OHR: establishing of Sarajevo City Council is a matter for competent BiH institutions	FTV, RHB, TV Pink, TV Hayat, Dnevni Avaz pg 4 'Establishing of a town authority is a matter for domestic institutions' by Fena – After it was announced that BiH Election Commission, on its session on Tuesday, is going to revoke decision on electing of councillors in the Sarajevo City Council, the OHR Spokesman, Vedran Persic, stated that constituting of city authorities in Sarajevo is the matter of responsible institutions in BiH. He expressed the hope that this problem is going to be solved within those institutions.
SDP's Pudaric: Election Commission is not revoking Sarajevo City Council because of SDP	RHB – SDP General Secretary Svetozar Pudaric issued a press release after statement of SDA Chairman Sulejman Tihic (HB presenter does not specify the statement). Pudaric stressed that Election Commission is not revoking the election of Sarajevo City Council because of SDP but because of complaints from SDP. Pudaric stated in his announcement that Tihic should stop deceiving people because it doesn't suit his position or his age. Nezavisne Novine pg 3 'SDA and Party for BiH have obstructed changes of Sarajevo Statute' by D. B., Oslobodjenje pg 3, announced on cover 'Stop with imputations' not signed – also carry Pudaric's statement.

Sogolj</u> – Newly elected delegate at Sarajevo City Council <b>Emin Svrakic</b> thinks the announcement of Election Commission on annulling results of the election was an incorrect act. He claims everything has been done in accordance with laws, the only mistake was in the fact SDP has refused to take part in establishing of the Council. He believes the announcement of the Election Commission was a result of a pressure someone had applied on the Commission.</p>

Janja Local Community Board, **Ibrahim  
Huremovic**, claims Serbian police often  
apprehends and interrogates Janja citizens  
who dare to cross the nearby border  
between BiH and SiCG to reach their land.  
He says the stance of the Border Service  
deteriorated after their frequent  
statements on their issues. BiH Minister  
for Refugees **Mirsad Kebo** says the issue of  
borders is a delicate issue and he added  
this is not the only disputable border  
issue. He says BIH and SiCG Inter-state  
Council will hold talks on these problems.  
Huremovic claims he had addressed Minister  
**Mladen Ivanic** who had replied that the  
problem had been resolved since an  
agreement was reached with SiCG. Huremovic  
denies this is true. The article reads the  
only reaction from OHR is a statement of a  
spokesperson given at the end of the last  
year saying that the two states should  
resolve this issue.

<p><b>Youth Informative Agency awarded prizes to BiH authorities for their moves for youth</b></p>	<p><b>FTV, TV Pink, Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 2  ‘Awards for the poorest moves of the authorities’ by D. Mu., <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 3  ‘Toys to delegates for selling Marshal Tito barracks’ <u>not signed</u> – Youth Informative Agency (OIA) has started the action “The best move of the authorities for the youth in 2005”. Although they made an effort to award the best, they couldn’t manage to find any positive example, said FTV reporter. The prizes still had to be awarded. The first prize goes for BiH Parliamentary Assembly and those are small automobiles for every member of BiH Parliament. Youth said they felt a need to award them for everything they did for them. They have got these prizes because they didn’t succeed to pass the law on high education. The second prize goes to BiH Council of Ministers (CoM), due to failure to establish a commission for youth’s issues in BiH. The third prize in individual category, only for the local level, has been awarded to Sarajevo Canton Minister of Environment, <b>Zlatko Petrovic</b>, because of his contribution in selling of former barracks “Marsal Tito” to the USA Embassy. Exactly due to such moves, according to the last polls, 72% of youth in BiH want to leave BiH. FTV conducted a poll among youth and opinions on staying or going away were different.</p>

N.</u> – As, according to an announcement of Serbian Government, Serbian Prime Minister <b>Vojislav Kostunica</b> will hold talks with High Representative <b>Paddy Ashdown</b> in Belgrade on Monday.

