SDS , SDP vote against budget; SNSD settle with 0.5 mil KM for population census methodology; DA: New parliamentary majority at the state level already clear

Dnevni Avaz pg 9 'BiH budget adopted, SDP and SDS against it' by H. Orahovac - The state budget was adopted by the BiH HoR with 26 votes of support and 10 against. Five delegates of SDS and two SDP officials voted against the budget, as well as independent members Tihomir Gligoric, Petar Kunic and Mirko Blagojevic. Out of about 30 amendments, only one was passed [proposed by SNSD] under which half of million KM will be spent to draft methodology of population census. DA comments that at first SNSD demanded 4.5 million KM for this, however after talks with Minister Ljerka Maric they were ready to support the budget. "Support of this party, and objections from SDS clearly reveal new parliamentary majority at the state level," comments the author. Nezavisne Novine cover pg splash and pg 4 'Budget amounts 955 million' by M. Cubro also carries statement of Head of SDS Caucus Momcilo Novakovic who explained everyone agrees census should be conducted by 2010 and added three years are needed to prepare the census, therefore he sees no reason who more funds for this would not be earmarked and demanded 5 million KM to be earmarked. SDS also asked defence and ITA budgets to be reduced, as well as agricultural and food industry budgets to be increased. Other delegates rejected SDS's amendments. BiH HoR adopts report on OSA activities; opposition demanded removal of confidentiality label, left the discussion

FTV – BiH House of Representatives on Tuesday also discussed the report on activities of BiH Intelligence Agency (OSA) in 2005 behind the closed doors. The secrecy of the session was a topic of the previous twohours long discussion on whether or not to maintain label "confidential" from OSA report. "Surely there is nothing confidential in that report. However, it would be a precedent which would clash with all the standards of conduct in this field, and after that the other reports would be treated in the same way", explained the Chair of the BiH Council of Ministers, Adnan **Terzic**. FTV says journalists were not the only people that had to leave the hall during the discussion on this agenda item; SDP representatives did so as well. "The reason why we left and why we do not accept to discuss it, is because a lot of things that should be in that report are not there", stated SDP President **Zlatko Lagumdzija**, stressing that the so-called "coup d'etat" affair which two years ago accused him of trying to carry out coup is just one of them. He adds that public was aware of monstrously constructed atmosphere created at the time by "spies" accusing political representatives and former HR Paddy Ashdown of orchestrating the entire case. SDP believes that this issue was deliberately avoided so that the real instigators remain unknown. According to FTV reporter, report on OSA activities reads that in last year OSA worked on disclosing crime, corruption and frauds during the privatisation process, however doesn't mention whether anyone was charged or processed for those crimes. Hayat - Prior to the discussion, both SDP and independent candidate **Tihomir Gligoric** demanded the report to be stripped of confidentiality mark, whilst SDS deputies announced that they would not even participate in discussion. FBiH HoP passed the Law on Allocation of Public Revenues proposed by GAP: Croat Caucus launches vital national interest issue	FTV - During the session on Tuesday, FBiH House of Peoples adopted the Law on the Allocation of Public Revenues, proposed by delegate Svetozar Pudaric. Second proposal, made by FBiH Government, was not even included on the FBiH HoP agenda; only HDZ representatives were for Government's instead of Pudaric's solution. According to FTV reporter, Pudaric's proposal was closest to the USAID-funded Governance Accountability Project, which says that the municipalities should receive money directly from the FBiH account; the only difference is that municipalities would now directly receive 8.42 percent instead of GAP's 6.42 percent. After the HoP adopted the Law, Croat caucus launched the issue of protection of the vital national interest. "It will not be possible to implement this law until BiH Constitutional Court decide on Croat Caucus' request", explained Pudaric. If Constitutional court decides that the Law on Public Revenues is not the vital national interest, than the text of this law will have to be harmonized with the text of the law before FBiH House of Representatives. ICTY Chief Prosecutor Del Ponte orders urgent investigation of BiH Prosecution on 20 war crime suspects?

BHT1 – During her last week's visit to Sarajevo, ICTY Chief Prosecutor Carla Del Ponte handed over several files on war crime suspects to the prosecutors of BiH War Crime Chamber. According to BHT 1 sources, Del Ponte ordered urgent investigation on 19 persons. The war crime suspects who should be subject to these investigations are: RS Army and police officers Milan Ninkovic, Andrija Bjelosevic, Milovan Stankovic, Momcilo Mandic; RBiH Army commanders Sakib Mahmuljin and Dzemal Merdan, and RBiH Army's chief of logistics Halid Cengic; HVO officers Nedeliko Obradovic and Marko Radic. Oslobodjenje cover splash, pg 3 'Quicken investigation Mahmuljin, Cengic, Obradovic, Stankovic...' by Az.Kalamujic -ICTY Prosecution submitted BiH Prosecution list of priority cases for continuation of investigations and raising charges against 15 Serbs, three Bosniaks and two Croats, 20 in total. Daily speculates on same names of indictees as BHT 1. Dnevni Avaz cover splash 'Del Ponte submitted list with 20 names to BiH Prosecutor' by E.Sarac – According to DA, Del Ponte submitted list with 20 persons to the BiH Prosecutor Marinko Jurcevic, demanding them to be priorities for investigation. DA carries the same names as Oslobodjenje and BHT1, and in addition those of Nedjeljko Rasula, Miodrag Vrzina, Jovo Banjac. DA says that as of this year, ICTY would neither carry more investigations, nor it would continue to issue approvals for processing cases before the BiH Court.

