<p>NATO raids company in Pale owned by Karadzic family</p>	<p><b>BH Radio 1, RHB, RS Radio</b> – NATO forces in BIH have commenced the action in Pale downtown this morning aimed at disclosing information on <b>Radovan Karadzic's</b> whereabouts. NATO spokesperson, <b>Derek Chapel</b>, stated that NATO has been searching the premises of telecommunications 'Fotomobil X' company owned by Karadzic family, and there nobody has been injured in the course of action.</p>
<p>FBiH HoP holds extraordinary session to discuss police reform</p>	<p><b>BH Radio 1</b> <u>Ljiljana Radl</u>, <b>RHB</b> – FBiH House of Peoples is to commence an extraordinary session today with only one agenda item – the discussion on the Agreement on police reform. Reporter commented that FBiH HoR has already endorsed the agreement despite very strong criticism, however the HoP's vote is uncertain due to announcements by the Croat caucus that they will not give their support.</p>

<p>OHR on SAA, future EU diplomatic presence in BiH</p>	<p><b>RS Radio</b> – At today's press conference in Banja Luka, <b>Ljiljana Radetic</b>, OHR Spokesperson, stated that OHR calls on BiH HoR to adopt Agreement on police reform at Friday's session in Sarajevo. She also said: <i>"There is a firm hope that by the end of next year the OHR could transform into an EU led mission. This could happen as early as the next elections, in October 2006. Adopting this agreement will open the way for the launch of SAA negotiations and put BiH on the road to the EU – a road already taken by Serbia and Montenegro and all the other countries in the region. The PIC last week affirmed that this process of transition is tied to actual progress in BiH, and that one clear indication to the Steering Board that BiH is indeed firmly on the road to Europe will be when it has qualified for negotiations on a Stabilisation and Association Agreement with the EU."</i></p>

<p>US Under Secretary of State Burns visits BiH, advocates for constitutional changes</p>	<p><b>RHB, Pink, BHT, Hayat, FTV, RTRS, Oslobođenje</b> cover page, pg 3 'Karadzic, Mladic and Gotovina must go to The Hague', <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 2 'The time has come for change to Dayton Constitution', mentioned on cover 'US will firmly stand behind reforms implementation', <b>Dnevni List</b>, front pg splash and pg 5 'Process of reform of Constitution begins in Washington', by <u>Mensud Zorlak</u>, <b>Vecernji List</b>, pg 3, mentioned on front 'Burns: We will dis-empower RS and Federation of BiH', by <u>Dejan Jazvic</u>, <b>Slobodna Dalmacija</b>, back pg 'Dayton is not cemented for eternity', by <u>D. Pasic</u>, <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 2, announced on cover 'BiH needs a president, premier and strong parliament' by <u>M.Cubro</u>, <b>Glas Srpske</b> pg 2 'Dayton is not cemented' by <u>N.Zelenovic</u>, <b>EuroBlic</b> RSpG 2 'Check-up of citizenship in fight against terrorism' by <u>N.B.</u> – Significant progress has been achieved in BiH in last ten years, said US Under-Secretary for Political Affairs, <b>Nicholas Burns</b> stressing the need for establishment of a stronger and more modern state through constitutional changes. <i>"Logical aim is only one President, stronger position of BiH Prime Minister and efficient State parliament, that is logical way to move forward in order to modernize Dayton Peace Agreement, that is in spirit, in accordance with DPA,"</i> said Burns at a press conference in Sarajevo on Wednesday. In the course of the day, Burns met members of BiH Presidency, BiH Council of Ministers, High Representative <b>Paddy Ashdown</b>, RS President <b>Dragan Cavic</b>, SNSD leader <b>Milorad Dodik</b> and BiH Minister of Foreign Affairs <b>Mladen Ivanic</b>. US hope that BiH politicians will have clear vision of progress by the 10th anniversary of the Dayton Peace Accords. BiH, SCG and Croatia cannot associate Partnership for Peace without <b>Radovan Karadzic</b>, <b>Ratko Mladic</b> and <b>Ante Gotovina</b> in the Hague. <i>"I was encouraged by what I have heard today from Mr. Cavic, Mr. Dodik and Mr. Ivanic that they believe that Karadzic has to surrender, they told me that, and that he has to go to the Hague and be put on trial for war crimes. I hope that in five weeks in Washington leaders of all BiH political parties, as well as three-member Presidency, that they will in written form demand from Karadzic and Mladic to surrender. That would be step forward."</i> stated Burns, adding that establishing third entity would be step back and US will not support it. Burns stated that US will not put any deadlines for all the decisions are on BiH politicians and peoples, adding that energetic fight against terrorism has to be undertaken. BiH has to revise citizenships that are given to fighters who came to BiH during the war time. Burns also met the representatives of the youth population.</p>

