<p>BiH HoR in session</p>	<p>BH Radio 1, RHB – BiH House of Representatives has adopted the information on the execution of the state institutions' budget for 2004. In the continuation of today's session, BiH HoR is expected to discuss the draft 2005 budget of the state institutions, and the report by the BiH Parliament joint commission on harmonization of the text of VAT Law. HoR also requested from the BiH Defence Ministry to submit to delegates its report on allegations that Ratko Mladic was in Veliki Zep last summer before submitting to the OHR. Nikola Spiric asked HoR to call on CoM Chair, Adnan Terzic, to explain current situation of the Council of the Ministers and to report on actions undertaken to solve the issues.</p>
<p>Croat self-rule trials postponed</p>	<p>RHB, BH Radio 1 – Trials of Ante Jelavic and six other former Croat officials, who are charged with events related to the 'Croat self-rule' case, which was supposed to take place today (Wednesday), has been postponed for February 14 because Jelavic is pre-occupied with 'Hercegovacka bank' case. This is a result of appeal lodged by Jelavic's lawyer, Josip Muselimovic.</p>

Medunjanin</u>, FENA – The EU Force (EUFOR) still claims that they possess reliable proof that the indicted war crime suspect, Ratko Mladic, resided at the military base near Han Pijesak in the summer of 2004, as well as before that. The spokesperson of EUFOR, Bridget Rose, made this statement at a press conference in Sarajevo on Tuesday when asked to comment on the allegations by the BiH Defence Ministry' investigative team that the RS Army command units did not receive the request or an order for hiding any indicted for crime suspects in their facilities. Rose was unable to present the details of those information or their sources due to operational reasons. When asked whether EUFOR is not sharing information with BiH authorities because they do not trust them, Rose said that information are shared when this not jeopardizing the security of their sources, and underlined that this does not concern any lack of trust.</p> <p>EuroBlic, cover 'Paddy Ashdown and EUFOR are hiding evidence on Ratko Mladic' and pg. <p>OHR demands MoD to investigate Veliki Zep 'episode' by 14 February</p>	<p>BHT, FTV, Oslobodjenje cover splash, pgs4-5 'Paddy Ashdown fails Radovanovic to makeup test' by <u>Az. Kalamujic</u> – <i>"Office of the High Representative possesses reliable information on indications that RS Army helped hiding Ratko Mladic in Veliki Zep location in June last year,"</i> states OHR spokesman, Mario Brkic, after BiH Defence Ministry stated that its team found no evidences which would prove Mladic's presence in Han Pijesak last summer. Brkic further explained that OHR expects from MoD to submit report which would identify weaknesses which allowed Veliki Zep 'episode' to happen. <i>"MoD should submit this report to OHR by 14 February,"</i> underlines Brkic. Oslobodjenje comments that it is obvious that OHR is not satisfied with MoD, giving it additional time to confirm Mladic's presence in Veliki Zep. BiH Deputy Defence Minister, Enes Becirbasic, said he thinks OHR did submit to MoD information based on which it believes Mladic was in Han Pijesak. <p>NN op-ed on OHR, Ratko Mladic</p>	<p>Nezavisne Novine op-ed pg 7 'Whom to trust?' by <u>Aleksandar Sekulic</u> – The author notes that the game hide-and-seek regarding possible hiding of Ratko Mladic at Han Pijesak last summer continues, and the public won't most likely ever find out the truth about this issue. The author further reminds of statements of BiH Defence Ministry and OHR both persistent in contrary claims. He notes one side is telling the truth, wondering which one. If – by any chance – proved that OHR was wrong, it would turn out that the most powerful organisation in BiH, was making deliberations roughly. On the other side, if proved BiH Defence Ministry was wrong, it would turn out that so much praised and united Ministry is incapable of performing the simplest task. This task force has not yet been formed, and Kovacevic said that the public would be timely informed about its establishment. The High Representative, Paddy Ashdown, has warned the RS authorities, especially the Government about the obligation of forming the said task force, which among other things needs to identify the persons mentioned in the Srebrenica Commission's Report that might be responsible for the crime.</p>

