Police reforms

Police negotiations continue today in Banja Luka

PINK by Ljubisa Davidovic – Negotiations on police reform will continue in Banja Luka on Monday afternoon, and will be participated by the negotiation teams of the BiH Council of Ministers, and Governments of FBiH, RS and Brcko District, as well as the representatives of the Zenica-Doboj and Hercegovina-Neretva Cantons. This will probably be the last round of negotiations, since the final deadline for accepting all of the requirements for the start of negotiations on Stabilisation and Association Agreement is Thursday, September 15, comments the reporter adding all negotiations on police reform so far have failed to bring results. Stances of the RS negotiation team are still the same, basically not accepting the transfer of police authorities to the state level. They also refuse to accept the territorial organisation of police regions which would cross the entity border lines. Chair of BiH Council of Ministers Adnan **Terzic** deems that police reform is only acceptable if all police authorities are transferred to the state level, and if police crosses the inter-entity border line. FBIH Prime Minister Ahmet Hadzipasic stated that the requirements set by the European Commission must be accepted fully, without alternatives. However, Hadzipasic is optimistic regarding the Monday's negotiations. "I think that the common sense must win", stated Hadzipasic. Reporter commented that the negotiations on Monday must be successful, otherwise BiH can't hope for the start of negotiations on SAA soon.

No incidents during liturgy in Konjevic polje, returnee Fata Orlovic banned from leaving home during ceremony

Hadzic</u> -Over hundred police officers and members of RS Ministry of Interior have secured the liturgy served in the Serb Orthodox Church in Konjevic Polje, near Bratunac. The church was illegally built on private property and Bosniak returnee, Fata Orlovic, and has been a reason for dispute and tensions in the area. Day before the liturgy, Orlovic has surrounded with Church with wire. after which RS MoI has decided to ban her to leave the house during the ceremony. "Police arrived on [Sunday morning] and took down the fence and brought the priest in the church, while me and my family were banned to leave the house... I give them ultimatum: they have a month to take the church out of my yard, and after that [deadline] I am not sure what will happen," stated Orlovic. Despite the tensions no incidents occurred. DA reported that only few people attended the ceremony. **Oslobodjenje** pg 2 'Liturgy in Fata Orlovic's yard', mentioned on cover, by <u>A. Avdic</u> – In a statement to daily, Orlovic said that the Church will be demolished. The Chair of Bratunac Municipal Assembly, **Refik Begic**, stated that while it is most important that no incidents occurred, "as long as the issue of illegally built church is not solved, the incidents are possible in Konjevic polje." Spokesperson for PublicSecurityCenter in Bijeljina, Dragomir Peric, stated that it was police duty to provide security, "especially after the agreement was reached in the municipality." Begic denies agreement was reached amnd adds that Nedjeljko Mladjenovic, Head of Bratunac Municipality, has rejected their request to close down the church.