<p>BiH Presidency members Tihic, Paravac, BiH CoM Chair Terzic meets US Under Secretary of State Burns</p>	<p><b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 3 'To establish a commission for truth and reconciliation in BiH', <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 2 'Gratitude to BiH people (for hospitality towards US soldiers and sending troops to Iraq)', <b>FENA</b> – BiH Presidency members <b>Sulejman Tihic</b> and <b>Borislav Paravac</b> on Wednesday received a senior delegation of the United States headed by Under Secretary of State for Political Affairs <b>Nicholas Burns</b>. The meeting was also attended by BiH Council of Ministers Chair <b>Adnan Terzic</b>. Expressing sincere gratitude for the great support and engagement of the United States in preventing the war and establishing peace in BiH, Tihic, Paravac and Terzic informed Burns about the successfully implemented reforms in all important domains, by which BiH has obtained realistic chances for accessing Euro-Atlantic integration processes, according to a press release issued by BiH Presidency. The officials at the meeting once again underlined the need for bringing to justice all persons indicted for war crimes, especially <b>Radovan Karadzic</b> and <b>Ratko Mladic</b>. They also agreed that a commission for truth and reconciliation should be established in BiH. <p>Ashdown: Politicians should grab this chance!</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> cover splash ‘Politicians, grab this chance!’, pg 5 ‘We can catch up with SCG’ by <b>Sead Numanovic</b> – The HR <b>Paddy Ashdown</b> urges FBiH and State parliamentarians “not to waste time”, but to “grab the chances” and adopt the Agreement on police reform without changes by Tuesday, adding “<i>one should not wear out oneself with details and sacrifice such award.</i>” In this case, explains Ashdown, the EC would be able to say on 7 November that BiH has done everything about the police and public broadcasting reforms, followed by record 6-week timeframe needed for EU to put together a team which will negotiate with BiH. “<i>If all this happens, the EU Foreign Ministers could give green light for opening [SAA] talks on 12 December,</i>” says Ashdown. Talking about the police reform agreement, the HR points out that this reform does indeed needs five years to be implement having in mind it is to be the most expensive and the biggest reform every carried out in BiH. “<i>Already at the beginning of next year, we can start with establishment of database, making [police] cards, founding of the state forensics institute... Even though a majority of things from the Agreement have to wait September next year, some things can be done now and I don’t think we should waste time,</i>” concludes the HR stressing obstructions will not be tolerated. Inset ‘I support justice Kreso’s stance’ carries that Ashdown said he supports the stance of the BiH Court’s president <b>Meddzida Kreso</b>, who announced upcoming decrease of a number of the international judges. Inset ‘Full cooperation of RS with the ICTY’ – Talking about the meeting with the US Under Secretary for Political Affairs, <b>Nicholas Burns</b>, Ashdown said they have discussed the police reform and the cooperation with the ICTY. He pointed out that RS authorities at this moment fully cooperate with the ICTY, but more has to be done to ensure <b>Karadzic</b> and <b>Mladic</b> are in the ICTY.</p>

Zekic</b> – OHR has welcomed the passing of the agreement on police reform in FBiH Parliament’s House of Representatives, stating that they expect that FBiH House of Peoples and its Representatives will show their orientation towards Europe as well during the session on Thursday. OHR’s Spokesperson <b>Sanela Tunovic</b> stated at a press conference in Mostar on Wednesday that OHR expects all relevant bodies/politicians in BiH not to obstruct passing of this agreement, which will open doors for starting of negotiations on SAA with EU.</p>

