RS MoI ups vehicle checks in Banja Luka area	<b>RHB</b> – Following the threats that have been discovered against the RS PM, <b>Milorad Dodik</b> , the RS MoI has upped security measures in the Banja Luka area. The RS MoI has increased vehicle checks.

<p>RS Minister Radmanovic confirms there is an assassination plot against RS PM, stressing nobody will prevent RS Govt from implementing reforms</p>	<p><b>RTRS – Nebojsa Radmanovic</b>, RS Minister of local Self-governance, has stated that nobody will prevent RS Government from implementing reform processes. He commented on information regarding assassination plot against RS Premier, <b>Milorad Dodik</b>, saying: <i>“We were aware that everybody bringing new ideas and prosperity to these people will be condemned by retrograde and criminal forces. Naturally, it was not simple to estimate that some criminal groups would be preparing to attempt assassination against Premier. The information you got hold off is true in information regard, i.e. they reached us from Belgrade. However, nothing will prevent Government from its reform orientation and efforts, especially not Milorad Dodik. We will find the way to protect both Premier and ourselves from criminals. It is in the interest of citizens. Naturally, nobody got afraid with that but it still exists.”</i></p>
<p>Ministers Kalmeta, Dokic to discuss improvement of traffic connections between BiH and CRO</p>	<p><b>RHB – Croatian Minister of Transport, Bozidar Kalmeta</b>, is visiting Sarajevo on Monday where he is to meet with his BiH colleague, <b>Branko Dokic</b>. The two ministers are to address issues pertaining to improvement of traffic connections between the two countries and construction of the Peljesac bridge.</p>

<p>SDS Convention to start and decide on participation at October elections</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> – The Convention of SDS is expected to take place in Banja Luka today, which is to decide on participation at the upcoming elections in October 2006. Convention was supposed to commence at 12:00 hrs. The session of the SDS Chair Board will take place after the SDS Convention, which is to discuss some issues of statute and party itself. SDS Presidency held session at 10:00 hrs, but there was no press statement given afterwards.</p>
<p>SIPA to interview SRS “Dr.</p>	<p><b>Srna</b> – SRS “Dr. Vojislav Seselj” has today released a press statement, saying that at 10:30 hrs on Wednesday, 17 May in Bijeljina, the SIPA will hold meeting with <b>Mirko Blagojevic</b>, President of the Executive Board of this party and delegate at the BiH HoR. Release reads that topic of the meeting may be related with war crimes committed during the past war.</p>

**RS PM target of assassination plot**

<p>Alleged preparations for assassination of RS PM</p>	<p><b>PINK</b> – RS Minister of Interior <b>Stanislav Cadjo</b> stated for TV PINK that he is in possession of certain information on alleged ongoing preparation for assassination of RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad Dodik</b>. TV PINK carries that Belgrade media reported that Serbian Minister of Interior <b>Dragan Jovic</b> informed Dodik on existence of five persons in RS that are planning to carry out the assassination.</p> <p>Cadjo said: <i>“RS MoI has certain knowledge about preparations and plans for assassinations of some individuals in RS. In this regard, we are taking certain activities and this is all that I can tell you at this point”</i>. <b>BHT1</b> – BHT1 carries that Cadjo denied that Jovic informed RS MoI on a group of people from Serbia that is in RS planning the assassination of Dodik. Cadjo confirmed that the intensive investigation is ongoing without providing any other information. Dodik refused to comment this information. <b>RHB</b> – According to Belgrade-based TV-station B92, Jovic was the one to forward this information to Dodik. RHB carries that Cadjo confirmed that RS MoI received this information. He stressed that it was taken very seriously in Banjaluka, but added that nobody has been arrested so far. <b>Hayat</b> – According to Hayat, Cadjo gave a completely different statement for Belgrade-based daily ‘Vecernje Novosti’, when he said that he was not informed about any kind of police operation against alleged assassins. <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 3 ‘RS Prime Minister warned by Head of Serbian MoI’, mentioned on cover ‘Assassination on Dodik is being prepared?’ by <u>N.Diklic</u> – RS Interior Minister <b>Stanislav Cadjo</b> told daily that he has information on preparations of assassination of RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad Dodik</b>: <i>“Earlier we had only clues, now we received specific information.”</i> For the sake of investigation, Cadjo did not want to comment whether there were some earlier attempts of a kind. <b>FTV, RTRS, EuroBlic</b> cover pg splash, pg 3 ‘Dodik threatened with assassination’ by <u>R.R.</u>, <b>Vecernje Novosti</b> pg 3, announced on cover ‘Minister Jovic warned Dodik’ by <u>Slobodan Pesevic</u>, <b>Dnevni List</b>, pg 7 ‘Assassination on Milorad Dodik was not prepared’, <u>not signed</u> [Cadjo’s statement for ‘Vecernje novosti’], <b>Vecernji List</b>, pg 2 ‘Investigation on preparations for assassination on Milorad Dodik’, by <u>id</u> [Cadjo says RS MoI is investigating into the case], <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 3 ‘Dodik marked by assassins’ by <u>B.B.</u>-also covered.</p>