**TV Pink** Aida Doric – In an interview for INFOTOP, the Chair of BiH Council of Ministers, **Adnan Terzic** said that BiH was going to reach the phase in which it would be able to start negotiations on Stabilization and Association Agreement. *"I think that the EU is going to accept that the progress is sufficient for this phase and that the European Commission does not ask for **Ratko Mladic** and **Radovan Karadzic** to be arrested in order to start negotiations. I am sure that we can start negotiations on SAA by the end of this year, and my plan is to sign the agreement by the end of our mandate"*, said Terzic. Terzic said that two more great problems had to be solved in order to start the negotiations; namely law on public broadcasting service and winning of permission related with the basic elements regarding police structure reform, for which the High Representative, **Paddy Ashdown** announced that negotiations on consensus, were to be started by the end of April. *"During the Peace Implementation Council session I said that by signing the SAA, BiH will need no OHR in BiH, instead we should have a high European Commission representative"*, said Terzic on being asked on future International Community role to BiH. Terzic stressed that it was no possible to move forward without police reform and that all those who participate in negotiations should realize how high the price was.

<p><b>EUFOR members completed military exercise in Pale</b></p>	<p><b>RHB, TV Pink, BHT 1, FTV, RTRS, Vecernji List</b> pg 3 'EUFOR held a training in front of Karadzic's house' <u>by Eldina Medunjanin</u>, <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 2 'Training of EUFOR near Karadzic's house' <u>by Srna</u>, <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 5 'EUFOR members exercised near Karadzic's house' <u>by Fena</u>, <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 3 'Exercise was coincidentally held near Karadzic's house' <u>not signed</u> – EUFOR members completed a military exercise in Pale Saturday. This regular exercise was carried out without incidents and in the nearby of <b>Radovan Karadzic's</b> house. EUFOR stated that this fact was a coincidence.</p>
<p><b>EUFOR does not want to comment claims on Mladic's hideout in Pancevo</b></p>	<p><b>TV Pink, RTRS</b> – EUFOR Colonel <b>Rolf Kurt</b> did not want to give any comments on articles published in BiH newspapers on <b>Ratko Mladic</b> being hidden in Pancevo. Kurt said for BETA that EUFOR was awake all the time, seeking for war crime indictees, since it presented its mandate. Kurt added that EUFOR was going to act, whenever given a chance to do that.</p>



<p><b>Marcusen: Genocide must not happen again to the world</b></p>	<p><b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 8, announced on cover 'Genocide must not happen again to the World' by <u>DL. Omeragic</u> – carries a statement of <b>Eris Marcusen</b>, the Chairman of the Centre for Holocaust and Research of Genocide, who has presented his opinion on how it was possible that Srebrenica crimes could have happened. He hopes remembering of Srebrenica crimes would raise the awareness on necessity to react in time in future in order to prevent similar things from happening.</p>
<p><b>Goldstone: we knew well in 1995 and 1996 where Karadzic and Mladic were</b></p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 5 'Soldiers were afraid of arresting indictees Karadzic and Mladic' by <u>S. Numanovic</u> – the first prosecutor of ICTY, <b>Richard Goldstone</b>, has assessed ICTY cannot complete its work by 2010. He commented on <b>Karadzic</b> and <b>Mladic</b> by saying it is disappointing that they are still at large even ten years after they had been indicted. He added he has no evidence to substantiate his opinion that political reasons have led to failure to arrest them and he added: <i>'I firmly believe the West had not wanted to do it due to fear of their soldiers in field that such an action would lead to retaliation. In 1995 and 1996 we knew well where Karadzic and Mladic were'</i>.</p>