Commending the fact police reform concept has been adopted, he hides no surprise over the fact it has come from <b>Dragan Cavic and Milorad Dodik</b>, who collaborated on its preparation. He adds by saying that since no explanation has been provided for this aspect, speculation of all sorts, especially for those curious ones, are possible.</p>
<p>HDZ's Madunic: Agreement on police divides BiH in two where there is no room for Croats!</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 'Agreement on police divides BiH in two where there is no room for Croats!' by <u>M.K.</u> – Head of the HDZ Caucus in the Federation of BiH House of Representatives <b>Ivan Madunic</b> stated that HDZ would not support the agreement on the police restructuring and he added: <i>'Between the lines of the agreement one can see an absolute wish and willingness to preserve the RS and the division of BiH in 2 parts is impossible since in that case there is n room for Croats.'</i> He added that in the whole story the most dangerous is an open game, which says: 'The RS is not questionable in spite of what all others think'. He added that HDZ was against the agreement also because there have been attempts to find the solution for the police reform for a year, however, all these attempts failed because of obstruction of Serb politicians.</p>
<p>Cardinal Puljic: Croats deprived of their rights</p>	<p><b>RHB, Dnevni List</b> pg 5 'Catholics in BiH faced with extermination' by <u>NINA</u> – Cardinal <b>Vinko Puljic</b> at his speech in Vatican stated that BiH Catholics are faced with some kind of extermination. He further commented that BiH became an IC's protectorate in which Catholics are deprived when language and religious rights are in question as well as the right to return to their homes. Puljic stated that the IC supports arrogance of Muslim's majority, adding that the result of such politics is the fact that young Catholic families are leaving BiH, reported Catholic World News.</p>



<p>HDZ's Lozancic, Covic urge constitutional changes at public discussion: If RS survives, HDZ will not give up on third entity</p>	<p><b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 8 'BiH – the country of dissatisfied' by A.O. – Talking at the HDZ public discussion held in Sarajevo on Wednesday, FBiH President <b>Niko Lozancic</b> said that the constitutional changes must be introduced in BiH and added not only Croats were dissatisfied with the current situation: <i>"If one country has this many dissatisfied people, than something is wrong. Than, we need more just country."</i> HDZ leader, <b>Dragan Covic</b>, addressed about 100 gathered citizens and presented them with the HDZ's concept of the constitutional changes. HDZ is in favor of three levels of authorities, but Covic stressed that most of Croats would be happy with only state and local authorities. However, Covic said that there was no chance that the RS could be abolished. <i>"They received message from US, Britain and even Brussels that there will be no erasing of borders if they accept police reform,"</i> Covic said and underlined Croats will not give up on third entity if RS also survives. HDZ also advocates for the establishment of another two state ministries, of agriculture and education, and propose the abolishment of the House of Peoples deeming this institution is inadequate to protect anybody's rights. Daily comments HDZ has no clear concept, and its only strong stance is opposition to RS existence.</p>
<p>Danas: Germany warns Covic to drop the 3<sup>rd</sup> entity story</p>	<p><b>Danas</b>, pgs 14-17, mentioned on front 'Drop the story about third entity', by <u>Zvonimir Jukic</u> – Reports that a junior delegation of Federal Republic of Germany visited the HDZ HQ in Mostar on October 6 when it clearly warned the HDZ President, <b>Dragan Covic</b>, to give up the story on establishment of a third, Croat entity in BiH. <u>Jukic</u> underlines that the very fact that a junior delegation visited the HDZ shows that official German policy, like the rest of the EU, believe that the current HDZ is an unacceptable partner due to the fact that the HDZ leader is a person charged with criminal acts. Inset 'Escape from isolation through entity' argues that the current HDZ leadership led by Covic is using the story about the third entity in order to regain the electorate's trust, and on top of it, Covic wants to use the third entity issue as an excuse for charges that are pressed against him.</p>

<p>BiH in the EU – How and When round-table discussion held in Sarajevo</p>	<p><b>Hayat, Oslobođenje</b> pg 7 'Talsk on SAA (to start) at the end of the year' – 'BiH in the EU – How and When' was the subject of the round table, held at the Sarajevo University's School of Economy on Wednesday. The participants were addressed by Deputy Head of EC Mission to BiH, <b>Renzo Daviddi</b> who said that real work was ahead of BiH. Daviddi stated that process of decision-making in BiH was too slow and that the police reform, as one of the conditions for the association with the EU, was just a part of the job that needed to be done. Daviddi said that it was more important for BiH to focus on the reforms themselves and their quality than on the date of its accession to EU. Daviddi sees pretty different political vision of BiH among politicians as one of the big obstacles on that road.</p>

