Trial of Jelavic and others to start on September 23	<p>Herceg Bosna Radio, FTV, Oslobodjenje cover page, pg 3 'Trial of Ante Jelavic and others to start on September 23' and pg 8 'Matesa, Hebrang and Skegro to testify', Nezavisne Novine pg 5 'Defence summons Mates, Hebrang and Skegra' mentioned on cover 'Trial against Jelavic commences on 23 September' by <u>A. Durmo</u>, Slobodna Dalmacija, pg 2 'Jelavic's defence wants Matesa, Skegro and Hebrang for witnesses', by <u>M. Sivric</u> – On the trial of Ante Jelavic, Miroslav Prce and Miroslav Rupcic the defence will suggest that the members of Croatian Government from the period 1995-2001 are called as defence witnesses. They include: Zlatko Matesa, Andrija Hebrang and Borislav Skegro. This was confirmed on Wednesday by Jelavic's attorney Josip Muselimovic. Muselimovic said that the judge of BiH Court Malcolm Simmons asked from defence attorneys necessary documentation and names of the witnesses that need to be heard. According to Muselimovic, judge Simons scheduled the start of the trial for September 23 or the first free term after that date.</p>

<p>Three RS policemen arrested in action "Forgery"</p>	<p>BHTV, Oslobođenje pg 6 'A customs officer and three RS Interior Ministry employees arrested', Nezavisne Novine cover and pg 3 'Three policemen and customs officer arrested in action "Forgery" by <u>S. Karic & I. Simundza</u>; Glas Srpske pg 12 "Forgery" placed cuffs'; EuroBlic RSpg2 'Suspected for falsifying documents' – Banja Luka police frces have arrested three members of RS Ministry of Interior under suspicion of involvement in irregular registration of vehicles. The action was carried out in cooperation with District Prosecution Office, and during the operation one member of the Customs Service was arrested too. The action, named "Forgery", has started early on Wednesday and the arrested persons include Branka Susnjar, Velimir Glavic and Stana Malinic. Chief of Banja Luka Police Mile Dosenovic said that until now over 150 vehicles were registered irregularly some 40 of which were seized. Spokesperson of the CIPS Project Implementation Directorate Sanela Turkovic has denied any kind of relation between this institution and members of RS MoI, who have been working on collecting the data for CIPS IDs. <i>"All I can say is that today's arrest of RS MoI's employees has absolutely nothing to do with the Directorate for Implementation of CIPS Project and that no one of Direction's employees is in any way connected with named action"</i>, said Turkovic. Banja Luka Police Station has announced that further investigation will show if there was any other persons involved in these irregularities.</p>

<p>ICTY Appeals Chamber postpones release of six Bosnian Croats</p>	<p>Herceg Bosna Radio, FTV, RTRS, Oslobođenje pg 3 'Temporary release of Prlic and others postponed', Dnevni Avaz pg 2 'Prlic, Stojic, Praljak, Petkovic, Coric and Pusic remain in custody', Dnevni List pg 3 '6 Croats remain in detention', mentioned on cover, by I. Glibusic, Slobodna Dalmacija last pg 'Pre-trial release for 6 Croats postponed' by H. Vecernji List pg 11 'Croats from BiH in illegal detention', mentioned on cover, by Z. Bajt, HINA – A bench of three Appeals Chamber judges of the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (ICTY) on Tuesday stayed the orders previously issued by Trial Chamber I on the provisional release of Jadranko Prlic, Bruno Stojic, Slobodan Praljak, Milivoj Petkovic, Valentin Coric and Berislav Pusic, the ICTY said on Wednesday. The order was signed by judge Mehmet Guney on August 10, the ICTY said adding that Judge Guney signed the order on behalf of Judge Meron and Judge Pocar, who were away from the Tribunal but who had been consulted and who had agreed with the decision. The bench's order follows on an application by the prosecution, on 5 August, to be granted leave to appeal against the Trial Chamber's Orders on the provisional release of the six accused Bosnian Croats, the tribunal said. The bench considered that <i>"the objective of the prosecution's appeal could be significantly impaired if the action against which the prosecution seeks to appeal will have already been taken."</i> On Monday 9 August, Trial Chamber I rejected the prosecution's motion for a stay. However, the prosecution had meanwhile filed their application for leave to appeal, which led to the Appeals Bench's order of 10 August. The ICTY indicted the six Bosnian Croat political and military leaders in April for crimes against humanity, violations of the laws and customs of war and harsh violations of the Geneva Conventions. The crimes were committed during the persecution of Bosnian Muslims in the territory controlled by the Croatian Defence Council between late 1991 and April 1994. The six men voluntarily surrendered to the tribunal on April 5 and entered a non-guilty plea to all counts of the indictment a day later.</p>