<p><b>Names of SCG citizens appeared on the lists of persons involved in crimes in Srebrenica</b></p>	<p><b>BHT 1</b> <u>Boris Grubesic</u> – Commission for investigation of the events in Srebrenica in July 1995 determined that there is a certain number of the citizens of Serbia-Montenegro (SCG) on the list of persons responsible for the war crimes in this town. BiH and SCG should soon signed agreement on cooperation between prosecutors' offices, what would make easier persecution of the persons that are not BiH citizens. Member of the Srebrenica Commission, <b>Smail Cekic</b>, confirmed that those were members of the Serbian Ministry of Interior and soldiers of the former Yugoslav army. Trials to those persons cannot be held in BiH, because SCG does not extradite their citizens. Still, there is possibility for their trials to be held in Serbia. <i>"It is our obligation to use all relevant proves for committed war crimes in which SCG citizens participated,"</i> said SCG Council for cooperation with ICTY President, <b>Rasim Ljajic</b>.</p>
<p><b>Hartmann: SiCG police is responsible for apprehending Hague indictees</b></p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> – ICTY Chief prosecutor's spokesperson <b>Florence Hartman</b> said that SiCG police is responsible for apprehending the ICTY indictees. She added that the Hague Tribunal expects a full cooperation with the country since they don't have their own police forces.</p>

<p><b>Bosniak representatives are obstructing the formation of joint commission on war casualties in Sarajevo</b></p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> – Representatives of Bosniaks are obstructing the establishment of joined commission on war casualties of Serbs, Croats, Bosniaks and others in Sarajevo said <b>Ilina Djurkovic</b> from PDP. She said that BiH PM <b>Adnan Terzic</b> has suggested the formation of commission for entire BiH, which is unacceptable. Serbs have rights to know the truth of Sarajevo.</p>

<p><b>SCG legal representative, Stojanovic: BiH's lawsuit against SiCG will crumble</b></p>	<p><b>RTRS, TV Pink, Oslobodjenje</b> pg 4 'BiH lawsuit against SiCG cannot survive' by <u>Onasa</u>, <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> cover pg splash 'New lies and imputations from Belgrade' and pg 2 'Softic: it is immoral to participate in any way in a genocide' by <u>H. Orahovac</u> – ICTY Defence attorney of SiCG <b>Radoslav Stojanovic</b> said that the lawsuit of BiH on genocide against SiCG is on wobbly legs in the terms of process. He said that this is because BiH did not press charges after signing the Dayton Agreement. SiCG will win, but ICTY will not proclaim winner because it erroneous to put all the blame on RS.</p>

Orahovac</u> – BiH legal representative <b>Sakib Softic</b> has denied Stojanovic's statement by saying: <i>'This is not true. BiH Presidency has, on two occasions, stated that the lawsuit remains in force'</i>.</p>

**Dokic says he  
was not

for resignation**

**RTRS** Report by Biljana Mandic – BiH  
Minister of Communications and Transport  
**Branko Dokic** stated on Saturday that he was  
not informed on OHR's request for  
resignation. Dokic is accused of abuse of  
office and power. OHR's spokesperson  
**Vedran Persic** said that OHR expects Dokic  
to resign due to the indictment. *"OHR's  
expects from prosecuted officials to  
resign from their offices. BiH should  
present its credibility"* stated Persic.  
Dokic didn't want to comment on this. He  
explicitly refused to resign from the  
office. High Representative **Paddy Ashdown**  
recently said, while commenting on Dokic's  
case, that he will take actions in the  
same way as in the case of former member  
of BiH Presidency **Dragan Covic**.

<p><b>HJPC Chairman Peric: BiH politicians are frustrated because they have lost influence on judiciary</b></p>	<p><b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pgs 8-9, announced on cover 'BiH politicians are frustrated because they have lost influence on judiciary' by <u>Mirza Cubro</u> – in a two-page long interview to <i>NN</i>, HJPC Chairman <b>Branko Peric</b> has stated politicians in BiH are no longer in possession of a mechanism by which they would be able to apply a pressure on judiciary because an independent judiciary had been established. He said: <i>'Politicians no longer have any influence on judiciary and this makes them feel frustrated'</i>. He also said BiH Court is ready to process war crimes, but he thinks the society in general is not ready to deal with this problem. <i>'In order to face past, one needs both political consent and determination of all relevant social subjects. It is not realistic to expect from the Court to resolve this problem'</i>, Peric said.</p>

**Inter-ethnic  
incident  
occurred  
near Zvornik  
Friday**

**NTV Hayat, FTV, Oslobođenje** pg 3 'Serbs and Bosniaks have caused disorder' by Fena, **Dnevni Avaz** pg 23 'Serbs and Bosniaks got into a fight' by Fena – A spokesman of Bijeljina PSC, **Dragomir Peric**, said that an incident took place Friday in the village of Setici near Zvornik. Peric did not wish to give more details saying an investigation is underway.