Inset in DL 'Mandate marked with removals' comments on the tenure of High Representative, <b>Paddy Ashdown</b>, saying that the tenure has been marked with numerous impositions of laws and removals of senior officials. It concludes that due to impossibility to revise HR Ashdown's decisions, some European politicians called Ashdown the 'uncrowned king'</p>
<p>BiH HoR Deputy Speaker Raguz: DPA cannot secure building of democratic BiH</p>	<p><b>Slobodna Dalmacija</b>, pg 17 'Dayton has become weight around neck', by <b>Tomislav Zoric</b> – Carries an interview with the Deputy Speaker of BiH House of Representatives, <b>Martin Raguz</b>, who comments on the recent meeting dedicated to the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of DPA, its results and perspectives, which was organized by Foreign Policy Board of the European Parliament. Raguz says he underlined in his address that the DPA played a historic role in stopping the war, however it does not give possibilities regarding building of a democratic and European BiH. Furthermore, Raguz says that participants of the meeting realized that the DPA has become an obstacle to BiH's progress, and that there is an opinion that the Annex 4 to the DPA i.e. to the BiH Constitution, needs to be changed. In that context, Raguz says that even Minister <b>Branko Dokic</b> (PDP) stated that the Serb parties were ready to open the issue of constitutional changes.</p>

<p>BiH Minister Dokic on Brussels session about 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of DA</p>	<p><b>Glas Srpske</b> pg 5 'Srpska is not in question' by <b>SRNA</b> – Daily reports on statement <b>Branko Dokic</b>, BiH Minister of Transport and Communication, gave to SRNA regarding Brussels discussion on 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of DA. He says that Brussels session voice out the view BiH Constitution needs to be changed, noting that majority of participants assessed BiH Constitution needs to be changed in order to satisfy the criteria of Venice Commission (related to human rights). He says that constitutional changes are possible with the assent of all three peoples in BiH, noting that the concept of federalism was mostly mentioned. He also notes that session concluded use of Bonn power by HR to BiH should stop. According to him, he has pointed out some decisions of HR have jeopardized basic human rights, including autonomy of University, stressing that experts engaged by European Parliament and Venice Commission stated that the issue of RS survival must not be brought in jeopardy.</p>
<p>DA: Covic will not meet Marten/EPP's demands</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 9 'Covic will not meet Martens' demands' by <b>F.V.</b> – The HDZ spokesperson, <b>Miso Relota</b>, told daily that beside the written responded sent last week, the party will not do "<i>anything special</i>" about the objections sent by the Chair of the European People's Party, <b>Wilfred Martens</b>. Asked whether a number of requests by the strongest European group of rightist parties, including call for renewed elections of HDZ's leadership, will be met, Relota answered: "Oh, please..." At the same time, <b>Bozo Ljubic</b>, Covic's opponent at the party's elections who filed the complaint to the EPP, said that the current leadership couldn't ignore Europe's demands</p>
<p>Leaders of NHI, HSP Djapic-Juriscic meet Ambassador Vrbosic, dailies says Sanader is turning his back on HDZ BiH</p>	<p><b>Dnevni List</b>, pg 8 'Organization: Satisfy needs of Croats in all areas', by <b>NINA</b>, <b>Vecernji List</b>, pg 3 'Support of Republic of Croatia to HSP-NHI coalition', by <b>Miroslav Vasilj</b>, <b>Slobodna Dalmacija</b>, pg 21, mentioned on front 'Rightists instead of HDZ to be partners to Sanader in BiH?', by <b>Z. Zekic</b> – Leaders of HSP Djapic-Juriscic and NHI, <b>Zvonko Juriscic</b> and <b>Kresimir Zubak</b> respectively, met with the Croatian Ambassador to BiH, <b>Josip Vrbosic</b>, on Wednesday, to discuss issues pertaining to constitutional changes. HSP presented its position on the issue, which includes cantonal organization of BiH, the idea that was supported by the Ambassador. SD and VL however underline that it would appear that official Zagreb, namely the Croatian PM and President of HDZ of Croatia, <b>Ivo Sanader</b>, is turning his back on the HDZ BiH, since relations between the sister parties have gone cold. Both SD and VL notice that official Zagreb is interested in activities of the Croat opposition in BiH following the European People's Party's letter to HDZ BiH (that requests new internal party elections).</p>

