Fena: Terzic on Ivanic /Cavic, Terzic mtg	<p><b>Fena, Srna</b> – Chairman of BiH CoM <b>Adnan Terzic</b> stated in Banja Luka last night that <b>Mladen Ivanic</b> is no longer the BiH Foreign Minister. Terzic added that he did not violate the Law on BiH CoM nor the procedure by accepting Ivanic's resignation few months after it had been submitted since Ivanic did not withdraw the submitted resignation.</p> <p>Terzic also said that he deliberately held Ivanic's resignation since he supposed that the situation in which Ivanic would obstruct the BiH CoM's work might occur. Commenting on the meeting with RS President <b>Dragan Cavic</b>, Terzic said that Cavic informed him that SDS supports Ivanic and they would not appoint anyone at his position. Terzic also stated that Cavic said that <b>Nikola Radovanovic</b> and <b>Slobodan Kovac</b> are not from SDS and they would not be withdrawn from the BiH CoM and therefore blockade in the BiH CoM's work will not take place.</p>

<p><b>Terzic on possible acceptance of his resignation, early elections</b></p>	<p><b>Srna</b> – Asked if the Chairman of the BiH Presidency, <b>Borislav Paravac</b>, could activate his resignation, which is with the Presidency, Terzic said that Paravac would thereby violate the Presidency's conclusion that refuses the resignation. <i>"If he does not support these changes, he will be violating the Presidency decision that allows me to re-construct the Council of Ministers as I see fit,"</i> said Terzic. He said that if the police reforms cannot be continued, early elections would be called in January or February.</p>
<p><b>Cavic prior to mtg with Terzic: SDS will not fill in PDP's positions/Terzic: I will demand appointment of Ministers</b></p>	<p><b>BHT 1</b> – SDS President <b>Dragan Cavic</b> and BiH Council of Minister Chairman <b>Adnan Terzic</b> discussed in Banja Luka the situation created by accepting the Ivanic's resignation. Before this meeting Cavic stated that SDS will not fill in the PDP's positions in the BiH CoM and that the crisis in the CoM' is Terzic's fault. <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 2 'SDS does not want positions which belong to PDP' by J.S. carries a similar Cavic's statement. <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 3 'SDS will not take PDP positions' by <u>V. Popovic, M. Cubro</u> also carries Terzic as saying prior to the meeting that he would talk with Cavic and SNSD President <b>Milorad Dodik</b> about appointment of new Ministers of Foreign Affairs and Traffic and Communications. Terzic said that he would demand appointment of Ministers and continuation of work otherwise <i>'we shall all together take over responsibility for blockade of reforms'</i>.</p>

<p><b>VL: CoM crisis created in order to extend HR's mandate in BiH</b></p>	<p><b>Vecernji List</b> pgs 2 and 3 'To constitutional changes with assistance of Ashdown' by <u>M. Relota</u> says that many political analysts believe that the current BiH CoM's crisis was caused deliberately in order to extend a mandate of High Representative <b>Paddy Ashdown</b> with his all current powers so that the process of constitutional changes can be launched and finished under his leadership. VL says accidentally or not the information about extension of the HR's mandate appeared immediately after the CoM's crisis emerged. VL also says that international officials who wanted to stay anonymous stated that it would be good that Ashdown stays until the EU consent for beginning of process of stabilization and association is given.</p>

Beus</u> – Commenting on media reports that HR <b>Paddy Ashdown</b> is going to extend his mandate in BiH, OHR spokesperson <b>Sanela Tunovic</b> stated that these claims are speculations and the OHR does not have comment on them. DL also says that most domestic politicians believe that it would be good and useful if the HR stays in BiH until we get the EU consent for beginning of the stabilization and association process. Sources close to the International Community claim that in case that the HR stays in BiH those who obstruct reforms might lose much more then it is the case now. DL concludes that it is hard to believe that Ashdown would leave BiH and leave such unsettled situation in our authority.</p>

BHT 1 reporter says that the fact that Trisic-Babic is a member of SNSD does not mean that this party will participate in the work of the CoM.</p>