<p>ICTY transfers seven cases to Brcko prosecution</p>	<p>RHB, RTRS, Oslobođenje pg 2 ‘A class for seven more indictees’, Dnevni List pg 5 ‘7 cases for crimes committed over Serbs’ by <u>A. Beus</u>, Vecernji List pg 3 ‘New materials from The Hague received’ by <u>f</u>, SRNA – The Brcko District prosecution service has received seven class A cases from the Hague Tribunal, public prosecutor Zekerija Mujkanovic has told SRNA. He went on to say that the district’s prosecution service has a total of 13 such cases which will be handled with the highest priority. <i>“The cases are at different stages and additional time is needed to complete investigations for some of them, while others are at the stage before indictments are issued,”</i> Mujkanovic said. In line with the rules of procedure, Mujkanovic declined to divulge the identity and the nationality of the persons in question, and pointed out that all of them concerned individual responsibility for war crimes. Mujkanovic refused to confirm the identity of the war crimes suspect who was arrested on 28 December in Brcko, although the media has already identified him as Konstantin Simeunovic-Kole. <i>“The suspect is being detained for one month and his identity will be made public only once a possible indictment is issued against him, “</i> Mujkanovic said.</p>

<p>Gotovina's lawyer says his client ready to surrender himself under Gotovina's terms</p>	<p>Vecernji List, front pg splash and pgs 10-11 'Gotovina offering agreement', by <u>Drazen Klaric</u> – VL claims to be in possession of a letter that General Ante Gotovina's lawyer, Luka Misetic, sent to the Chairman of EU Council, the Luxembourg Foreign Minister, Jean Asselborn, on January 5, 2005, in which Misetic notes that his client is willing to <i>"go before the court if he is allowed to be tried before a domestic court in Croatia"</i>, in other words if the case be handed over to the Croatian judiciary, in accordance with the 11 bis rule. The Luxembourg Foreign Ministry confirmed it had received the letter and forwarded it to the ICTY. According to the ICTY Prosecution's spokeswoman, Florance Hartmann, the ICTY will not negotiate with people who are on the run. <i>"The letter by people who represent themselves as Gotovina's lawyers is another attempt to politicize the case. General Gotovina must surrender"</i>, says Hartmann.</p>

Karacic</u> – DL says that ICTY indictee Dario Kordic might be transferred to Croatia during this year where he would serve his sentence. His lawyer Mitko Nuamovski confirmed this possibility and added that he IS writing an official letter to Croatian Justice Minister Vesna Skare-Ozbolt in which Naumovski demands from the competent ministry to start negotiations on this issue.</p>

Rerig</u>, FENA – The joint commission of the BiH Parliamentary Assembly on Tuesday has harmonized the text of the Law on VAT, according to which a single VAT rate of 17 percent will be imposed, member of the joint parliamentary commission, Seada Palavric, told Fena. <i>"The commission's report on Wednesday will be presented to the House of Representatives, and afterwards to the delegates of the House of Peoples"</i>, said Palavric. The Law on VAT was recently adopted in both Houses of the Parliamentary Assembly, but in different texts. The House of Representatives adopted the bill with a differentiated rate of zero and 17 percent, while the House of Peoples adopted the law with a single rate of 17 percent. Due to the fact that the Law was adopted in different texts, the relevant commission was formed to reach an agreement on the single text, and on Tuesday it has decided to support the text with a single rate of 17 percent.</p> <p>Nezavisne Novine, cover and pg. 3 'Prices of basic consumers' goods will increase' by <u>M. Cubro</u> – apart from reporting on the harmonization of VAT laws before the joint commission of HoR and HoP of BiH Parliament, the article quotes the Commission Chairman Halid Genjac, as saying that the introduction of a single VAT rate would result in an increase of prices of basic consumers' goods. The article also carries a statement of Mesud Lakota, the Secretary of the Association of Consumers, saying that the state has done nothing to protect the poorest category of the population from the increase in prices.</p>

Dnevni List pg 3 'Kumalic: Stabile tax system' not signed carries BiH Deputy Minister of Finances and Treasury **Jusuf Kumalic** who comments on harmonization of Law on VAT as saying: '*VAT offers a stabile tax system, it is easier for application because it implies smaller administration and there is a big probability that it will contribute to more significant reduction of corruption, that is, tax evasion.*'

Dnevni List pg 3 'Shameful decision to damage of people' not signed SDP President **Zlatko Lagumdžija** stated that this decision is shameful and it shows that the SDA-HDZ-SDS Coalition is functioning without mistake. Also, Lagumdžija does not believe that the HoR will confirm such shameful decision and he expects more serious discussion on this issue.

