RTRS, RHB, PINK, BHT 1, Hayat, FTV, Oslobodjenje pg 3 'Continue the cooperation with the Hague' by Fena, **Nezavisne Novine** pg 2 'Paddy Ashdown today in Belgrade' by SRNA, **Glas Srpske** pg 2 'Ashdown with Tadic and Kostunica' – As a part of his programme of regular visits to Serbia and Montenegro and Croatia, High Representative **Paddy Ashdown**, today will meet with **Boris Tadic**, President of Serbia, **Vuk Draskovic**, Minister of Foreign Affairs, **Vojislav Kostunica**, Serbian Prime Minister, His Holiness **Patriarch Pavle** and the Serbian Orthodox Church Holy Synod. HR will take note of the recent constructive engagement with the ICTY that has resulted in the transfer of indicted war criminals to The Hague. He will underline that this is a process that must be maintained if BiH is to move towards EU and NATO accession. He will say that this is a process that can only be complete when both **Ratko Mladic** and **Radovan Karadzic** are in The Hague.

Dnevni Avaz cover splash 'Decision to be made at secret meeting in Sarajevo', pg 2 'HDZ chooses Covic's successor at the confidential meeting' by H. Orahovac – DA learns from the member of HDZ leadership that the HDZ representatives in BiH Parliament will decide on replacement for the removed **Dragan Covic** at the confidential meeting to be held in Sarajevo tonight. In addition to the HDZ reps in BiH House of Representatives, the meeting will also be attended by four HDZ reps in BiH House of Peoples, and party's chair **Barisa Colak**. A source says the agenda will also include the discussion on the overall Croat position in BiH. Underlying once more that the HR **Paddy Ashdown**'s decision was illegitimate and unconstitutional, the source says: *"We will try to raise this issue through the institutions of the system, and decision on what to do is up to the will of others in legal authorities... Everybody in BiH must realize that BiH Parliament is the place to bring key decisions for BiH."*

<p>Jovic (MP, HDZ) on Covic removal: BiH Parliament's decision not binding for Ashdown</p>	<p>Vecernji List, pg 3, mentioned on front 'Parliament decisions do not oblige Ashdown', by <u>Miso Relota</u> – Carries a comment by an MP in BiH Parliament, Ivo Miro Jovic (HDZ), regarding the HDZ's request that the BiH Parliament discusses the High Representative's decision to remove Dragan Covic from the BiH Presidency. Jovic notes that even if the BiH Parliament concludes that the removal was illegal and anti-constitutional, such conclusion will not be binding for the HR. <i>"Such conclusion would be a satisfaction to Dr. Covic that the Constitution and European convention on human rights were violated in the case of his removal and such decision would represent a position of the top legislative authority in BiH"</i>, says Jovic.</p>
<p>All BiH Croat parties to try to reach consensus on Constitutional changes</p>	<p>Dnevni Avaz pg 5 'Bosniak and Croat parties have consensus on change of Constitution' by <u>Husein Orahovac</u> – DA brings an interview with Marko Tadic, the chair of HSS party, who initiated the meeting to be held in Sarajevo on Tuesday where all Croat parties in BiH will meet to reach a consensus on the constitutional changes. Tadic is determined that this can be done, adding that Bosniak and some civic parties in RS could also reach a consensus on this issue. Talking about possible difference in opinions between the Croat parties, Tadic explains that all agree the BiH and local governance must be strengthened, however the issue is what would be in middle between the state and the municipality – region, canton or something else.</p>

Lasic says that the HDZ and he personally are against the demise of cantons in this manner because in that case the Croat people would lose the rights it has as a constituent people.</p>

The reason is insufficient cooperation with the ICTY. Inset 'What will Paddy do?' says that if DA's sources are right, the question is what will Paddy Ashdown do. DA reminds he already announced earlier that he would impose new set of sanctions in RS, not only against politicians but also against some of the institutions.</p>

The Ministry's spokeswoman, Lepa Babic, says that Ivanic still has not sent a letter and that he is currently consulting the Serb member of the Presidency, Borislav Paravac. <p>Ashdown to announce pardons soon?</p>	<p>Dnevni Avaz pg 2 ‘Soon, the name of those pardoned’ by <u>S.N.</u> – The High Representative, Paddy Ashdown, may announce the names of the pardoned politicians in following 15 days. In accordance with his announcement made at the beginning of March that OHR would review some of the removal decisions, the Commission has been reviewing all removal decisions made from 1998 to 2003 and will submit the list. HR will view the list and announce the results. DA says that the pardon can be expected by only a ‘handful’ of people, mainly those who were accused of breaching the property laws.</p>
<p>Ivanic: Some political circles trying to undermine PDP</p>	<p>RTRS, Dnevni Avaz pg 9 ‘It is pure speculation that Terzic wants to remove me from authorities’ by Srna – PDP leader, Mladen Ivanic believes that some circles around some RS political parties were trying to undermine PDP by arresting four of its members on embezzlement charges. <i>“I do not mean that party’s official bodies are behind that, meaning not even SDS, but the people hiding behind the parties and with making such spectacular cases they want to call public attention to themselves”</i>, Ivanic told Belgrade daily Vecernje novosti. He added that reports that Chair of CoM, Adnan Terzic, wants to remove him to overtake control in Brod oil refinery were just pure speculations.</p>

