<p>RS President continues consultations on PM-designate; SDS announces possibility to support Djuric</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> – <b>Mladen Bosic</b>, SDS Vice President, has today stated that the SDS does not exclude the possibility of supporting the candidature of <b>Nedjo Djuric</b>, former member of SP RS, as RS PM-designate. Bosic said after the meeting SDS members had with <b>Dragan Cavic</b>, RS President, that SDS Main Board would hold a session in Banja Luka tomorrow and decide whether this would be the case. The Serb Radical Alliance “Dr Vojislav Seselj” has addressed a letter to RS President Cavic informing him that this party will not take part in negotiations on PM-designate, neither will it support PM-designates coming from SDS or SNSD. The meeting between Cavic, RS President, and SDA representatives, in regard to talks on PM-designate is about to start in Banja Luka. <b>RTRS</b> by <u>Dragan Stegic</u> – Bosic also added no support would be given to the PM-designate from party that was overthrowing former RS Government. <b>RHB</b> reports consultations continue.</p>
<p>HDZ spokesperson Relota: HDZ expects new HR will not remove officials</p>	<p><b>RHB</b> – HDZ spokesperson <b>Miso Relota</b> stated that HDZ expects from a new HR <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b> to be an active partner to representatives of the executive and legislative authority at all levels in order to remove obstacles for development of economy and welfare area so that BiH meets all positive, European and democratic standards. Also, it has been expected from the new HR that, unlike his predecessors, he would not remove legally elected officials.</p>

New HR CSS meets BiH HoP, HoR Collegium	<b>RHB</b> – Members of the Collegium of the BiH House of Representative and BiH House of Peoples have met with the new HR <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b> today.
ITA rejects excluding publishing sector from VAT	<b>RTRS</b> – At Tuesday’s session, the Steering Board of the ITA has upheld the principle on a single VAT rate, rejecting demand of the BiH CoM (requesting that publishing sector is excluded from this principle). <b>Svetlana Cenic</b> , RS Finance Minister, has commented on this decision: <i>“What has happened is as follows: when Mr. [Adnan] Terzic came to the meeting of the ITA without any prior consultation with any member of the ITA, this decision was not voted on, but the issue on whether this should be raised or not was left open...After on, some documents, which have never appeared at any session of the ITA neither has ITA ever discussed them, has surfaced.”</i>

## Schwarz-Schilling takes over OHR

<p>Paddy Ashdown hands over duty to newly appointed HR Christian Schwarz- Schilling</p>	<p><b>BHT1</b>by Alenka Bruck – On Tuesday, the outgoing High Representative <b>Paddy Ashdown</b> handed over his duty to newly appointed <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b>, who, as reported, should be the last HR in BiH. Ashdown expressed satisfaction that Schwarz-Schilling would be his successor: <i>“I believe that under his helm, activities with regard to coordinating the international community and the work of OHR will certainly be in good hands.”</i> Schwarz-Schilling stressed that BiH has entered the new phase by beginning the talks on Stabilisation and Association Agreement with the EU0. <i>“I think I have the opportunity to continue Ashdown’s job, and I will do my best to continue the same road – leading BiH towards Europe and into Europe”</i>, said Schilling. <p>EU's Solana welcomes CSS ' appointment</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 2 'Solana will give full support to Schwarz-Schilling' <u>by Fena</u> – EU High Representative for the Common Foreign and Security Policy [CFSP], <b>Javier Solana</b> welcomes the decision of the EU Council on 30 January to appoint <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b> as the European Union Special Representative [EUSR] for BiH.</p>
<p>BHT1, comments: Professors Rasigagic and Mirjanic hope new HR CSS would do lot more than Ashdown</p>	<p><b>BHT1</b> late news – Guests of late news magazine were <b>Zeljko Mirjanic</b>, Professor at Faculty of Law in Banja Luka and <b>Esref Kenan Rasidagic</b>, Professor at Faculty of Political Science in Sarajevo. Both of them welcomed the new High Representative <b>Christian Schwarz Schilling</b> and said that they expected him to do a lot more than the previous one. Mirjanic said that he was fascinated with Schilling's sentence in which he said that his aim was for ordinary BiH citizens to build up their lives again, since Ashdown failed to do that. Both of them agreed that all the HRs to BiH tried to transfer authorities from the OHR to BiH institutions, but that the BiH institutions achieved no greater success, knowing that there is 'some institution' (OHR) which would do their work, namely BiH institutions depend on it. Rasidagic said that Ashdown was the EU and the UK's product and that he acted in line with their orders, and that the question was whether German political establishment and the EU supported Schwarz-Schilling's ideas since he resigned from the position of Minister of Telecommunications in <b>Helmut Kohl</b>'s Government, being unsatisfied with politics which was led towards BiH. Mirjanic said that he did not agree with Rasidagic's opinion and added that every HR represented the EU stances, not the stances of a state he came from.</p>