<p>John McNair rejects accusations by lawyers</p>	<p>Dnevni Avaz cover page 'John McNair rejects accusations by lawyers', pg 9 'McNair: We work in cooperation with and under instructions of Chief Prosecutor' – After initial hearings and entering pleas in cases of Ante Jelavic and Asim Fazlic, the lawyers have been expressing their dissatisfaction with a way in which the international prosecutors and judges are working in BiH. They believe that the internationals in the BiH Court and Prosecution Office do not act in accordance to BiH laws when it comes to filing the indictments and deciding on appeals being submitted by lawyers. BiH State Prosecutor John McNair and BiH Court Judge Branko Peric dismiss these accusations saying that the lawyers are prisoners of the traditional legal forms and do not actually understand the nature of the new legislation.</p>

Dedic</u> – regarding the news that the FBiH Supreme Court has abolished the verdict to Ivan Bender and Mario Boras, who were found guilty by the Cantonal Court in Mostar in the 'Hotel Ero' case, DL carries Josip Muselimovic, Bender's lawyer, as saying that he, as his legal representation, is yet to receive the decision. According to DL's sources close to the FBiH Supreme Court, the (Cantonal) Court in Mostar made a mistake in passing a sentence to verdict to Bender, which was higher than the one stipulated by the then law.</p> <p>An inset under headline 'Individuals have to bear certain consequences' carries Bender as saying that the decision has been taken and that he is awaiting a written confirmation. <i>"This course of events puts things into proper places, and the people who complicated the things, I think they should bear certain consequences".</i></p>

<p>NN op-ed on BiH lawsuit against SCG</p>	<p>Nezavisne Novine op-ed pg 7 'Bargain on character of war' by <u>M. Cubro</u> – The author makes a reference to the most recent proposal of Vuk Draskovic, SCG Foreign Minister, who proposed withdrawal of all lawsuits and establishment of Fund for reparations for victims of war in former Yugoslavia instead, as well as statement by Boris Tadic, who actually backed this initiative. The author speculates that officials of SCG are aware their lawyers would dispute the arguments of the confronted party and therefore suggest out-of-court settlement. The author further expresses surprise over the fact that no other BiH official except Borislav Paravac has reacted or responded to this initiative, especially referring to Sulejman Tihic. According to him, the silence might mean they accept these terms. The author concludes that the acceptance of Draskovic's terms would bring good to all those preachers of people: Serbs because lawsuit would be dropped, and Bosniaks because they would be compensated for what many claim would be an indirect admittance of guilt of SCG.</p>

The team has exhumed the total of 59 bodies, including bodies of 18 children..</p> <p>Savo Stbac, the Head of Documentation-Information Centre "Veritas", rejected claims that mortal remains of 18 children exhumed in Sijekovac were children from Vukovar. He stressed: <i>"Veritas has registered only 26 children who went missing during the war in Croatia, including both "Oluja" and "Bljesak" actions. Only couple of children went missing in Vukovar'."</i></p>