**RFE on role

of HR in BiH**

Nezavisne Novine pg 6 'BiH authorities still cannot function without High Representative' by Radio Free Europe – The Radio Free Europe carried a program reporting that **Borislav Paravac** and **Sulejman Tihic**, members to BiH Presidency, share the view that BiH authorities cannot function without High Representative ten years after the Dayton Agreement had been signed. Paravac said in a statement to RFE that the function of HR should gradually fade away instead of getting stronger. **Zlatko Lagumdžija**, SDP of BiH President, is of the view that it is necessary to bring the role of HR into partnership relation with the local authorities, adding: *"What is evident is that departure of HR **Paddy Ashdown** should not equate with departure of the institution of HR. the fact is that Ashdown would be remembered as a person, who has destroyed the partnership between local political forces and international community, and who is also to be partially blamed for having given the licence to false reformists ."* **Hans Joachim Gizmann**, Director of the Hamburg Institute for peace research and security policy, is of the view that HR has over pronounced authoritative role. He is also of the view that HR is still necessary in BiH, adding that HR must act with extreme caution.

<p>Mehmedovic (SDA): OHR officials interfering into staffing issued in SIPA and OSA</p>	<p>Dnevni List, pg 3 'Paddy Ashdown responsible for insecurity of BiH citizens', by <u>Mensud Zorlak</u> – The article notes that the latest analysis by the Ljubljana-based International Institute for Middle East and Balkan Studies 'IFIMES' reads that the High Representative for BiH bears the biggest responsibility for the difficult situation BiH has been in for the last two years. Claiming that majority of domestic politicians also label HR Paddy Ashdown as the main culprit for the situation in the country, DL carries the Head of SDA Caucus in the FBiH House of Representatives, Semsudin Mehmedovic, who says it is unacceptable that some OHR officials are interfering into staffing issues in the BiH security agencies. According to him, that is most evident in the functioning of SIPA and OSA, because certain officials of the OHR have the biggest influence when it comes to appointment of staff.</p>
<p>DL: OHR influences staffing issues</p>	<p>Dnevni List, pg 2 'Accepting responsibility', by <u>Ivica Glibusic</u> – Commenting on the situation in BiH, foremost about the role of the OHR in the country, the author claims that the OHR is trying to give itself credits for everything good in BiH, whilst domestic authorities are being ascribed with all negative events. The author goes on to say that irrespective of the IC accepting or rejecting responsibility for events in BiH, the IC has influenced the appointment of staff in state institutions. In that context, Glibusic says the decisive factor was the loyalty to the OHR, not the expertise. The author concludes it was time the OHR and other international organization leave the job to domestic institutions.</p>

Dodik: 'Out to
the open with
all affairs'

Vecernje Novosti pg 5 'Out to the open with all affairs' by Slobodan Pesevic – Daily carries an interview with SNSD Chairman **Milorad Dodik** in which he assessed the current political situation in RS as depressive. He thinks there are no signs of exit from such situation, adding: *"Perhaps [Paddy] Ashdown and others, after they have removed several persons two-three months ago and caused crisis, have found it suitable to have a sterile RS Government of mixed composition."* He claims ruling parties are trying to keep their chairs at any cost, even if it means accepting reforms that are devastating RS, i.e. bringing it into a position of complete independence from "mood" of the international community. With regard to next general elections, Dodik thinks these would be the least fair elections because the ruling parties would fight to remain at their positions in order to keep many affairs from coming out to the open. He assesses SNSD has the support of 35% of voters in BiH. He explained his most recent claims with regard to the breach in Serbian financial transactions system in 1996, on which occasion, according to Dodik, **Radovan Karadzic** had a great amount of money for himself. Regarding the situation in BiH, Dodik says the authorities do not know what they want and have recently started raising issues of war past, noting: *"Newspapers are full of top stories related to surrenders to the Tribunal, bringing of persons before courts...This is a tragic image of current functioning of BiH, therefore this country has no chance to enter European integrations in next ten years'."*

<p>Comments on DPA</p>	<p>EuroBlic pgs RS 2-3 'Good ideas, worn solutions' by <u>Rajna Radosavljevic</u> – Daily carries extracts from interview Novi Reporter published with Steve Mayer, Professor at the Washington University for National Security, says that the western politicians have imposed Dayton Peace Agreement as a solution for BiH, not in order to establish a just state, but instead to serve their interests. He is of the view that the referendum would be the best solution for BiH. Tanja Topic, political analyst is of the view that referendum is not possible to implement, and that border issues are fait accompli. Senka Kurtovic, editor of Sarajevo "Oslobodjenje" says that it is high time Dayton concept was abandoned, since economically and politically divided state cannot survive.</p>

Manjaca war investigator working as head of OSA in Prijedor?

