Professors Muratovic, Zepic support organizing country into three republics

mentioned on cover 'BiH of three republics!?', HINA – Organizing BiH into three republics would be very effective and functional, former BiH Prime Minister and former BiH Ambassador to Croatia Hasan Muratovic has said. "It would be easier to build the state of BiH on the model of three republics since there would be consensus for such a model," Muratovic said in a debate on constitutional changes in BiH, which Hercegovacka Television aired on Tuesday evening. Muratovic, who was recently elected head of the university in Sarajevo, is considered one of the most influential officials of the Party of Democratic Action (SDA). He was the first Bosniak official after the 1990s war to support organizing BiH into three republics. Muratovic said such a model had been considered also by the Commission for Constitutional Changes which operates within the Sarajevo Centre for Security Studies under the auspices of the international community and of which he is a member. The commission, which is tackling the future organization of BiH, is comprised of 15 experts, five from each of BiH's three constituent peoples -Croats, Bosniaks and Serbs. Professor Bozo **Zepic**, a Croat member of the commission who proposed the three republics' model, said in the same TV programme that under his concept BiH would be comprised of the Republic of Bosnia, whose capital would be either Tuzla, Zenica or Travnik, the Republic of Bosanska Krajina, with Banja Luka as the capital, and the Republic of Hercegovina, with Mostar as the capital. Zepic said the republics could have a national prefix, Bosniak for the Republic of Bosnia , Serb for the Republic of Bosanska Krajina , and Croat for the Republic of Hercegovina , but added that in his opinion the prefixes were unnecessary.

Belgrade University professor Cavoski on HR Ashdown

He is one of 38 RS Senators. RS Senate was established shortly after the war.) The author claims that in 1996, the new type of colonial administration in the character of High Representative has been established in BiH. He claims HR's powers are vast, questioning written documents on which he relies on. He notes that when HR does not have grounds for his future actions in Dayton Agreement, he reaches for powers stipulated in Bonn and Madrid Conferences (held in December 1997 and December 1998 respectively). He disputes the authority of any conference or PIC to authorise a foreigner (High Representative) to perform removals and dismissals in the formally established state. He concludes the usurpation of authority is on in BiH, since not a single signatory of the Dayton Agreement or any legitimate international organisation has not authorised the conferences mentioned above to allocate dictatorship-like authorities to any international official in BiH.

Destiny of banks under provisional administration

BHTV – Provisional Administrator of Hercegovacka Banka, Toby Robinson said that destiny of the Bank will be solved together with the ERONET's one and at the same time she announced soon conclusion of the case of Privredna Banka Srpsko Sarajevo, which was also put under temporary management after the SFOR's action. According to BHTV1 information, Privredna Banka will soon lose its licence to work. This bank has been placed under temporary management in March, when the major shareholder, Momcilo Mandic was placed on USA black list, because of suspicion of helping the war criminals. First Temporary Manager of this bank was receiving threats, because of which he resigned, after which High Representative appointed Toby Robinson to replace him. Robinson said that at this time they are going trough the documentation, after which they will determine are there any evidence to be sent/forwarded to State Prosecutor. As for Hercegovacka Banka, Toby Robinson said that she is still optimistic about its sale, regardless the resignation of Ivica **Todoric**, who is one of the most influential Croat's businessman and member of "Ledo" Consortium. **FTV** – Provisional Administrator of Privredna

Banka Srpsko Sarajevo and Hercegovacka Banka Toby Robinson has denied that her role in revisions of these Banks is of political nature, saying that her role is strictly of professional nature, but that the fact is that HB has not been sold yet. Toby Robinson also said that irregularities in PB Srpsko Sarajevo are typical for BiH banking sector. She refused to comment on claims of High Representative that PB money has been used in financing of war criminals, but the reporter has mentioned the fact that according to the order of BiH Prosecutor the employees of Mank Oil have been arrested, as well as the fact that this Company is controlled by Momcilo Mandic. "I really can't comment on that, that is the matter of State Prosecutor", said Robinson.

UPI writes that the network that is hunting down Al Qaeda operatives is expending and that more than 700 people, who allegedly came to BiH to fight against the Serbs were in fact carrying out terrorist training. UPI carried Marinko Jurcevic, a BiH Prosecutor, as saying: "We have exchanged information about possible terrorist activities in BiH for years already. All investigations are based on the list of some 750 people who came to BiH to fight, but instead, they were trained for terrorist activities". UPI also reported that western intelligence are actively searching through BiH looking for Islamic terrorists. Their efforts grew bigger after reports that Khalid Sheik Mohammed, a man considered as the brains behind the 9/11 attacks on the US , was in BiH during the war.
