**Brussels conference on constitutional changes**

<p>Media: Brussels conference ends without concrete or significant conclusions</p>	<p><b>BHT 1</b> by <u>Elvir Bucalo</u> – The three-day talks on constitutional changes in BiH have ended in Brussels without achieving any significant convergence of views between the participating leaders of eight political parties. The most disputed issues are the authorities of the Council of Ministers in the context of Euro-Atlantic integration, whether to have a president or a presidency, and the powers and structure of parliament. The Venice Commission's remarks have been adopted in the area of human rights and rights covering the election of political representatives, and agreement has been reached that the future state government consist of 11 ministries, including a new ministry for European integration. Reporter comments that if the authorities want new or changed Constitution to be in effect by the next elections, changes have to be agreed by mid December. <b>PINK</b> by <u>By Dragica Tojagic</u> – PINK comments that the meeting in Brussels showed all differences between RS and FBiH parties. <b>Oslobodjenje</b> cover splash, pg 3 'Agreement reached only on human rights' by <u>A. Kresic</u> – Dailies also comment that the political leaders came to Brussels with very different visions on the constitutional changes. <b>FTV</b>, <b>Hayat</b> – New negotiations on constitutional changes will be organized by American Institute for Peace and they will be held in Washington on November 21<sup>st</sup>. <b>RHB</b>, <b>RTRS</b> by <u>Nada Arlov</u> – Representatives of political parties stressed that they negotiated without any external pressures; RTRS reporter comments that the time could be the pressure, because the constitutional changes procedure in the BiH Parliament should start until the mid-December, and the laws should be adopted by the April 1<sup>st</sup> 2006, 170 days before the general elections.</p>

<p>Hays: It is success party even talked about changing Constitution</p>	<p><b>PINK</b> by By Dragica Tojagic– Former PDHR, <b>Donald Hays</b> from American Institute for Peace said that stances on principal issues got somewhat closer in Brussels and he expressed hope that concrete agreements and results will be achieved till December; emphasising that agreement will be searched in frame of the Dayton, because there is still fear from the past. <b>BHT 1</b> – Hays added: <i>“Clearly, if they miss that date [mid December], the next government will be formed at the basis of the present Constitution, including all of its weaknesses. When there will be the chance for the process continuation? Not before the new Government is established, this could be 18 months or two years after that.”</i> <b>Hayat, RHB, Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 ‘It is success even to talk about changing Constitution’, <b>Glas Srpske</b> cover pg splash ‘Bosniaks prefer regions’ by <u>Z.Markovic</u>– Hays stated that even the fact that leaders of BiH political parties met in Brussels to discuss changes to the BiH Constitution for the first time in ten years could be considered as a success. <b>RTRS, HTV1</b> – Hays stated that participants in Brussels talks have reached agreement in principle on state authorities regarding the talks on the SAA with EU. <b>FTV</b> – Hays has expressed optimism: <i>“In general, we have gone trough all these issues with them and they were very constructive and sought consensus.”</i></p>

<p>Cavic: RS finds its unacceptable for FBiH to threat Dayton order an obstacle</p>	<p><b>RHB</b>– SDS and RS President <b>Dragan Cavic</b> stated that BiH political parties have opposing opinions on the future BiH constitutional organisation. The key difference is that Sarajevo and Mostar-based parties use every opportunity to propose solutions which are not in accord with entity constitutional order, added Cavic. He believes that representatives of RS parties offered constructive solutions, entirely in line with the Dayton Constitution. <b>BHT 1, FTV, RTRS</b> – Cavic said: <i>"Parties residing in Sarajevo, i.e. Bosniak and Croat political parties treat the Dayton-based, entity-organized constitutional order as a serious obstacle, suggesting it's essential changes. RS representatives find this unacceptable and impossible."</i> <b>RTRS</b>by <u>Nada Arlov</u> – Some of the participants simply did not want any kind of solution to be reached; those are the politicians who count on an IC pressure to help them achieve their goals, explained Cavic. <i>"Bosniak and Croat politicians simply wanted to use this opportunity and to 'derive' the violation of the entity constitutional order from those talks"</i>, added Cavic. <b>Glas Srpske</b> cover pg splash 'Bosniaks prefer regions' by <u>Z.Markovic</u>, <b>Vecernje Novosti</b> pg 4 '2<sup>nd</sup> round in Washington' by <u>D.Stojakovic</u> – also carried. <b>EuroBlic</b> cover pg splash, RS pgs 2-3 'Brussels difference are transferred to Washington' by <u>Nedeljka Breberina</u> – <b>Mladen Bosic</b> confirmed that Brussels meeting brought closer stances regarding the necessity to form BiH ministry of agriculture.</p>