**RTRS** – Head of Zvornik **Budimir Acimovic** commented the incident that happened in Zvornik when group of Bosniaks attacked Serbs road workers and said he is disappointed with the incident Acimovic called all people on tolerance and respect.

**Nezavisne Novine** pg 2 'They were beaten up over their national belongings' by Srna – The foreman in "Zvornik putevi", **Lazar Jovic**, said that several Bosniaks have attacked him and three other workers of the firm who were working on the road at the time. He explained he and his colleagues had seen a car that had went off the road, they approached the car and offered help, after which persons who were in the car had replied by saying they '*do not need help from Chetniks*'. They have started beating him and persons who went out of cars that have arrived few moments later have also started beating him.

<p><b>Babic: names of BiH citizens involved in smuggling of explosives in France will be known on Monday</b></p>	<p><b>Dnevni List</b> cover pg splash and pg 2 'Smugglers of explosives will be known tomorrow' by <u>D. Kozina</u> – Spokesperson of BiH Ministry of Foreign Affairs <b>Lepa Babic</b> has stated names of BiH citizens, who were involved in smuggling of explosive devices and who were arrested by French police, will be known on Monday.</p>
<p><b>SIPA will become fully operative within a year</b></p>	<p><b>TV Pink</b> <u>Ljubisa Davidovic</u> – SIPA Director, <b>Sredoje Novic</b> said that SIPA was already operative, especially when it comes to economy crime, but it would take at least a year for SIPA to become fully operative. In last month, SIPA has arrested three persons charged with money laundry. By the beginning of this month, SIPA has become in charge of securing the highest BiH officials and institutions. Establishment of new, reformed police forces should help SIPA, since, according to Novic, only reformed police could ensure greater security to BiH citizens. Novic added that probably no one opposed police reform, which would carry out numerous actions at BiH level, and said that its territorial organization presented the only problem.</p>

<p><b>TI Spokesperson Blagovcanin: 25% of reported corruption cases refers to corruption at Universities</b></p>	<p><b>TV Pink</b> <u>Milka Mrdja</u> – Out of 3.500 reports on corruption, 25 % refers to corruption at Universities in BiH. Spokesperson to Transparency International, <b>Srdjan Blagovcanin</b> said that the fact that worries the most is reaction of bodies in charge, on such reports. Blagovcanin says that TI has sent to Ministries of Education certain reports, including evidences, but they have undertaken no measures. RS Professors and Students Association do not deny the existence of corruption, but they state that the most important thing is to protect University. TI calls on students and professors to report each corruption case they face.</p>

<p><b>Exact number of missing persons in BiH is still unknown</b></p>	<p><b>Nezavisne Novine</b> cover pg splash ‘Nobody knows the number of missing persons in BiH’ and pgs 12-13 ‘The work of the Institute for Missing Persons depends on appointment of future directors’ by <u>Natasa Krsman</u> – The article reads between 17,000 and 22,000 persons, who went missing during the war, have been registered in BiH, yet the correct number is not known. The International Commission for Missing persons expects a central database at the Institute for Missing Persons of BiH would resolve the issue of manipulation with the number of missing persons. However, the database would be established only after the Institute is put in function.</p>



<p><b>Roundtable on high education reform in accordance with Bologna process in Sarajevo</b></p>	<p><b>FTV</b> <u>Predrag Bosnjakovski</u> – Sarajevo Canton Ministry of Science and Education and Sarajevo University have organized two-day roundtable on high education reform in accordance with Bologna process. The special topic was introducing of ECTS system of points at the Sarajevo University, which is one of characteristics of the new system at all European universities. This session should result with a joint position and plans of activities for introducing this part of Bologna process, said the reporter.</p>
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