<p>Professors Muratovic, Zepic support organizing country into three republics</p>	<p>Herceg Bosna Radio, Oslobođenje pg 9, mentioned on cover 'BiH of three republics!?', HINA – Organizing BiH into three republics would be very effective and functional, former BiH Prime Minister and former BiH Ambassador to Croatia Hasan Muratovic has said. "It would be easier to build the state of BiH on the model of three republics since there would be consensus for such a model," Muratovic said in a debate on constitutional changes in BiH, which Hercegovacka Television aired on Tuesday evening. Muratovic, who was recently elected head of the university in Sarajevo, is considered one of the most influential officials of the Party of Democratic Action (SDA). He was the first Bosniak official after the 1990s war to support organizing BiH into three republics. Muratovic said such a model had been considered also by the Commission for Constitutional Changes which operates within the Sarajevo Centre for Security Studies under the auspices of the international community and of which he is a member. The commission, which is tackling the future organization of BiH, is comprised of 15 experts, five from each of BiH's three constituent peoples – Croats, Bosniaks and Serbs. Professor Bozo Zepic, a Croat member of the commission who proposed the three republics' model, said in the same TV programme that under his concept BiH would be comprised of the Republic of Bosnia, whose capital would be either Tuzla, Zenica or Travnik, the Republic of Bosanska Krajina, with Banja Luka as the capital, and the Republic of Hercegovina, with Mostar as the capital. Zepic said the republics could have a national prefix, Bosniak for the Republic of Bosnia, Serb for the Republic of Bosanska Krajina, and Croat for the Republic of Hercegovina, but added that in his opinion the prefixes were unnecessary.</p>

<p>Muratovic: I do not stand for three republics in BiH</p>	<p>Dnevni Avaz pg 4 'I did not advocate for three republics in BiH' – In a statement for the daily, Hasan Muratovic denied media reports he had said in Hercegovacka TV program that the BiH structure with three republics in it was and efficient and functional solution. According to Muratovic, establishment of three republics in BiH was actually a proposal made by professor Bozo Zepic, while he (Muratovic) was standing for introduction of the BiH state structure based on municipalities.</p>

<p>DL interview with member of BiH Election Commission Lidija Korac</p>	<p>Dnevni List, pgs 6-7 ‘Diaspora should not vote in local elections’, by <u>Danka Polovina-Mandic</u> – in an interview with DL, a member of the BiH Election Commission, Lidija Korac, agrees with the journalist’s claim that the BiH Diaspora should not be voting in the local elections in October, because the local elections are about issues pertaining to life of local communities. <i>“In that direction, the Election Commission will after the elections send the BiH Parliament a proposal how to change certain issues”</i>, says Korac, believing that the Diaspora should instead elect its representatives into legislative powers, foremost to the entity and state parliaments, who could in turn represent their interests.</p>
<p>PDP says SNSD supports Tihic’s initiatives</p>	<p>Dnevni List, pg 18 ‘SNSD supports Tihic’s initiatives’, <u>not signed</u>, Dnevni Avaz pg 2 ‘Abolishment of RS is a political goal of SNSD’ – the PDP claims that SNSD’s representatives in the Council of Peoples of the RS have supported Sulejman Tihic’s initiatives regarding constitutionality of the RS laws on anthem, coat of arms, flag, territorial organization and holidays. <i>“By doing that, the SNSD has openly sided with Tihic and showed that it advocated for the RS only declaratively, whilst in reality it’s political aim is the abolishment of it”</i>.</p>

<p>DL on sending BiH troops to Iraq</p>	<p>Dnevni List, pg 2 'Will BiH soldiers go to Iraq?', by <u>Jurislav Petrovic</u> – carries an op-ed regarding the announcement that BiH soldiers will be going to a peace mission in Iraq . The author criticizes the decision of the BiH Presidency saying the decision comes during the ongoing military reforms, in a situation when the EU is yet to give its blessing to it although BiH wants to become a member of the EU, in a situation when the armed forces in BiH are still made of components and very, very poor. Moreover, the author puts the whole story into perspective of possible terrorist attacks in BiH in case of BiH sending its troops to Iraq , having in mind that several countries are withdrawing their troops.</p>