Oslobodjenje cover splash, pgs 4-5
‘Investigators from Manjaca and Keraterm serving in OSA’ by Besima Kahrimanovic – **Adil Draganovic**, a lawyer from Sanski Most, who was kept war prisoner in Manjaca concentration camp during the war says that **Jugoslav Rodic**, currently Commander of the BiH Intelligence Agency [OSA] in Prijedor, was the investigator in the camp. Brining more detailed account of the events in the camp, Draganovic, who was Rodic’s friend before the war, accused Rodic of taking part in ethnic cleansing. *“All those who directly or indirectly committed something evil, should be held responsible,”* says Draganovic. *“However until somebody calls him on, Jugoslav Rodic will work in OSA office in Prijedor without a disturbance, together with the boss **Radomir Rodic**, former investigator in Keraterm concentration camp,”* concludes the author.

Oslobodjenje pgs 4-5 ‘Fixed indictments for fabricated spying’ – Daily brings testimonies of two former POWs from Manjaca, **Amir Talic** and **Redzo Kurbegovic**, on their encounters with Rodic.

<p>VL: Lawsuit against SCG unites Croat parties</p>	<p>Vecernji List, pgs 4-5 'Croats in favour of lawsuit against Serbia and Montenegro', mentioned on front 'Lawsuit against SCG unites Croats in BiH', <u>not signed</u> – The articles claims that the lawsuit that BiH filed against Serbia and Montenegro has united the Croat parties in BiH unlike any other issue. Leaders of HDZ (Barisa Colak), HSP Djapic-Jurismic (Zvonko Jurisic), HSS (Marko Tadic) and HNZ (Miljenko Brkic) are carried as saying that they do support the lawsuit against SCG, however they insists that the lawsuit should prove that genocide has been committed against the Croats too, since the BiH legal representative in the lawsuit (Sakib Softic) stated that SCG will be tried for genocide against the Bosniaks.</p>
<p>Blic: Pavkovic in RS?</p>	<p>EuroBlic cover pg splash and pg 2 'Pavkovic ran away' by <u>I.Cvetkovic/N.Calukovic</u> – The daily learnt from the sources close to former Head of Yugoslav General Staff, General Nebojsa Pavkovic has ran way from SiCG, most likely to RS. The collocutor did not exclude the possibility that Pavkovic might have moved again.</p>

Oslobodjenje pg 8 'Lawyers of 'Meakic and others' worried that BiH will not pay them enough', mentioned on cover, by A. Omeragic – The defence lawyers team in the cases against **Zeljko Meakic, Dusan Knezevic, Dusan Fustar** and **Momcilo Gruban** – indicted for war crimes committed in concentration camps Omarska and Keraterm – have been trying to prevent transfer of their clients' cases before the BiH Court. They forwarded documents to the ICTY expressing their doubt that BiH will pay them enough. They are also interested to know whether there is someone supervising the work of the OHR, believing that *"one person or an office cannot have such arbitrary power to write and change laws."* Team also worries that witnesses in BiH are not protected enough noting that *"Serbs are victims of attacks in BiH prisons."* At the same time, the Tribunal has asked from BiH to answer to the new questions before decision on the transfer of cases. ICTY wants to know whether witness from RS are willing to testify before the BiH Court, and whether the court has established efficient mechanisms of their protection. Justice Minister, **Slobodan Kovac**, responded saying BiH has established the witness protection program, and institutions to take care of this, including SIPA. Author concludes that *"coincidence or not"*, victims the crimes have been threatened recently which they have reported to both local police and ICTY judges. Wondering whether this is a try to influence justices' decision, article concludes that the decision on the transfer is being waited for past four months.

Krsman – Chairman of BiH Election Commission **Vehid Sehic** says Sarajevo City Council would not have been illegally appointed had the municipal councils respected BiH Election Law and opinion of Election Commission during the process of election of City Council delegates. He claims there were no pressures in the process of making a decision upon a complaint of SDP with regard to the appointment of the delegates. He emphasises the only pressure applied on Election Commission members is the pressure of Election Law that must be respected. He added the Commission could not have reacted sooner because it had been waiting for a reply BiH Court on jurisdiction in this case. Asked whether this situation had showed the Election Law was incomplete and should be amended and changed, Sehic replied certain provisions of the Law should be more precise and it should be defined whose jurisdiction it is in certain segments, in order to avoid situations like this one.

The agenda of the Council's meeting, which will be annul following day, will include verification of the mandate of 4 missing members of the City Council and election of the Commissions, Boards and Council's working group.</p>
<p>HDZ withdraws its reps from Sarajevo City Council</p>	<p>Oslobodjenje pg 2 'HDZ withdrew its candidates for City Council' by <u>A.T.</u>– Daily learns that HDZ withdrew candidacy of Ana Havel for the position of Deputy Chair of Sarajevo City Council. The party also rejected to participate the work of any commissions, boards or working group and withdrew all its candidates for the positions in these structures. The Chair of the HDZ Sarajevo branch, Dubravko Horvat, states that <i>"Sarajevo is completely mono-ethnic and only Bosniaks rule in it."</i></p>