<p>RS police observed presence of two separate criminalised groups in B. Luka / analysts says assassination prepared either to radicalise situation in relation with Kosovo status or in relation with establishment of Special Prosecution for Organised Crime</p>	<p><b>Nezavisne Novine</b> cover pg splash, pg 3 'Assassination against Dodik being prepared' by <u>P.Klinčov</u> – carries confirmation of <b>Stanislav Cadjó</b>, RS MOI, (that Serbian BIA informed RS police of assassination preparation). Daily adds referring to statement of Serbian Interior Minister that the base of this group suspected of preparing assassination against RS Premier, <b>Milorad Dodik</b>, is in settlement of Trn near Banja Luka. Daily also notes that the presence of two groups of people, one of people from Bijeljina with criminal records, and second of people from Serbia known as members of "Magda's group" (group that committed a series of murders in Vojvodina and Hungary ten years ago) was observed in Banja Luka over the past days. Daily stresses that analysts are of the view that the murder of Dodik at this moment would be in favour of radical forces in Serbia, since it would divert attention from possible extradition of <b>Ratko Mladic</b> to The Hague and would radicalise situation in the region prior to reaching decision of final status of Kosovo. On the other hand, those familiar with political developments in RS are of the view threats and warnings addressed to Dodik are related with the establishment of Special Prosecution for Organised Crime. <b>Vecernje Novosti</b> pg 3, announced on cover 'Minister Jocić warned Dodik' by <u>Slobodan Pešević</u> – Dodik Sunday did not want to make any comment on allegations, saying <i>"it is not necessary to raise the dust. Let the institutions in charge I have full trust in do their job and any comment of mine would be redundant."</i> <b>Glas Srpske</b> cover pg report 'There was no arrest' – carries <b>Rade Mutić</b>, Spokesperson of PSC Banja Luka as saying that RS police on Friday did not apprehend five persons, as reported by some media.</p>

## Constitutional/police reforms/ SAA talks

<p>BiH Presidency Chair Tihic: US officials unanimous that constitutional reform important and it must be adopted; amendments to be discussed by end of May</p>	<p><b>Hayat</b>by Elma Kazagic – Following his four-day visit to USA, BiH Presidency Chair <b>Sulejman Tihic</b> told press conference that US officials deem that it is still not too late to adopt amendments to the BiH Constitution. According to Hayat reporter, it seems that Tihic is an optimist too, because he said that the constitutional changes would certainly be discussed by the end of May – although RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad Dodik</b> on Saturday said that changes to the BiH Constitution couldn't be discussed before the October elections. <b>PINK</b> – Tihic said: <i>"Single stance of all the officials, both Republicans and Democrats, from the White House, State Department, Pentagon, Congress including world financial institutions and NGOs is that the amendments are important step ahead and should be passed as soon as possible. These officials expressed concern due to the failure to pass the amendments since BiH should not allow itself to lose four more years. US officials also expressed concern that this would slow down the process of the reintegration and BiH's way toward Euro-Atlantic structures and bring to the radicalization of the situation in BiH. For that reason, they believe that BiH should pass the amendments as soon as possible and start preparations for the second phase of the constitutional changes"</i>. Tihic also informed that support of the world financial institutions such as World Bank and International Monetary Fund depends on the adoption of the constitutional changes. Tihic expressed hope that the upcoming elections might be held in accordance with the new Constitution. <b>BHT1</b> – Refusing to reveal the new "mechanism" instructed by the US Government, Tihic confirmed that the new round of discussions and persuasions would be organised in the coming weeks. Tihic said: <i>"We talked about many issues that I cannot reveal at the moment...I deem that even those deputies who voted against the proposed amendments, 18 days after the session of BIH House of Representatives, have become aware of the alternative and that everything remains the same and much worse than the situation would have been if the amendments had been adopted"</i>. <b>FTV</b>By Azra Bavic – Reporter stated that insisting on the already proposed amendments would mean further discussions and ultimately adoption through parliamentary procedure. <b>RTRS</b> – Tihic said that there were also talks regarding military reform and cooperation with the ICTY. <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 4, announced on cover 'USA supports urgent adoption of constitutional changes' by <b>M.Cubro</b>, <b>Dnevni List</b>, pg 2 'Parliament about Constitution at end of month?!', by <b>Erna Mackic</b> – also reported.</p>