The problem of functioning, authority and structure of BiH Parliament has remained, including both houses. We have made very little progress in voting procedures."</i> <b>BHT 1</b> – Tihic added: <i>"Serb political parties representatives from the RS are in favor of cosmetic changes, the changes we have to make anyway, for they have been requested by the Venice Commission, for it is against the Human Rights Convention."</i> <b>HTV1, RTRS, Hayat, Oslobodjenje</b> cover splash, pg 3 'Agreement reached only on human rights' by <u>A. <p>Ivanic: If FBiH parties continue insisting on radical changes, solution is not possible</p>	<p><b>PINK</b> by <u>By Dragica Tojagic</u> – President of PDP <b>Mladen Ivanic</b> said that RS Parties have advocated for changes in line with the Dayton agreement, while FBiH parties demanded comprehensive changes. <i>“Seven days remain to see if there is a possibility to get our stances closer and to make those adjustments... and I also have to say we have expressed readiness to make solutions which will enable BiH to lead negotiations with the EU, meaning to define laws at the BiH level, but [requesting] they are implemented through institutions which in accordance with constitutional establishment of the country,”</i> said Ivanic. <b>RTRS</b> – Ivanic stressed that the Venice Commission’s remarks could be eliminated with some changes within the existing constitution. <i>“But if some parties, especially those from Sarajevo, continue insisting on radical changes to the BiH constitution... than there will be no agreement, and the solution is not possible”</i>, added Ivanic. <b>RHB</b>– Ivanic said that some progress has been achieved. <b>HTV1, Hayat, Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 ‘Halilovic: I hope US would help us out’ by <u>A.M.</u>, inset ‘Ivanic and Dodik have single stance’ – When it comes to the state and entities authorities regarding the process of European integrations, Ivanic adds that <i>“there is no problem there as no decision can be made at the state level without the representatives of the entities.”</i> <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> cover pg splash ‘No concrete agreement on Constitution’ by <u>D.Risojevic</u>, <b>Glas Srpske</b> cover pg splash ‘Bosniaks prefer regions’ by <u>Z.Markovic</u>, <b>EuroBlic</b> cover pg splash, RS pgs 2-3 ‘Brussels difference are transferred to Washington’ by <u>Nedeljka Breberina</u></p>
<p>Dodik: Others tried to minimize and bypass RS institutions, that is unacceptable</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> by <u>Nada Arlov</u> – RS politicians rejected solutions that were not in accord with European standards, stated SNSD President <b>Milorad Dodik</b>. <i>“We proposed certain solutions... but others wanted to minimize, bypass and underestimate RS institutions, by offering solutions that were totally unacceptable for us”</i>, concluded Dodik. <b>Hayat, Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 ‘Halilovic: I hope US would help us out’ by <u>A.M.</u>, Inset ‘Ivanic and Dodik share stance’– Dodik added that inexistence of coordination among State and local authorities in process of European integrations is unacceptable. <b>Oslobodjenje</b> cover splash, pg 3 ‘Agreement reached only on human rights’ by <u>A. <p>Covic says agreement reached on human rights, CoM</p>	<p><b>BHT1, FTV</b> – HDZ President <b>Dragan Covic</b>: <i>“Obviously, we haven’t reached the agreement upon the essential details, but we have reached an agreement regarding human rights issues.”</i> <b>HTV 1</b> by <u>Zeljko Korpar</u> – Covic added: <i>“We were the closest on the issue of Government – it will probably have 11 Ministries and the President or the Chairmen and we also agreed there should be parity of constitutive peoples.”</i> <b>Oslobodjenje</b> cover splash, pg 3 ‘Agreement reached only on human rights’ by <u>A. Omeragic</u> – HDZ expert, <b>Mile Lasic</b> says the changes agreed on where only cosmetic.</p>
<p>Lagumdzija: Ivanic was most radical</p>	<p><b>HTV 1</b> – SDP leader <b>Zlatko Lagumdzija</b> stressed: <i>“We have 50% chance to reach an agreement in Washington which is a huge progress in comparison with the situation 3 days ago or 10 months ago.”</i> <b>Oslobodjenje</b> cover splash, pg 3 ‘Agreement reached only on human rights’ by <u>A. Omeragic</u> – Lagumdzija added says that the most radical was <b>Mladen Ivanic</b>, who was trying <i>“to be more of the SDS official than <b>Dragan Covic</b>.”</i> <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> cover pg splash ‘No concrete agreement on Constitution’ by <u>D.Risojevic</u> – also carried Lagumdzija.</p>
<p>Halilovic: I hope US would help us out</p>	<p><b>Hayat</b>By <u>Alem Karamesic</u>– Chairman of Presidency of Party for BiH, <b>Safet Halilovic</b> said that it is a good thing that for the first time direct debate between BiH politicians was opened, without participation of international mediators. <i>“And a bad thing is in the fact that w haven’t got far in that job,”</i> said Halilovic. Closest agreement was reached on the issue of Council of Ministers, being that RS Parties have accepted the enlargement of this institution, but they are insisting on the name of CoM, rejecting any possibility that this institution could be named BiH Government. In segment of human rights there wasn’t much disagreement, except in the part which relates to Euro-Atlantic integrations. <i>“FBiH Parties have insisted on that that everything that was changed so far in Constitutions of BiH and Entities, regarding the authorities’ transfer in favour of the State...is registered in the Constitution. RS representatives naturally don’t what such a thing,”</i> said Halilovic. <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 ‘Halilovic: I hope US would help us out’ by <u>A.M.</u> – Halilovic expects better agreement to be reached in Washington: <i>“IC help would be very appreciative, and I hope that our friends, especially those from Usm, would help us to find solution.”</i> <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> cover pg splash ‘No concrete agreement on Constitution’ by <u>D.Risojevic</u> – also carried Halilovic.</p>