<p>SDS Presidency to hold special session on Friday</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 9 'Members dissatisfied with Cavic's agreement on/concept of police reform', <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 4 'Financing of party and work of Cavic on agenda' by <u>V.P.</u> – Reporting that <b>Dragan Cavic</b>, SDS President, has scheduled SDS Presidency session for Friday in Banja Luka, daily notes referring to SDS source that agenda will include discussion on financing of party, expressing fear that HR might launch further actions and measures against SDS and its Boards. Source also notes that some members of the party close to Cavic expects that HR will reduce sanctions against SDS, owing to Cavic's involvement in police reform. Same source also adds that SDS Presidency may raise the issue of responsibility of Cavic, bearing in mind that a large number of SDS Boards, especially from east RS, is not satisfied with the RS NA decision on police reform. Hence, the SDS Boards from east RS demand issue of Cavic's culpability be analysed.</p>
<p>Danas: SDP leader Lagumdzija received US Democrats' support for his 7-point agenda</p>	<p><b>Danas</b>, pgs 32-33, mentioned on front 'Seven SDP's priorities for election victory', by <u>Marijana Malic</u> – Reports that the SDP President, <b>Zlatko Lagumdzija</b>, spoke to leaders of US Democrats, including the leader of Democrats, <b>Howard Dean</b>, during his recent visit to the US. Apparently, Lagumdzija presented SDP's 7 priorities that BiH need to fulfil in order for the country to prosper, which received the Democrats' backing. Apparently the priorities included arrest of <b>Karadzic</b> and <b>Mladic</b>; completion of defence and police reform; constitutional reforms; lowering of tax rates of basic provisions; building of Corridor Vc; fight against organized and economic crime and education reform. Danas concludes that it is clear that the Democrats will support the SDP and its partners both politically and financially in order to win next BiH elections, underlining that the pendulum, when it comes to IC's support, is swinging towards the SDP, HSS, NHI and SNSD, especially having in mind that the High Representative, <b>Paddy Ashdown</b>, will leave the country soon..</p>

SCG Minister Ljajic: There will be no extradition of war crimes suspects	<b>Vecernji List</b> , pgs 2-3 'SCG against mini-Hague', by <u>Zoran Kresic</u> – The Serbia-Montenegro Minister for Human Rights, <b>Rasim Ljajic</b> , told a group of BiH journalists that countries of former Yugoslavia would not be extraditing its citizens among each other, who would be tried for war crimes. The statement comes prior to the forthcoming meeting at the level of experts, which will take place in Mostar in second half of October and which is to discuss issues pertaining to cooperation on war crimes.
RS Govt. with NGO's urge establishment of Institute for investigation of crimes against Serbs	<b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 3 'To found Institute for investigation of crimes against Serbs' by <u>D.R.</u> – Wednesday's meeting between RS Government and several NGO's concluded that it is necessary to strengthen activities aimed at establishment of Institute for investigation of crimes committed against Serbs in BiH and a separate Commission for suffering for Serbs in Sarajevo. The RS Government's Coordination Team in charge of this issue and NGO's, dealing with issues related to suffering of Serbs during the war in BiH, agreed that the Sarajevo Commission should be working in line with the method Srebrenica Commission did.

Sarac – According to DA well-informed sources, only a few days after the agreement on the police reform had been adopted RS Minister of Interior <b>Darko Matijasevic</b> and RS Police Director <b>Dragomir Andan</b> started an offensive whose goal is undermining the FBiH MoI grounds and survival of the RS police. The source added that in order to implement this plan the two of them found like-minded persons in Ministers of Interior and Police Commissioners of the Cantons with the Croat majority (DA describes that as '<i>exponents of the politics that aspires to bring back in life the so-called Herceg Bosna</i>') and their meeting held in Mostar two days ago should be seen in this context. According to the source, it is not coincidence that the host of this meeting was the Herzegovina-Neretva Canton Minister of Interior, <b>Tomislav Martinovic</b>, since during the sessions of the Police Reform Commission he supported the Matijasevic's stand to preserve the current situation in the police area.
