C., FENA - ICTY indictee Milan Lukic, who was arrested in Buenos Aires two days ago, accepted to be transferred to The Hague Tribunal, and only fears extradition to Serbia where supposedly his life would be at risk, Argentinean media reported. The local news agency "Telam" reported citing unnamed judicial sources that Lukic said that he fears that someone could kill him in Serbia, but did not say who could do this. "I know a lot about the events during the war in the former Yugoslavia. Many do not wish to see this information surface and fear that I might speak. My brother, who did not participate in the war, was killed in front of his family, and you can only image what dangers threaten me", Lukic said. The Argentinean court earlier approved Lukic's transfer to the Hague Tribunal, which has indicted him for war crimes and crimes against humanity in BiH. Lukic confessed before the court that he entered Argentina with a false passport on the name of Goran Dukanovic, B92 reported.

For 117 persons the ICTY sent a reply with label B and this means that submitted evidence is not enough for grounded suspicion about serious violation of the international humanitarian law, while the reply with label C arrived for 89 persons. VL says that all cases that the ICTY did not analyse will be forwarded to the BiH Prosecution.

Reminding that the return process is now primarily being managed by BiH authorities, Brkic confirmed that OHR received a letter from Chair of refugee and displaced persons Associations Union Mirhunisa Zukic, sent on behalf of 90 local associations of refugees, DPs and returnees from BiH , Croatia and Serbia-Montenegro. They are asking HR to engage in de-blocking the return process in the region as well as organisation of conference on sustainable return process.

**BiH Minister** Pink Dragana Erjavec – BiH Minister for Human Rights and Refugees Mirsad for Human Kebo is going to meet with the High Rights and Representative Paddy Ashdown during **Refugees Mirsad** Kebo to meet this week, in order to sign initiative with the HR for intervene fund for sustainable return. The International Community, as well as international organizations, would allocate the means to the fund. The aim of the fund is to support those who have returned to their homes, but who have no means to make their living. "The fund would be used for purchase of agricultural machinery, cattle and other things which would enable people living", said Kebo. According to Kebo, BiH has no means necessary for having such fund established.

SB on 'conflict' between foreign and domestic judges and prosecutors Slobodna Bosna pgs 18-22 'Foreigners leave BiH judiciary in a stampede' by Adnan Buturovic - Following several departures of the foreign judges/prosecutors from the BiH judiciary in the past several months, SB carries that the most recent case of the UK judge Richard Garlic, "is just one in a series of incidents which discloses the chaos in the highest judicial institution caused by the OHR and foreign judges/prosecutors." Garlick says left for purely personal reason, i.e. affair he allegedly had in BiH. US prosecutor Jonathan Schmidt [for whom SB claims failed earlier to join ICTY Prosecution] left as soon as he processed the war crimes case [against Abdulahim Maktouf] adding it in his CV. Accusing him even of fabricating the story that mujahedins threatened his life [which led to arrest of Pakistani Ahmed Istikar], magazine indicates Schmidt was incompetent prosecutor whose poor performance led to acquittals of Hasan Cengic and

former Deputy of Interpol Director, Asim Fazlic. Swedish prosecutor, Mats Mattson, reads the article, was previously employed by the OHR, who objected indictments against Lijanovici

brothers, and went back to Sweden after getting the job of Swedish State Prosecutor. SB also accused OHR of instructing the Center for Investigative Journalism to write an article accusing Rwandan judge Gerald Gahima of illegal financial transactions in his home country, which led to his departure. SB says that the main reason for "a fight" between foreign and domestic experts is money, as in 2006 their salaries will be harmonized and subject to the BiH budget. "If one compares the results of the domestic judges/ prosecutors to those of foreigners, there is a

shocking conclusion that foreign experts have done nothing,"
 says SB further giving an example of the General Crime
 Department [staffed by domestic staff] which filed over 300
 indictments and carried out in entirety about 85% of cases,
 while the Special Crime Department lead by John McNair had a
 series of failures in cases against Ante Jelavic, Senad Kobilic,
 Fazlic and Cengic. Inset carries that Chief Prosecutor, Marinko

Jurcevic, also objected the appointments of foreign judges/prosecutors to a year contract, warning McNair he will not approve any other for a less than two years. Jurcevic was supported in this by the new Register, American Michael Th. Johnson, who is allegedly in conflict with Paddy Ashdown over appointments of foreigners. According to SB's source in OHR, Johnson is not ready to appoint Ashdown's staff from OHR Legal or Anti-Corruption Departments to be downsized/closed down. Johnson believes that war crimes cases must be processed by the domestic staff, further discussing this with the key ICTY officials, BiH Court President Meddzida Kreso and Chief Prosecutor Marinko Jurcevic. "BiH Court, used until now by Ashdown for political pressures against 'disobedient' politicians, could become the highest judicial institution staffed by domestic employees," concludes the article.