Dnevni List pg 3 'VAT will not affect pensioners during 2005' not signed – FBiH Minister of Labor **Radovan Vignjević** stated that most probably VAT will not affect pensioners during 2005 since it has been expected that VAT comes in force as late as in summer or autumn 2005.

Dnevni List pg 3 'Stojanov: Strike on poor people' not signed – Prime Minister of the Alternative BiH Government **Dragoljub Stojanov** opposed the aforementioned harmonization of the Law on VAT and he added that this decision shows that protection of pensioners and poor peoples was not taken into consideration in BiH.

Karacic carries an editorial in which the author says that by introduction of VAT amounting to 17% politicians definitely decided to take from citizens little money that BiH citizens still have. The RS president's information service said that during the meeting Cavic underlined that he expected cooperation and partnership, rather than forced solutions. Gen Leakey emphasized the RS's needed to carry out obligations towards the Hague Tribunal and welcomed the results of the implemented defence reforms. Vukovic, **Dnevni Avaz** pg 4 'There will be no room for SDA, Party for BiH, SDP in the new RS Government', **FENA** – The non-participation of the Party of Democratic Action (SDA) in the future RS Government will not result in political consequences, RS President **Dragan Cavic** said in Banja Luka on Tuesday. Cavic said at a press conference that none of the RS (Serb dominated) political parties were taking part in the Federation of BiH Government and *"no-one sees this as a problem"*, while there is a desire to portray the Serb Democratic Party (SDS), SDA and the Party of Democratic Progress (PDP) as being joined together in government by an *"umbilical cord"*. *"The SDA will not be part of the new RS government due to the current political circumstances,"* Cavic said, reiterating that the Social Democratic Party of BiH and Party for BiH will also not be part of the government due to their support for the abolishment of the RS. On Tuesday, Cavic appointed **Ognjen Tadic** of Serb Radical Party 'Vojislav Seselj' as his political advisor. Tadic's priority task will be to work on the implementation of the Agreement on Coordinated political Action signed by six RS (Serb-dominated) political parties. **Glas srpske**, pg. 2 'Pressures after the agreement' by N. D., **EuroBlic**, pg. RS1 'Obstacles in wheels' by Rajna Radosavljevic, inset 'Ognjen Tadic will advise President Cavic' also reported on appointment of Tadic.

SDS has called on PM-designate to form the Government asap, that would enjoy a strong parliament support. <p>SD on public statements by HR Ashdown</p>	<p>Slobodna Dalmacija, pg 14 'Sarajevo an Islamic centre for Europe?', by <u>Marin Erceg</u> – Commenting on public statements and interviews that the High Representative for BiH, Paddy Ashdown, has made recently, the author notes that <i>"Paddy is successfully doing his slalom between the Balkans and European capitol cities and media. Following the meeting, SDHR Wnendt stated that there were no political crises in Mostar, noting that the implementation of the Statute was being implemented successfully. *"When it comes to decision of temporary funding, I am convinced that the Mayor and City Council will solve the problem and that the budget will be adopted on time. I believe there is absolutely no crisis"*, said SDHR Wnendt. Talking about the temporary funding of the city, Mayor Beslic stated that the issue would be solved next week, when a session the MCC is scheduled. *"We will not go to the session until we agree upon everything. Although I cannot be a proponent, the item will be proposed by one of caucus of peoples"*, said Beslic. He also warned of likely financial difficulties the city would be facing when the two Elektroprivredas (Herceg Bosna and BiH) stop paying compensations to the city budget as of April 2005, especially having in mind the downsizing of the Mostar administration and severance pays that will have to be paid out to the surplus employees. In that context, Mayor Beslic stated: *"We hope that the IC will have the understanding and extend the decision"*. SDHR Wnendt also visited the Mostar Airport, where he met with the Deputy Director of the Airport, **Izet Sahovic**, who said the Airport was in bad condition because it did not have the funds to purchase the necessary equipment. SDHR Wnendt noted that the Airport had a great potential, adding: *"I hope the potential will be supported by the City of Mostar, FBiH and BiH"*. This is the first blockade of a municipal account after the Trebinje Regional Court reached a verdict, in accordance with which the Municipality, RS Ministry of Trades and “Metalac” firm are obliged to pay approximately 36 million KM of compensation of Alijagic brothers for damage they suffered due to war-time activities. Trebinje Municipality Mayor Dobroslav Cuk expressed his belief that citizens should not bear the responsibility for this. He believes individuals should bear the responsibility.
