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 6 'Authorities are incompetent' by <b>V.P.</b> – <b>Milorad Dodik</b>, SNSD President, stated that departure of HR to BiH, <b>Paddy Ashdown</b>, and abolishment of Bonn powers to his successor would complicate political life in BiH, since politicians in BiH are used to having an authorities incarnated in HR. after the meeting with <b>Douglas Davidson</b>, Head of OSCE Mission to BiH, Dodik stated that BiH authorities are incapable of reaching decisions by themselves and to bear responsibility for them.</p>

The poll was conducted on the sample of 1770 persons. <b>Oslobođenje</b> pg 2 also covered the issue.</p>

Nevertheless, Paravac' opposition to sign Document was welcomed by Marovic, who avoided unpleasant situation to refuse to sign the Document. Daily's source claims that during some unofficial contacts, Marovic regarded the Document inappropriate and criticized intention of NGO's to interfere into issues of plain political background. <p>EU Force commander says Bosnia 's Dayton settlement brake on development</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 9 'Elections to be indicator if BiH still needs EUFOR', <b>ONASA</b> – EUFOR Commander <b>David Leakey</b> said Wednesday evening that the Dayton constitution is dissatisfactory because too may people uses it as a mean for disabling development of B-H as a state. <i>"During making of Dayton, everyone thought only to end the war and near future of the country. I'm encouraged by the fact that 10 years since Dayton, more and more people B-H, from politicians to religious leaders, are willing to reconsider the Dayton constitution. Therefore, the good thing is that people want to make a constitution by themselves which will replace the one whose drafting engaged international community officials,"</i> said Leakey, who was one of negotiators in Dayton. He said that it is necessary to organize a political debate on amending the Dayton constitution and that the role of EUFOR is to ensure conditions for a healthy debate in which no one will fear of <i>"political violence."</i> <i>"We are here to create a safe surrounding together with police, because a debate on amending the constitution might have a destabilizing impact on some people, who have no trust in police that it can guarantee safety during political unsafety,"</i> said Leakey during a gathering with journalists in Sarajevo, organized following his soon departure from the function.</p> <p>He considers there is small risk that B-H will again be unstable country, but that there are potential reasons such as division caused by nationalistic politic. Leakey is leaving the function on 6 December, when he will be replaced by Italian general <b>Gian Marco Chiarini</b>.</p>



<p>US' Burns on changes of DPA</p>	<p><b>Hayat</b> by <u>Voice of America</u> – US Under Secretary for Political Affairs <b>Nicholas Burns</b> informed US Congress that on November 21<sup>st</sup>, US State Secretary <b>Condoleezza Rice</b> and BiH officials are going to mark the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Dayton Peace Agreement, adding that DPA was never meant to last forever. According to Burns, peoples of BiH have already recognised the need for changes of DPA in order to join EU and NATO. Burns said that BiH political leaders are going to be asked to eliminate all differences and agree on changes, which will include one state President, stronger position of Prime Minister and reformed Parliament. Burns stated that the USA are got going to accept any changes of borderlines in the region. Burns stated that status of Kosovo and situation in BiH must be resolved in 2006. According to him, next year will be crucial for future of Kosovo.</p>
<p>Danas: New constitutional changes are 'cosmetic changes'</p>	<p><b>Danas</b>, pgs 14-17, mentioned on front 'Americans propose new constitution of Bosnia and Herzegovina', by <u>Josip Blazevic</u> – The article notes that the US Secretary of State, <b>Condoleezza Rice</b>, will present the final proposal of constitutional changes for BiH at the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the DPA, after the Brussels meeting of leading political parties. According to Danas, the constitutional changes will focus on institutional changes, such as strengthening of the state government, however there will be no changes to the territorial organization of BiH. 'Danas' concludes it is about 'cosmetic' changes, which will not solve the issue that has the biggest specific weight in BiH – the national issue that is, which will in fact 'cement' the territorial exclusivity of one people (Serbs in RS) and institutional domination of the other people (Bosniaks in FBiH).</p>

He added that Croatia will support any decision reached by all three constitutional peoples in BIH. Bjelica</u> – Before the session of the HDZ National Council that took place on Wednesday, the HDZ President, <b>Dragan Covic</b>, stated that HDZ had a clear stand on the BiH Constitution and future of BiH according to which 'survival of two entities is impossible'. He stressed: <i>"We have said precisely: do not speculate about the third entity any longer, speak clearly about impossibility that two entities survive and in this way we are more clear and trustworthy."</i> Covic also stressed that HDZ would not agree on cosmetic changes of the BiH Constitution.</p> <p><b>Vecernji List</b> pg 7 'No to 'cosmetic' changes of Constitution' by <u>V. <p>Ljubic, Raguz and Merdzo expelled from HDZ</p>	<p><b>Vecernji List</b>, pg 7, mentioned on front 'Court of honour expelled Ljubic, Raguz and Merdzo', by <u>Zoran Kresic</u> – The High court of honour of HDZ BiH expelled three prominent members of HDZ BiH, namely <b>Bozo Ljubic, Josip Merdzo</b> and <b>Martin Raguz</b>, from the party. The decision is not final as yet, because the troika can still appeal with the HDZ Main Board against the decision. <b>Dnevni List</b>, front pg splash 'Raguz, Ljubic and Merdzo expelled' and pg 3 'Raguz, Ljubic and Merdzo expelled from HDZ', by <u>M. Batarello</u> – carries Raguz as saying that he did not want to take the Court's decision in writing because the Court wanted to hand over the HDZ Presidency's decision on removal from all party offices and request for expulsion from the party. <i>"The problem is that such decision was never taken at a session of the Presidency.