<p><b>Dodik: SNSD is against Terzic's cabinet</b></p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> cover pg splash 'Terzic should clear out situation' and pg 5 'We shall not enter Terzic's cabinet' by <u>S. Numanovic</u> carries an interview with SNSD President <b>Milorad Dodik</b> who says that SNSD does not support a cabinet of <b>Adnan Terzic</b>. Asked whether he stands for early elections, Dodik says: <i>'I have seen that High Representative <b>Paddy Ashdown</b> is strongly against them. I believe that this is not a smart approach. I do not see the way to fill in the BiH CoM and continue with the reforms without elections. However, it is clear to me as to why the HR is so determinedly against the elections (Dodik did not say why) the Hr has such stand).'</i></p>
<p><b>SNSD will not participate in CoM's work nor support it</b></p>	<p><b>BHT 1, RTRS</b> – SNSD will not participate in the work of THE BiH Council of Ministers nor support it while the coalition SDA-SDS is ruling, led by CoM's Chair, <b>Adnan Terzic</b>, stated this party. SNSD said in its press release that the most useful Terzic's decision for BiH would be collective resignation of the CoM and scheduling of early parliamentary elections.</p>

Kurtovic</u> harshly criticizes <b>Adnan Terzic</b> saying that he does his job very bad in general. The author also says: <i>'Being lulled into Ashdown's congratulations and illuminated by praises which come from the OHR Terzic managed to convince himself that he does his job well.'</i> The author quotes one BiH politician who said that Terzic is the HR's bill of exchanged without security. The author says that we are all very well aware of it and wonders whether Terzic is aware of it as well.</p>



<p><b>RHB commentary on Novic's appointment</b></p>	<p><b>RHB</b> by <u>Ivica Simunovic</u> – Commenting on the appointment of <b>Sredoje Novic</b> to the position of the SIPA Director, Simunovic says that the farce goes on since BiH Presidencymember <b>Borislav Paravac</b> announced that he will accept Terzic's resignation submitted months ago. Simunovic goes on saying that Terzic wanted <b>Dragan Lukac</b> to be the SIPA Director or extraordinary elections. The third reason might be, says Simunovic, to provoke a fierce reaction from Serb parties and further weakening of their position in the eyes of the International Community. He concludes that whilst politicians are trying to remember whether they resigned recently people in BiH are still waiting for an open dialogue that would resolve the current situation and send BiH to EU.</p>

**Nezavisne Novine** pg 6 'Croats want third entity' by J.S. carries that at the public forum called 'On eve of constitutional changes in BiH', which was held in Tuzla newly elected HDZ President **Dragan Covic** stated: *'If the RS representatives were insisting on existence of the RS, HDZ would insist on the third entity.'* He added: *'For a longer period of time the International Community has been keeping stalemate in order to secure the position for itself. 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**RS Constitutional Court rejected several requests of Bosniak Caucus in RS CoP which dispute acts adopted in RSNA**

**BHT 1** – The Council for protecting vital national interests within the RS Constitutional Court on Friday rejected several requests of the Bosniak Caucus in the RS Council of Peoples, which dispute the acts adopted in the RSNA. This includes the initiative for disputing the constitutional grounds of the name “Republika Srpska”. The Council’s judges stated that they are representing the law and not political will. The judges rejected requests regarding several laws, including the Law on provisional delay of implementation of claims from city and municipality budgets in RS. The judges agreed that this law violates the rights of all citizens. *“There is no discrimination against Bosniaks, because the Serbs rights for compensation are violated as well. We took the standing that here in question is the higher interest, interest of the RS, not individual interest, and that this is only provisional delay and that these issue will soon be solved,”* said RS Constitutional Court President, **Mirko Zovko**. First comments from the Bosniak Caucus shows that Council’s decisions are accepted. *“We will, of course, continues to work in accordance with the Constitution, what ever we are allowed to do through Bosniak caucus, through Council of Peoples, we will do,”* said member of Bosniak Caucus in the RS CoP, **Ramiz Salkic**. Also covered by **FTV, RTRS, Dnevni Avaz** pg 9 ‘Demands of Bosniak Caucus rejected’ not signed, **Nezavisne Novine** pg 2 ‘Municipalities rescued from bankruptcy’ by D. Risojevic.