<p>Belgrade University professor Cavoški on HR Ashdown</p>	<p>Vecernje Novosti pg 6 'New type of colony' by <u>Kosta Cavoški</u> – This is a sort of feuilleton (part 1 today) signed by <u>Kosta Cavoški</u>. (NOTE: Professor Kosta Cavoški, an eminent Yugoslav law scholar, holds Ph.D. from Harvard University . He is full professor of Theory of Law at University of Belgrade . President of the International Committee for the Truth About Radovan Karadzic.</p> <p>Professor Cavoški obtained his master's degree having defended a thesis wherein, for the first time in Serbian, he provided a coherent and thoroughly affirmative survey of the origins and functioning of the American constitutional and legal system as the most distinguished model of liberal law and politics. He is one of 38 RS Senators. RS Senate was established shortly after the war.)</p> <p>The author claims that in 1996, the new type of colonial administration in the character of High Representative has been established in BiH. He claims HR's powers are vast, questioning written documents on which he relies on. He notes that when HR does not have grounds for his future actions in Dayton Agreement, he reaches for powers stipulated in Bonn and Madrid Conferences (held in December 1997 and December 1998 respectively). He disputes the authority of any conference or PIC to authorise a foreigner (High Representative) to perform removals and dismissals in the formally established state. He concludes the usurpation of authority is on in BiH, since not a single signatory of the Dayton Agreement or any legitimate international organisation has not authorised the conferences mentioned above to allocate dictatorship-like authorities to any international official in BiH.</p>

**Destiny of
banks under
provisional
administration**

BHTV – Provisional Administrator of Hercegovacka Banka, **Toby Robinson** said that destiny of the Bank will be solved together with the ERONET's one and at the same time she announced soon conclusion of the case of Privredna Banka Srpsko Sarajevo, which was also put under temporary management after the SFOR's action. According to BHTV1 information, Privredna Banka will soon lose its licence to work. This bank has been placed under temporary management in March, when the major shareholder, **Momcilo Mandic** was placed on USA black list, because of suspicion of helping the war criminals. First Temporary Manager of this bank was receiving threats, because of which he resigned, after which High Representative appointed Toby Robinson to replace him. Robinson said that at this time they are going through the documentation, after which they will determine are there any evidence to be sent/forwarded to State Prosecutor. As for Hercegovacka Banka, Toby Robinson said that she is still optimistic about its sale, regardless the resignation of **Ivica Todoric**, who is one of the most influential Croat's businessman and member of "Ledo" Consortium.

FTV – Provisional Administrator of Privredna Banka Srpsko Sarajevo and Hercegovacka Banka **Toby Robinson** has denied that her role in revisions of these Banks is of political nature, saying that her role is strictly of professional nature, but that the fact is that HB has not been sold yet. Toby Robinson also said that irregularities in PB Srpsko Sarajevo are typical for BiH banking sector. She refused to comment on claims of High Representative that PB money has been used in financing of war criminals, but the reporter has mentioned the fact that according to the order of BiH Prosecutor the employees of Mank Oil have been arrested, as well as the fact that this Company is controlled by **Momcilo Mandic**. *"I really can't comment on that, that is the matter of State Prosecutor"*, said Robinson.

<p>DL says Rama Hydro Power-plant could collapse</p>	<p>Dnevni List, pg 5 'Possible collapse of system in Rama Hydro Power-plant', mentioned on front, by <u>Vera Soldo</u> – reads that the outflow of water through the basic outlet of the Rama Hydro Power-plant, which was never used before, could be a big threat to the power-plant, and in the worst case scenario it could result in the collapse of the system in the Rama power-plant. According to the FBiH Chief Waterworks Inspector, Nada Galic, the order of the competent FBiH Ministry, which orders the power-plant to release 25 cubic metres of water per second, is aimed at maintaining the biological minimum of the Neretva river south of Jablanica, and has nothing to do with the so-called tourist quota of the Jablanica lake. Galic confirms that there are damages on the Rama power-plant, noting that the outflow will be stopped on Monday when an expert team will visit the power-plant, inspect it and take conclusions. In an inset entitled 'Ashdown without personal engagement in HE Rama case', Galic says that the High Representative for BiH, Paddy Ashdown, <i>"stated at our last meeting that his participation should not be considered as his personal engagement and that he expected that all the problems should be solved in accordance to the law and international contracts. It is also a fact that he received a letter from the Head of Konjic Municipality, which requests that the tourist quota be secured and he organized the meeting because of him"</i>.</p>