<p>BHT1 and RTRS polls show citizens have no high expectations of new HR</p>	<p><b>BHT1</b>– BHT1 carried out a poll among citizens of Bijeljina, Sarajevo, Kalesija, Bihac and Zenica asking them on their expectations from newly appointed High Representative <b>Christian Schwarz Schilling</b>. All polled citizens believe, or hope, that CSS would be a better HR than <b>Paddy Ashdown</b>, although noting that ‘he may be a bit too old for this job’. Most of them claim that it is a good thing that German citizen is the new HR, because <i>“it is a well-known fact that Germany is a friend of BiH”</i>. <b>RTRS</b> – RTRS’s poll showed that most of the featured citizens negatively criticized Ashdown’s work, and stated that they don’t expect much from Schwarz-Schilling. Few said that they expect Schwarz-Schilling to end the job started by Ashdown, or to do more than Ashdown did.</p>

**BHT1** by Boris Gagic – During the first day of talks with between RS President Dragan Cavic and the RS parliamentary parties' officials on the appointment of RS PM-designate, former SPRS official **Nedjo Djuric** has been officially nominated for the position. Cavic held talks with the newly-established Coalition of 10 representatives, and they proposed Djuric as their candidate; according to BHT reporter, Cavic told them that he would accept his candidacy if he is able to collect 42 representatives' signatures. *"We think that the Government headed by Nedjo Djuric would be the best solution for the RS... Now, we will try to collect those 42 signatures"*, stated **Krsto Jandric** from People's Democratic Party [NDS]. SNSD will officially nominate **Milorad Dodik** on Wednesday, adding they are not in a hurry as SNSD leader has the support of necessary 42 representatives. *"SNSD will propose to RS President how to solve current crisis in RS... We believe that it can be solved by appointing Milorad Dodik as the PM Designate"*, stated SNSD's **Nebojsa Radmanovic**. BHT reporter speculates that some opposition parties could withdraw their support to Dodik and give it to Djuric instead. Representatives of DNS, who are currently in talks with Cavic, are "vague" when talking about their support to Dodik. *"We clearly stated that we would not give blank support to anyone. We will support the appointment of the PM Designate, but the composition of the new government is a different matter"*, DNS' **Drago Kalabic** tried to explain. Cavic earlier promised that, whoever brings him the signatures of 42 representatives, he would check each and every one of them. **Dnevni Avaz** pg 9 'Cavic would give mandate to Djuric or Dodik' by N. Simic said candidate PM-designate would present his program in the RS National Assembly for approval, adding SNSD would get more than 42 votes for its platform. Bosniak members of the RS Council of People opposed the publishing and the empowerment of these laws claiming that they were violating their vital national interests.

BiH Minister for Security **Barisa Colak** stated that this would ensure assistance for the Executive Body of the Police Restructuring Directorate and its work on implementation plan through professional and advisory support in all segments. Colak emphasized that BiH citizens urgently need efficient and professional police forces. Colak once again reminded that the process of police restructuring is going to fully respect all requirements set by the EC. Humphreys reminded that police restructuring is vital for the establishment of functional police forces in BiH as one of the key issues in negotiations on a Stabilisation and Association Agreement with the EU. *“It is one of the strongest conditions for carrying on with the SAA negotiations”*, said Humphreys.