FTV: 'Fokus' to publish list of people suspected for helping Mladic; RS Police Director Andan mentioned in the report	FTV - In its Wednesday's issue, Banjaluka- based newspaper 'Fokus' will publish the list of persons who helped ICTY indictee Ratko Mladic. FTV learns that the list includes former RS Army officers, captain Branislav Puhalo from Kalinovik and colonel Milovan Stankovic, wartime commander on MountOzren. Source close to Serbian military structures confirmed for Fokus that among 50 persons allegedly informed about Mladic's whereabouts, 17 are from BiH, mostly from eastern Bosnia. Although the report of SCG Army Security Agency was declared confidential, Fokus source claims that Puhalo, Stankovic and Sasa Badnjar [Mladic's driver] will be among those indicted for helping Mladichiding. Same source emphasized the importance of counter-intelligence officers within the Mladic's support network; according to FTV presenter, one of the persons mentioned in that context was theRS Police Director Dragomir Andan who 'was either tricked, or he deliberately acted in counter-intelligence style' during recent futile operation near Zepa.

Frankfurter Rundschau op-ed on ICTY: ICTY's justice can be sped up by EU integration continued by PIFWCs arrests/extradition

Frankfurter Rundschau pg 3 'Judge in the Name of Europe' op-ed by Hans-Helmut Kohl - Commenting the work of ICTY, editorial by editor-in-chief of Frankfurt-based major left-wing daily in Germany opens quoting old saying that "hand of justice" moves very slowly, adding its speed depends not only of judges, but also of the society that yet has to accept it. Author stresses that the ICTY has to face the same prejudice that all international processes after the Nuremberg Process had faced – international legal practice was regularly based on political and military power, also known as "winner's justice". Greatest importance of ICTY, says the author, is outlined in case of **Slobodan** Milosevic and his aides, whose trials showed that no statesmen or general is exempt from punishment. He adds that other dimension is social, quoting ICTY Chief Prosecutor Carla del Ponte who said that it is impossible to write "common history" as long as the war criminals are at large. Author noted that great contribution of ICTY is that countries from the region have established their own country-based courts to trial war criminals. Pointing out the case of arresting of ICTY indictee Croatian general Ante Gotovina, editorial concludes that "hand of justice" can obviously be sped up, when EU integration process is conditioned by capturing war criminals.

BHT1- The expert commission of BiH Ministry for Transport and Communication tasked to examine the influence of planned bridge Peljesac decided that the bridge is going to disturb BiH's free access to the open sea. Namely, Croatian Government plans to build the bridge in order to connect the land with peninsula Peljesac and avoid transfer through Neum. Commission's report is going to be submitted to BiH Council of Ministers. BiH CoM should officially inform Croatian Government of BiH's stance regarding the construction of Peljesac bridge by the end of February. However, Croatia already started the preparatory work on construction of the bridge. BiH Minister ofr Transport and Communication Branko **Dokic** stated that the Ministry is going to make a proposal for different dimensions of the bridge, so that it doesn't block BiH access to the open sea. Chair of BiH CoM Adnan Terzic will visit Croatia on Wednesday. He is going to meet Croatian OPM Ivo Sanader and discuss this issue with him. Ambassador McElhaney invitea politicians to continue negotiations on constitutional changes

Hayat - US Ambassador Douglas McElhaney called upon political parties to come up with proposals on how to continue the talks on constitutional changes. Reporter comments that RS PM-designate Milorad **Dodik** is sending signals that the talks will not continue, or at least not in the form in which they were conducted so far. He says that the only solution for the RS is that the talks continue in the parliament (does not say which). SDA's **Sefik Dzaferovic** says that the talks cannot exclude BIH institutions. SDP leader **Zlatko Lagumdzija** says that negotiations of "that kind" will not be repeated. "Time has come for concrete amendments to be made on issues that can be reached by consensus", says Lagumdzija, concluding that all issues that cannot be changed by consensus will remain the same. SBIH leader Safet Halilovic feels that new solution regarding constitutional changes should be presented at next negotiations. Reporter comments that talks on constitutional changes might be influenced by new RS Government and Dodik's announcements on dismissal of Council of Ministers Chair Adnan Terzic. Dzaferovic on the other hands says that Terzic and current BiH CoM have SDA support. Reporter concludes that it seems that key issues in further processes on BiH path towards

Europe are least discussed.

BiH Prosecution denies SIPA investigation in CRA is politically motivated

FTV, Dnevni Avaz pg 8 'Information from the audit report are being checked', **Oslobodjenje** 'We will continue fight against crime' - BiH's State Information and Protection Agency has been carrying out an investigation on the Communications Regulatory Agency. Reacting to the report broadcasted at FTV's Monday news, where it was stated that BiH Prosecution and SIPA are driven by political motives regarding the investigation in CRA premises, BiH Prosecutor's Office reacted stressing that the Office works in accordance with the appropriate Laws, and is not on under nationalist, entity or any party's interests, 'as one might conclude from the FTV story'. The Prosecution added that whenever BiH Audit Agency established some irregularities, the Office acted according to regulations and urged competent institutions to gather additional information and documentation, so it could be determined if the crime has been committed or not. Therefore, says Prosecution, when BiH Audit Agency issued a report on CRA work, BiH Prosecutor's Office decided to investigate some financial irregularities that this report pointed to. "We want to emphasize that the BiH Prosecutor's Office supports the existence of state regulatory agency", reads the BiH Prosecutor's Office's statement.