<p>BiH Presidency Chair Tihic: US urges BiH to adopt constitutional changes asap</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> cover splash, pg 2 'Amendments again in BiH Parliament by end of May?' by A.Malagic – During his four-day visit to US, BiH Presidency Chair <b>Sulejman Tihic</b> met US Vice President <b>Dick Cheney</b> and State Secretary <b>Condoleezza Rice</b>. Tihic told press conference that US urges BiH to adopt constitutional changes as soon as possible, adding: <i>"This does not mean new negotiations, but it means talks, explanations, persuasion and all the means of democratic practice when the important things are being adopted."</i> Answering the question whether it is realistic to expect amendments to be discussed in the BiH Parliament by end of May, Tihic concluded: <i>"If there is a political will and if all the preparations are done good, then it is realistic."</i> Inset 'Status of Kosovo and BiH' – Tihic also discussed regional issues with US officials: <i>"I repeated BiH stance that Kosovo status cannot in any way put in question territorial integrity and sovereignty of our country. All US officials agreed with that."</i> <b>Oslobodjenje</b> cover splash pg 2 'Elections following new Constitution still possible' by <u>E.Kamenica</u> – also covered.</p>
<p>BiH Presidency Chair Tihic discussed issue of const. changes with BiH Diaspora in US</p>	<p><b>FTV</b> – During the four-day visit to the US, BiH delegation headed by BiH Presidency Chair <b>Sulejman Tihic</b> discussed the issue of constitutional reform with the representatives of BiH Diaspora. <i>"They were rather misinformed on the entire process by various sources many months prior to the start of the negotiations on the constitutional reform"</i> Tihic stated.</p>
<p>BOSS leader Ajanovic critical of SDA leader Tihic</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 'Tihic's supporters should be prevented from completing vicious agreement with SDS' – Commenting on SDA leader <b>Sulejman Tihic</b>'s statement [that BiH Parliament should again vote on proposed constitutional changes by the end of May], BOSS leader <b>Mirnes Ajanovic</b> says in a press statement this proves that Tihic, driven by a promised seat, lost all moral frames, adding: <i>"It is necessary to re-activate Patriotic Block in order to disable various "Tihic" supporters from completing a vicious agreement with SDS."</i> <b>Dnevni List</b> pg 2 'Clear rejection of idea of state' <u>not signed</u> – also reported.</p>