<p>Update to protests of farmers, agricultural producers</p>	<p>Dnevni List, front and pg 6 'Blockade of institutions of international community', <u>not signed</u> – The Association of agricultural producers/farmers of BiH is optimistic regarding the application of the Law on amendments to law of customs tariff of BiH. According to the Association's President, Vladimir Usorac, even if the implementation of the law does not start on August 17, there will be no blockades of border crossings and roads, instead there will be blockades of institutions of the IC, since the BiH Council of Ministers and BiH Parliament did what was in their competence, and now the IC has to verify everything. Furthermore, the Association of BiH farmers has postponed the protests that were announced for today. The Association's President, Ranko Bakic, says the Association got assurances that the law would be applied as of August 17. According to Halilovic, this Ministry will take all necessary measures to make possible for BiH students in Austria to continue to study according to previous conditions.</p>
<p>Law on anti-money laundering activities</p>	<p>Glas Srpske, cover page story 'Penalty amounts 200,000 KM' by <u>D. V. M.</u> – BiH Law on preventing money laundering will come in force in December this year and will be implemented by the Financial-Intelligence Department of SIPA. Provisions of the Law, among other, foresee penalties amounting up to 200,000 KM, more complicated procedure of money transactions and investigations under the supervision of the Prosecutor's Office. As in accordance with the new Law, banks will be obliged to deliver data on every suspicious transaction to the Financial-Intelligence Department, as well as data on cash payments amounting more than 30,000 KM. ITA is obliged to notify the Financial-Intelligence Department on every transfer of cash or state securities in the amount of/or more than 10,000 KM to foreign countries.</p>

<p>BHTV: Existence of Al- Qaeda in BiH?</p>	<p>BHTV – According to military-intelligence analysts the claims that more than 700 Al-Qaeda fighters are being prepared in BiH for future terrorists’ actions, make no sense. Domestic Authorities admit that BiH has a problem with terrorism, but they say that BiH still does not represent a threat to anyone. Agency of United Press International published information saying that Al-Qaeda is spreading, claiming that more than 700 of its fighters are being prepared for terrorist acts in BiH. <i>“The claim that in BiH exist 700 potential or real members of Al-Qaeda is totally senseless. It is most likely that whole Al-Qaeda hasn’t got 700 members in the World...”</i>, said Zoran Kusovac, Military- Intelligence Analyst of British Institute “Jane’s Geopolitical”. Domestic authorities do not deny the fact that BiH has a problem with terrorism, but they consider that to be one of the consequences of the war.</p>

<p>Blockade of Islamic Humanitarian Organizations' accounts</p>	<p>FTV – According to information from sources close to investigators over KM 30 million have been frozen on the accounts of Islamic Humanitarian Organizations in BiH. This information speaks about eight Organizations and some personal accounts have been frozen too. This information has been kept secret for a long time and according to sources (of FTV) the amounts on personal accounts have exceeded KM 1.5 million (personal accounts belong to employees of these eight Organizations). These eight Organizations have been placed on USA list of those who are helping the terrorists (USA Ministry of Finances has brought this decision).</p>

UPI carried **Marinko Jurcevic**, a BiH Prosecutor, as saying: *"We have exchanged information about possible terrorist activities in BiH for years already. All investigations are based on the list of some 750 people who came to BiH to fight, but instead, they were trained for terrorist activities"*. UPI also reported that western intelligence are actively searching through BiH looking for Islamic terrorists. Their efforts grew bigger after reports that **Khalid Sheik Mohammed**, a man considered as the brains behind the 9/11 attacks on the US , was in BiH during the war.
