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**HR Ashdown  
calls for  
strengthening  
of BiH  
Constitutional  
Court**

FTV – The High Representative for BiH, Paddy Ashdown, announced first set of steps in relation to strengthening of BiH Constitutional Court jurisdiction. This was reaction to announcements on changes and amendments to the law on Constitutional Court that supposed to be discussed by the representatives in BiH Parliament and which foresees withdrawal of international judges from this institution (proponent of which is Momcilo Novakovic, an SDS MP), reports FTV. The HR called on BiH justice Ministry to form working group that will determine ways and mechanisms of strengthening of BiH Constitutional Court jurisdiction. According to Ashdown, Constitutional Court should do what currently OHR does, i.e. carry out legal analysis of proposed laws before they are enacted. *“I believe we should explore the possibility of having the Court review draft legislation before it is enacted. Governments working on legislation should ask the Court for opinion whether the law they propose is constitutional before enacting it,”* stated Ashdown. Ashdown accept possibility of Constitutional Court reviewing his decisions, even though this is not in accordance to Bonn declaration. One of the tasks of this working group would be to consider engagement of international judges in the Constitutional Court. *“The rationale for this process is clear. International staff can provide BiH institutions with impartial international expertise in the early phases of their establishment. But as BiH institutions establish their authority, that service can be reduced, until the point where it is no longer required,”* said Ashdown. <p><b>HDZ to propose new constitutional organization of BiH</b></p>	<p>Vecernji List, pgs 2-3, mentioned on front 'HDZ for decentralized and modern state of BiH', by <u>Miso Relota, Pero Crnogorac</u> – HDZ Main Board has tasked the HDZ Presidency to prepare proposal on BiH reorganisation based on equality of all of three constitutional peoples, stated HDZ President, Barisa Colak. Colak explains: <i>"We need a functional, efficient, modern and well organized state, and what is most important to us, we need a decentralized state. It is certain that we will go into strengthening of local self-government (...) To achieve that, we need a consent of all three sides in BiH and we will have to see how to achieve that. We have held intensive talks with parties that form the parliamentary majority in BiH. We shall also have talks with other parties and representatives of the IC"</i>. Risojevic</u> – In a page interview to <i>NW</i>, <b>Nikola Spiric</b>, Deputy Chair of the BiH HoR, says that an orchestrated campaign, with the assistance of some forces from RS, is run in BiH and is aimed against Serb officials at intelligence and police structures of BiH. The final aim of these activities is to destroy the professionalism of these people, who are firmly struggling with the crime. He is convinced that the first target of that campaign is <b>Sredoja Novic</b>, adding: <i>"It seems like it would be the best if all the Serbs, who had worked at security agencies during 90's, move out from BiH, since they seem to be undesirable personnel in Sarajevo."</i></p>

Cooperation with ICTY/War Crimes

<p><b>Commission for coordination/cooperation with ICTY formed</b></p>	<p><b>BHT</b> – Commission for coordination of state and entities institutions has been formed on Friday in Sarajevo with aim to ensure full cooperation with the ICTY. This was the first working meeting of the Commission, whose forming was requested by the Peace Implementation Council (PIC). BiH Council of Ministers Chair <b>Adnan Terzic</b> believes that forming of this Commission is a new kind of pressure on the RS authorities to fulfil its international obligations. <i>“I don’t want to understand that work of this Commission is defined as the new kind of pressure on the RS. That is absolutely not correct. Before anything else, RS have no intelligence service, RS don’t control the border, RS have no SIPA, those are BiH institutions’ tasks and those should be communicated and coordinated with other relevant institutions. In RS, that is only Ministry of Interior,”</i> said RS President <b>Dragan Cavic</b>. The Commission consists of representatives of the State Border Service, Intelligence Service, SIPA, BiH Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Entity Presidents, Entity Minister of Interior and Ministers of Defence and representatives of the ICTY. Commission work is supported by the international community in BiH that believes that there is a low level of cooperation between state and entities institutions in BiH. BiH State Border Service could have bigger role in arresting of war crimes inductees, and well as BiH Intelligence Agency (OSA). It is time for current jurisdiction of state institutions to be used in right way, believes the High Representative, <b>Paddy Ashdown</b>.</p> <p><b>RHB</b> – HR Paddy Ashdown stated that the working group for cooperation with ICTY represents a good mechanism for meeting the demands of Peace Implementation Council regarding cooperation with ICTY. At the joint press conference, both ministers stated that <b>Radovan Karadzic</b> and <b>Ratko Mladic</b> are not on territories of RS and Serbia and Montenegro. On this occasion Matijasevic stated that Mladic and Karadzic would be arrested if he would have information that they are on the RS territory. Matijasevic added that RS police have no information on any ICTY indictee hiding in RS. <p>Oslobodjenje int/ with general Schook: 'We are aggressive in pursuing war criminals'</p>	<p><b>Oslobodjenje</b> supplement 'Pogled', pg 28 'We are aggressive in pursuing war criminals' by <b>Antonio Prlenda</b> – In an interview to Oslobodjenje, the Commander of NATO's HQ in Sarajevo, general <b>Steven Schook</b> says he believes domestic politicians will provide for sufficient support to for defence reform and abolishment of the entities' defence ministries. <i>"I expect, optimistically, that this summer we will see legislation adopted and that by the end of 2005 there will be only one Ministry of Defence,"</i> says Schook. On cooperation with the ICTY, General Schook stresses that domestic authorities have a responsibility to arrest all war crimes suspects at large, adding: <i>"In my estimate, we are not even close to that yet. RS should be congratulated for the beginning of this cooperation by extraditing on suspect to last month. However, that should not be mistaken for the full cooperation... I am not an optimist when it comes to fulfilling all conditions for the full cooperation by April. Why? Because first we have to ensure to stop every assistance to PIFWCs. The amount of money which goes from RS for that purpose... is enormous. Thus, many things have to be done by April."</i> Schook concluded: <i>"But, I will say that we work aggressively, aggressively and aggressively on this issue. I want to see all PIFWCs arrested, so BiH moves into Partnership for Peace."</i></p>
<p>Matanovic case: Prijedor Policemen acquitted</p>	<p><b>BHT</b> – The Banja Luka District Court Trial Chamber acquitted 11 Prijedor police officers who were charged with war crimes against civilians. Former police officers were indicted for illegal detention and murder of Catholic priest <b>Tomislav Matanovic</b> and his parents in 1995. President of the Trial Chamber <b>Dusko Gojovic</b> stated that it has not been proven that the 11 police officers committed those criminal acts.