<p>SDU Vice President Komsic reiterates: we pledge for abolishment of existing entities and ethnic blockades in BiH</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 'We are in favour of abolishment of existing entities and ethnic blockades' by <b>L.S., Oslobođenje</b> pg 2 'Inappropriate campaign of constitutional changes advocated' – In a public statement on Sunday, SDU Vice President <b>Ivo Komsic</b> stated that following the rejection of constitutional changes at BiH House of Representatives, the supporters of the so called constitutional changes are still engaged in inappropriate and incorrect public campaign. In a statement to the daily, he reiterates SDU would continue to pledge for abolishment of existing entities' and ethnic blockades in functioning of the state, as well as for consistent implementation of the existing constitutional principle on equality of peoples.</p>
<p>SDP's Lagumdžija: only entire pack of proposals presented to BiH Parliament can be discussed; RS PM Dodik: implementation would be impossible even if amendments were adopted</p>	<p><b>BHT1</b> By <b>Marina Boskovic</b> – Leaders of the parties that reached the proposal of the amendments to the BiH Constitution warned that no new solutions could be discussed. SDP leader <b>Zlatko Lagumdžija</b> stated that only if the entire pack of proposals has been presented to BiH Parliament they can discuss it: <i>"This means that some of the 16 MPs who voted against the proposals in the first place have decided to jump off the gravediggers' train for European BIH"</i>. On the other hand, RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad Dodik</b>, although supporting the constitutional reform, doesn't believe that even if the amendments were adopted that their implementation would be possible for the October elections: <i>"The registration process is ongoing, and this would be completely technically unachievable. Therefore, the constitutional changes can be discussed after the elections"</i>. Reporter stated that as parties did not change their stances regarding this issue so did not the individuals, which are still requesting the new proposals. US officials asked for the urgent adoption of the amendments warning that in case of failure BIH might lose the support of major financial institutions.</p>
<p>Provincial of Bosna Srebrna Father Dzolan: 'Dayton is main cause of emigration of Croats from BiH'</p>	<p><b>Vecernji List</b> cover pg splash 'Dayton is to be blamed for emigration of Croats' and pgs 8 and 9 'Dayton is responsible for decreasing number of Croats' by <b>D. Jazvic</b> carries an interview with <b>Provincial of Bosna Srebrna Father Mijo Dzolan</b>. Asked about the stand of Franciscan priests when the constitutional organization of BiH is in question, Dzolan says that BiH should meet needs, survival and perspectives of all peoples in BiH including the Croat one and its organization should encourage return of all peoples to their pre-war homes. Dzolan also says that the main cause of the decreasing number of Croats in BiH is the war and unfair, Dayton's BiH. Asked about the International Community's responsibility when disappearance of Croats in BiH is in question, Dzolan says: <i>'It lies in imposing of unfair political and state framework with the Dayton Accord and its subsequent aggravations.'</i></p>

<p>Interview with Cardinal Puljic: 'BiH needs fair Constitution!'</p>	<p><b>Vjesnik</b> pg 8 'BiH needs fair Constitution!', mentioned on cover '‘BiH needs fair Constitution for all!’ by <u>E. Avdovic</u> carries an interview with <b>Cardinal Vinko Puljic</b>. Asked to comment on the journalist's impression that judging by the meeting that High Representative <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b> had with Pope Benedict XVI, Vatican did not have anything against constitutional changes in BiH, Cardinal Puljic said: <i>'It should be clear that neither the Holy See nor BiH Bishops had anything against constitutional changes. After the Dayton Accord was signed we have been standing for constitution changes, but for the constitutional changes that would be fair.'</i></p>
<p>Former EUPM Commissioner Carty: Future police must cross IEBL</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 9, mentioned on cover 'SIPA is perfect example what efficient should look like', by <u>L. Sinanovic</u> – in a short interview for daily, former EUPM Commissioner <b>Kevin Carty</b> argues that the future police forces should be able to cross the inter-entity border lines [IEBL] if the police is to take on the organize crime successfully. As a perfect example of a successful police/security agency, Carty notes the SIPA, saying it is becoming more professional and an example what efficient police should look like.</p>

Asked whether non-arrest of <b>Radovan Karadzic</b> might slow down the BiH's way to the EU, Topcagic stated: <i>'At the moment there are no objections when our cooperation with the ICTY is in question and there are no indications that suspension of the negotiations might take place.'</i> Asked whether he is satisfied with the speed and efficiency with which BiH meets set pre-requisites, Topcagic said: <i>'We would like that the things goes faster, but on the other hand this is the process that requires maturity and creating of an ambient that can accept these changes and this also takes its time.'</i></p>

