	Radovanovic said that this is a "matter of
	consensus of the 26 NATO member-countries."
	He added that the decision will probably be
	known before the Summit, and that there is a
	possibility that it will be negative.
	Radovanovic also met with the EU High
	Representative for the Security and Foreign
	Policy Javier Solana, whom he told that BiH
	is interested in the EU taking over the peace
	mission in BiH from SFOR adding however that
	"it is in the interest of BiH for the
	security to remain at the present level."