<p>Tokic: Talks showed there is no minimum agreement on future of the state</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 'It showed there is no minimum agreement on future of the state' by <b>FENA – President of the SDU Sejfudin Tokic</b> on Monday said that only the strong pressure from the EU and the US would ensure the implementation of constitutional changes and reaching of an agreement among the BiH parliamentary political parties. <i>"Also, SDUBiH is calling on all patriotic forces to be united in this significant moment for the future of our country and to act in direction of creating the conditions for amending the BiH Constitution, which will result in establishing a rational and efficient state structure"</i>, said Tokic.</p>
<p>EC, OHR without comments, Venice Commission expects more in Washington</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 'Majority states in process of getting closer to EU changed its constitutional structure' by <b>FENA –</b> The EC Delegation in BiH doesn't want to comment on the Brussels talks before receiving official remarks, however it has welcomed the initiative for bringing together leaders of political parties from BiH in order to reach an agreement on changes necessary in order to improve the functioning of the state, spokesperson for the EC Delegation <b>Frane Maroevic</b> told FENA. He said that the majority of countries in the process of moving closer to the EU have at some time had to change their constitutional structure in order to harmonise legislation with EU rules and laws. He said that the only way to make constitutional changes in BiH is through its institutions – the Council of Ministers and Parliament. <b>Hayat</b> – In addition to EC, Hayat says that OHR did not want to comment the talks either stressing this was a matter for domestic authorities. <b>Hayat – Tomas Market</b> from Venice Commission expects more concrete agreement in Washington on November 21<sup>st</sup>.</p>

