The European Parliament has adopted the Resolution on the status of regional cooperation between the Western Balkans countries, on basis of the Annual Report of the European Commission on the Stabilization and Association Process in this region.

BHT 1 Elvir Bucalo — The resolution says that the revision of the Dayton Peace Agreement is necessary, as well as the higher level of transparency in the work of the High Representative. The Parliament also concluded BiH still has not solved the key issues, adding that BiH needs urgent political initiative based on participation of all the three peoples. Welcoming a series of PIFWC's surrenders to the ICTY, the Parliament also urged RS authorities to fully cooperate with ICTY. They also requested from the authorities at all levels to do everything in their power to detain Radovan Karadzic and Ratko Mladic as soon as possible. EP appeals to the Council of Europe and European Commission to create joint strategy of control of the state border crossings, with BiH and the whole Balkans region.

GS reactions to EP resolution by SDS, SNSD, DNS, PDP, SP RS Glas Srpske cover pg splash 'Chirch is sanctity' by N.D. — Commenting the EP's Resolution on West Balkans, Nikola Spiric from SNSD, says that a call of the IC for a change of DA represents a recognition of the IC that it had made a mistake ten years ago when the Agreement was composed. Momcilo Novakovic from SDS disagrees with the assessment that existence of RS and FBiH contributes to "regional instability", adding: "Many local and international officials forget that some other European states are complicated, but it has not been an obstacle for their EU entry." Drago Kalabic from DNS, underlines that European Parliament ascertained that "all moves IC makes are aimed at constitutional reorganization of BiH at the damage of Serb people." Gavrilo Antoic from PDP says that concern European MP's expressed regarding the presence of depleted uranium is "extremely hypocritical and cynical", adding it dates from the war times, when European Parliament supported bombardment of RS. Zivko Marjanac from RS Socialist Party regards statement on HR powers as admission of mistake.

FTV, Hayat, RTRS — The European Commission expects to start the negotiations on the Stabilization and Association Agreement (SAA) with BiH in the autumn, if BiH meets the conditions on full ICTY cooperation and carries out both police and defense reforms, announced the representative of EU Enlargement Commissioner, Fabrizio Barbaso. Participating the Kran Montano Forum in Zagreb , Barbaso added that the countries of this region belong to EU and that they can become a full member state if human and minority rights are respected. Barbaso stated this at Crans Montana Forum in Zagreb on Thursday which gathered about 500 participants from 20 countries and focuses at the "European perspectives - regional cooperation".

Russians proposes transformation of OHR into EU Office in BiH

Paravac said that BiH is implementing overall reforms, just like other West Balkan countries, especially Croatia Serbia-Montenegro, for joining the EU because that is the only way towards prosperous peace in the region. Paravac and Cizov underlined good relations between the two countries and expressed optimism in terms of improvement of cooperation, especially in the field of economy, between the two countries.

They anticipate that the regional countries will become EU members in 2014 if maintain this pace. BHT 1 by Mirela Cosic — Report calls on the BiH to change its constitutional structure, in order to enter into EU. "It is clear that BiH constitution has to be [amended]", said Zlatko Lagumdzija, BiH Parliament representative who was present at the presentation. Lagumdzija added that the new High Representative in any case needs to be the Representatives of the European Union. "The new Representative will be European, representative of EU, not alike at the moment, EU and UN representative", said EU High Representative for the Foreign Security and Politics, Javier Solana. Solana added that he believes this would mean more responsibility transferred to EU. BiH minister of Foreign Affairs, Mladen Ivanic, believes that the reduction of HR's authorities would lead to strengthening of domestic institutions. He added that the constitutional changes need to be discussed once the Stabilization and Association Agreement is attained. "I believe that discussion on constitutional changes, without attaining the SAA, isn't realistic", said Ivanic.

Disabled persons still have not reached agreement with FBiH Govt; Minister announces possible partly payout

BHT 1Marina Boskovic - About 20 disabled persons from FBiH spend another night in the FBiH Government building, refusing to leave the offices until they are promised the implementation of law regulating their rights starts. "We will leave this building only when we get the solution to our problem", said President of FBiH Association of Disabled Persons **Zijad Arapcic**. The law regulating the benefits for disabled persons was adopted in 2004 at the time of the pre-election campaigns, comments BHT reporter. "Certain arrangements should be investigated in order to find out if there are some reserves which would be sufficient for paying these benefits at least partly", said Radovan Vignjevic, FBiH Minister of Labour and Social Welfare. As for the list of people who took part in the crimes in the Srebrenica area, Danas' sources in the OHR claim that the RS Interior Minister Darko Matijasevic is also on the list. HJPC says BiH Constitutional Court should be under their control

"HJPC believes that the manner in which the Constitutional Court has acted with regard to the lawsuit against Tadic demonstrates the necessity that Constitutional Court judges be put under the competence of the council and, in accordance to this, amendments and addenda to the Law on HJPC be adopted," reads a statement by the HJPC, which studied aspects of the Constitutional Court's decision at a session held on 4 April.

NN: BiH PO's investigation on involvement of Bicakcic, Covic and Alijagic in damaging budget for BAM 11 million

Nezavisne Novine pg 5, announced on cover 'Bicakcic, Covic and Alijagic suspected of having damged the budget for BAM 11 million' by M.Cubro - NN reports referring to a source at BiH Prosecutor's Office that Special Department of the BiH Prosecutor's Office for organised, economic crime and corruption is conducting investigation into the level of culpability of former officials of the F BiH Government, Edhem Bicakcic and Dragan Covic, regarding payment of BAM 11 million from budget resources without Government decision. NN collocutor notes: "Former F BiH PM Bicakcic has approved, while former F BiH finance minister Covic and his deputy Mehmed Alijagic have signed and implemented decisions on payment of over BAM 11 million to various budget users, associations and individuals from budget resources." John McNair, Head of Special Department, briefly commented: "We have previously stated that several investigations are run against Dragan Covic. We have nothing further to add."

B.Luka Basic Court passed verdict against Veselka Jeremic

Nezavisne Novine pg 3 'Three month imprisonment to Veselka Jeremic' — The Banja Luka Basic Court has sentenced Veselka Jeremic, former employee of RS Ministry of Traffic who was indicted in the same indictment along with Branko Dokic and Marko Pavic, to three months prison term and financial penalty of BAM 10 thousand. She will have to give back the amount of BAM 18,955 she had obtained illegally. According to plea bargain Jeremic reached with Prosecutor's Office, Jeremic said she would "present true testimony" before Banja Luka Basic Court in the case against Dokic and Pavic.

Feral Tribune on Alijagic case

Feral Tribune, pgs 26-27 'Republika Sudska' (sudska means judiciary's), by <u>Luko Brailo</u> - Carries a recapitulation of the Alijagic case and an interview with Salih Alijagic. Among other issues, Feral claims that the Law on postponement of execution of claims in municipalities and cities in the RS, which was adopted by the RSNA, could never be adopted without a blessing from the OHR and High Representative Paddy Ashdown, "which practically represents an attack on the constitutional order of the state". On top of this, Feral claims that both the US and Russian embassies to BiH were more than actively engaged in the lobbying pertaining to the law in question. Alijagic comments: "I am appalled with the so-called lobbying, in other words a classic pressure of the RS judiciary and BiH in general".