<p><b>RS Government on procedural conference on arbitrary decision on Brcko, which is to be held on 13-14 June in London</b></p>	<p><b>TV Pink</b> by <u>Milka Mrdja</u> – The RS Government held session on Friday. The Government decided that the final arbitrary decision regarding the Brcko area, brought on March 5, 1999 and annexes, brought on August 18, 1999, suspended the ICTY's mandate as well as it jurisdiction for being in charge of judicial decisions issued by the High Representative. Due to the fact that the procedural conference on arbitrary decision on Brcko has been appointed for 13-14 June, in London, the Government informed that it did support the ICTY Chair's stance for discussion to be based on definition of legal issues and that any discussion on authoritativeness of such issues and their political consequences should be excluded.</p>
<p><b>Jovic, Humphreys on police reform, public RTV service</b></p>	<p><b>Dnevni List</b> pg 2 'Jovic lobbies for Herzegovinian TV Mostar' by <u>NINA</u> – Croat member of the BiH Presidency <b>Ivo Miro Jovic</b> met with Head of the EC delegation in BiH <b>Michael Humphreys</b> and they talked about faster implementation of reforms. They agreed that the solution of the police reform and public RTV system should be found as soon as possible. In this context they talked about the initiative of Herzegovinian TV Mostar to be together with Radio Herce Bosna a part of complete RTV service for a part of the programme in Croatian language.</p>

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<p><b>Cavic and Matijasevic condemned killing of Bosniaks by Scorpions unit</b></p>	<p><b>RHB, BHT 1, Hayat, FTV, RTRS, Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 8  ‘Cavic and Matijasevic condemned crime committed by Scorpions’ <u>not signed</u>, <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 3, mentioned on cover ‘Cavic and Matijasevic condemned crime committed by Scorpions’ <u>not signed</u>, <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 4  ‘Cavic and Matijasevic condemned crimes committed by Scorpions’ <u>by Sn. Matijasevic and Cavic confirmed that the preparations for security regarding commemoration of Srebrenica events are ongoing.</p>
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<p><b>Former RS Police Minister Kovac: RS Supreme Command decided to ask for help from Serbia and Republika Srpska Krajina in 1995</b></p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> – Former RS Police Minister <b>Tomo Kovac</b> stated that RS Supreme Command decided to ask for help from Serbia and Republika Srpska Krajina in 1995. Kovac stated that the RS MoI sent around 500 people at the time that carried out police work from Bijeljina to Banja Luka and claims that Scorpions arrived within units sent by Republika Srpska Krajina.</p>
<p><b>DA published list of missing Bonsiaks from Srebrenica</b></p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> carries in its supplement a preliminary list with names of Srebrenica victims.</p>
<p><b>Osl.: Employees of Serbian MoI also in report of Working Group for Srebrenica</b></p>	<p><b>Oslobodjenje</b> cover pg splash and pgs 4 and 5 ‘Employees of Serbian MoI also among registered ones’ by <u>S. Rozajac</u> says that they have come into possession of the report made by Working Group for Implementation of Srebrenica Commission’s conclusions. According to Osl. the working group has made 3 categories of persons who are being brought in relation with the Srebrenica events in July 1995. Osl. also says that according to the working report from March 31, 2005 a certain number of employees in the public and state security of the Serbian Ministry of Interior are also among these persons and they are related to takeover of prisoners from Srebrenica who came to Serbia.</p>

<p><b>Hayat on Srebrenica Task Force list</b></p>	<p><b>Hayat</b>, name of reporter not stated- The <b>High Representative</b> has once more warned the RS Ministry of Defence and Ministry of Interior to do all in their power to complete lists of soldiers and police officers which are still employed by the Ministries, but who participated in war crimes in Srebrenica in July 1995. List with 25.000 names, submitted to Srebrenica Taskforce, is being investigated by the RS MoD. According to some information, 5.000 names of soldiers, mentioned on the list, were not in Srebrenica, in July 1995. The list of 25.000 was made on the basis of data on all soldiers who during the war went through units, which are being connected with Srebrenica events. But, it will be difficult to make the list of those who were involved in operation called "Krivaja". <i>"Unfortunately, the list cannot be related with the period when the parts of units or complete units operated, since such data were registered at levels of brigades and departments"</i>, said RS Minister of Defence, <b>Milovan Stankovic</b>. RS MoD supposes that that part of the documentation, recorded by lower ranked officials is in the ICTY. 6 months ago, 16 boxes with documentation of Drina's Corps have been submitted to the ICTY. RS MoD asked for the documentation to be brought back. The ICTY Spokesperson <b>Florence Harman</b> did not want to comment the RS MoD's request. <i>"RS MoD has informed the Taskforce that it was still working on the case, and that they had established a team of 30 persons"</i>, said the Chair of the Srebrenica Taskforce <b>Jovan Spaić</b>. The ICTY has returned a part of the documentation to the RS MoI, and the document will help in creation of the list of persons who were involved in "Krivaja".</p>