<p>RHB int with D. Covic: I am sort of optimist when Washington talks are in question</p>	<p><b>RHB</b>– In an interview to RHB Radio, HDZ President <b>Dragan Covic</b> said that the discussions in Brussels were lead very openly. <i>“But I must say that we have not reached a mutual viewpoint which we could sign and present it to the BiH public, especially regarding the issues of BiH Presidency, Parliament and BiH Council of Ministers”</i>, stated Covic. <i>“We support – and I must say that EC, American Institute for Peace, and even the majority of BiH political parties agree with us – that the main principles must be the equality of all three peoples in BiH, the rationality in the organization of the state and the strong decentralisation”</i>, added Covic. HDZ President underlined that principles were fairly well agreed, however problems occurred when the participants started discussing the details. At the end, Covic stressed that he is moderate optimist about the continuation of the negotiations, saying that the agreement could be signed during the meeting in the USA. <b>Vecernji List</b> cover pg splash ‘Brussels failed, decision in USA’ and pg 2 ‘Brussels without results, bigger expectations from Washington’ by <u>Z. <p>BHT1 int with Tihic: Talks went below expectations</p>	<p><b>BHT 1</b> late news edition – Member of BiH Presidency, <b>Sulejman Tihic</b>, estimated for BHT that talks on constitutional changes in Brussels went below his expectations. <i>“I hope that existing differences will be reduced in Washington and that we will reach solutions that will mean more functional and efficient authorities at the State level,”</i> he said, adding that such authorities could enable BiH way into Euro-Atlantic structures. Regarding RS President <b>Dragan Cavic</b>’s accusations that political parties from FBiH want to impose solution, Tihic commented that there are different perceptions of conception of BiH internal organization between parties in RS and FBiH. <i>“Two parties from FBiH (SDA and SBiH) considers that BiH organization as a State consisted, among other organizations), of two entities, is not a good solution and that this should be changed,”</i> said Tihic. Tihic confirmed agreement on establishment of two additional ministries in CoM. Commenting on SNSD leader <b>Milorad Dodik</b> statement that FBiH parties made BiH internal organization senseless, Tihic responded that Dayton Agreement, Annex 4, done that, not FBiH parties. <i>“Organization like this, which is consequence of war happenings, is senseless. That organization has no basis in economic, traffic, historic or geographic criteria, and regions are created on such criteria,”</i> says Tihic. He underlined that meeting went without any pressures.</p>
<p>RTRS int with Radmanovic: BiH constitutional changes cannot be related to talks on Kosovo status</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> late news edition – In an interview to RTRS, <b>Nebojsa Radmanovic</b>, Chair of the SNSD Executive Board, stated that it was hard to expect anything would be signed in Brussels, especially with such opposing opinions on the constitutional changes in BiH. But some kind of progress has been made, and it is not very important that nothing has been signed yet, stated Radmanovic. <i>“This is just the beginning... The changing of the constitution is the process which cannot be completed immediately, and maybe it is a good thing – because it could lead to certain mistakes”</i>, added Radmanovic. Radmanovic sees two possible outcomes of the meeting in Washington: firstly, that Washington meeting ends with no concrete agreement, but even that would not mean that the process is over; and secondly, that agreement is reached on some aspects of constitutional changes – such as the number of representatives in BiH Parliament, or the expansion of certain CoM authorities. <i>The constitutional changes in BiH should not be linked in any way with the negotiations on the future status of Kosovo</i>”, stressed Radmanovic.</p>

RS NGOs, Veterans warn against abolishment of RS; Radicals demand special RSNA session on const. changes	<b>RTRS, Glas Srpske</b> pg 5 'Parliament before Washington' by <u>D.Mo.</u> – <b>Milanko Mihajlica</b> , President of the RS Serb Radical Party, Monday stressed it were necessary to schedule a special session of the RS NA to determine directives for RS delegation at the upcoming Washington meeting on constitutional changes. <b>RTRS</b> – Representatives of six RS NGOs founded the Initiative Board for establishing the Movement for Protection of the BiH and RS Constitutional Order. The chair of the Veterans Organization <b>Savo Cvjetinovic</b> stated that the situation is RS could become destabilized if the very survival of RS becomes questionable.

Kozina</u> says that the talks on constitutional changes held in Brussels failed and that the biggest optimists only believe that something more would be agreed upon at the Washington talks. FTV however says that '60 minutes' teams sneaked into the room during the session closed for public, where – despite opposite announcements – SDS Main Board members did vote on confidence of trust to its leader <b>Dragan Cavic</b>. **RTRS** 'Pecat' current affairs programme by Dragana Knezevic – Commenting the recent decision of the HR **Paddy Ashdown**'s decision to lift the ban on participation in public and political life made earlier against 23 persons, RTRS reporter comments that neither the reason for ban nor for the pardon were ever explained. One of people pardoned is **Dusan Beric**, former member of SDS Main Board, who said he signed a statement in OHR stating he would protect BIH Constitution, Dayton Agreement and the human rights. Beric adds that the human rights issue in the statement was somewhat ironical since he feels that his human rights were violated in the whole process. Reporter comments that a number of people who were dismissed from public functions by HR decided to file a lawsuit before the human rights Court in Strasbourg. However, now that they are pardoned, there is an issue whether the intention to submit lawsuit would be abandoned. Beric stated that the lawsuit will not be withdrawn since it would be justified to receive compensation for the period when people in question were not able to act publicly. Reporter also comments that the latest pardons drew an inevitable question of who create the list of those who were pardoned. OHR stated it doesn't comment the internal procedures. However, there are speculates that SDS Chair **Dragan Cavic** was the one who participated in creating the list to improve his status inside the party.
