"I do not ask from RS to arrest them (Karadzic and Mladic), although I think they could do that, but to start cooperating with the tribunal," he said in an interview with the Czech daily Pravo. Ashdown stressed that the authorities of Bosnian Serbs had arrested not a single war crimes indictee for nine years while NATO had arrested even 20 persons in their areas of responsibility. "A stabile peace is not possible without justice," he warned, adding he personally sees the future of BiH as a 'Balkans' Belgium.' "The Dayton Accords did not aim to build a state but secure peace. The fact is that BiH is not a state, which functions. It will also never be a national centralized state according to the model of Great Britain or France. But, it might be something like Belgium." He also warned the country's spending must gradually reduce because currently 60% of tax income goes to the state administration. "This is the reason why pensions are so small, hospitals old- fashioned, schools poor-equipped. Such country cannot count on loyalty of its citizens." Ashdown assessed that the institution of HB would be replaced by a Ell special

FTV interview with Ashdown on RS government appointment, police reform

FTV - HR Paddy Ashdown said that the main task of new RS Government would be cooperation with ICTY. He said that issue of nomination of the new Government had to be solved by RS officials and that OHR did not want to interfere. HR is satisfied with the report, submitted by Police Reform Commission Chairman Wilfred Martens. HR reminded that state had to be in charge of police. HR is going to decide on the number of police regions after having consulted with the members of the Commission. Ashdown said "How the RS Government is going to be formed has nothing to do with me. I think that what we see, after all these resignations, northing has changed. The job is still the same job as it was before; to cooperate with the Hague." Reporter asked: "Crisis, which, we may say, is fabricated, in BiH, BiH is losing the time. But the fact that BiH Government cannot hold its sessions is much more dangerous." HR said "Lets' be honest. This occurred just before Christmas. If the situation, you call it crisis, but I still do not want to use that term, extends till the end of January or February, then it is going to be crisis. But I am quite optimistic that thee issue is going to be solved, that the small breakage in the reform process is going to be forgotten, and that state institutions are going to work commonly and efficiently. I cannot be sure, but it seems as if the things have been going in that direction. And, with no HR's reactions. It is of extreme importance for BiH, that if having internal problems, to solve them on its own." Reporter asked: "Are entities' Ministries of Interior going to be preserved in future police structure?" HR said "It is not a part of the Police Reform Commission's recommendations to abolish entities' MoI. This is not one of the Commission's conclusions. Whether entities' MoI are going to be abolished, depends on BiH authorities." Reporter asked: "Have you thought about the maps submitted by Wilfred Martens?" HR said "I am not going to state my opinion on the maps, until having them examined more thoroughly, and after having some discussions. I decided to have it done by the end of this month; I want to discuss on them and to hear the opinion of each involved party. I think that you are right when said that the solution, which was not in accordance with the best professional service, should not be accepted."

Tihic said that SDA thinks that the situation in the RS has radicalizes, that the position and opposition have united with the objective of preserving the RS in the shape and form created by war criminals Radovan Karadzic and Ratko Mladic.

RTRS interview with HR Paddy Ashdown -RTRS reporter: "You have mentioned the issue of war criminals, who were hiding in Han Pijesak. Due to the fact that Minister of Defence was asking for evidences on such allegations, have you submitted the evidences to the Ministry?" HR said "What do you expect them to say? If they say yes he did hide there, what would happen? Of course they say that they have no evidences, of course they say that they do not believe that he hid there, but I know he did and minister **Stankovic** has to say that *Mladic* was not in Han Pijesak, but I know that he was there. What I am asking for is what steps and actions have to be

undertaken, I am not asking for an investigation to see whether he was there or not; I saw an evidence to know that he was there." The set of new measures was prepared in approximately 2 months, i.e. since the BiH Association of Employers took over the "Bulldozer" process from OHR, and its implementation will be monitored by the team that prepared the reform proposals. The "Bulldozer" project was launched with the objective of allowing BiH businesspersons to propose changes to legislation which pose an obstacle to the success of their businesses.