Third Congress  
of BiH Diaspora  
held in  
Sarajevo on  
Friday

**Hayat** – The 3<sup>rd</sup> Congress of the BiH World Diaspora Association ended on Sunday in Sarajevo. In a short interview for NTV Hayat, former Chair of the Association **Namik Alimajstorovic** briefly described what happened during the Congress. According to Alimajstorovic, this was the best-organized Congress so far, simply because there were no problems that would attract media attention. New Chair of the BiH World Diaspora Association is **Senada Softic-Telalovic**, who lives and works in Australia. Alimajstorovic stressed that representatives of Association once again informed representatives of BiH authorities about their problems. BiH Minister of Foreign Affairs **Mladen Ivanic** did not attend the Congress in Sarajevo, although he was properly invited, which, according to Alimajstorovic, clearly shows that BiH authorities do not care about BiH Diaspora. **FTV** – Softic-Taletovic stated that the association would continue with attracting the investors to BIH, cooperation with BIH Ministries and with Youth Organizations. Former Chair of the Diaspora Board **Namik Alimajstorovic** said that almost all their goals have been accomplished adding: *“even if some haven’t been achieved it is because of the parliamentary procedure”*. Deputy Chairs of the BiH Diaspora Board **Milorad Muratovic** and **Zaim Pasic** expressed determination to cooperate with the BiH authorities. The Board wishes to become a strong partner of BiH. **BHT1** – Softic-Taletovic stated that the issue of dual citizenship represents a big problem to BiH citizens who live abroad. **Nezavisne Novine** pg 4 ‘Diaspora will continue with investments’ by FENA, **Dnevni Avaz** pg 9 ‘New chair Senada Softic-Telalovic from Australia’ by Fena, **Oslobodjenje** pg 7 ‘Strength of Diaspora depends of state’s unity’ by M.K.S. – also reported on the Congress.

<p>HR at Inter-Religious Council session / VL: HR to 'reconcile' religious leaders</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 2 'Christian Schwarz-Schilling at Inter-Religious Council session today', <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 2 'Christian Schwarz-Schilling at Inter-Religious Council today'– The High Representative <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b> will attend a meeting of the Inter-Religious Council in Sarajevo on Monday. OHR stated: <i>"This institution has a key role to play in promoting dialogue among the religious communities whose collective heritage makes Bosnia and Herzegovina unique in Europe."</i> <b>Vecernji List</b>, pg 2 'Schilling 'reconciles' religious leaders', by <u>D. J.</u> – announces that the HR CSS will attend the meeting and notes that one cannot be certain why the HR is attending the meeting in the first place. However, VL notices that this is the first meeting of the Inter-religious council after last week's exchange of open letters/statements between the Reis-ul-Ulema, <b>Mustafa eff. Cerić</b>, and Cardinal <b>Vinko Puljic</b>, in which they engaged in debate about Puljic's visit to the US and his statements about status of Croats. VL reckons that the HR's presence is likely aimed at providing support to dialogue between the religious communities in BiH.</p>

<p>BiH Presidency Chair Tihic: US expressed readiness to support construction of Corridor 5C</p>	<p><b>Hayat</b> – During its four-day visit to US, BiH delegation met representatives of the World Bank [WB] and International Monetary Fund [IMF] and discussed, among other things, the construction of the Corridor 5C. Hayat carries that the support of international monetary institutions to this, as well as all other projects in BiH, very much depends on the adoption of constitutional amendments. BiH Presidency Chair <b>Sulejman Tihic</b> comments: <i>“Just like European Union and NATO, they want the state of BiH which can negotiate, take over and carry out the obligations”</i>. <b>RTRS</b> – Tihic said that US expressed readiness to support construction of Corridor 5C.</p>

<p>'Circle 99' discusses construction of Corridor 5C</p>	<p><b>FTV, Hayat</b> – The construction the Corridor 5-C was discussed at a regular session of Association of Independent Intellectuals 'Circle 99' in Sarajevo on Sunday. Experts who participated at the session agreed that the highway should end in the city and port of Neum, rather than in port of Ploce [Croatia], because it would significantly improve the development of 25 kilometres of BiH seashore. **Dnevni Avaz** pg 5, mentioned on cover 'BiH is ancient history for International Community' by S.Skuletic – Commenting failure of Serbian authorities to arrest **Ratko Mladic**, in an interview for DA, International Crisis Group [ICG] for Balkans Special Representative **James Lyon** said that even if Serbian Prime Minister **Vojislav Kostunica** is now willing to arrest Mladic, he has no one to issue a warrant to, for he had removed all the officials appointed by the late Serbian PM **Zoran Djindjic**, and appointed Mladic's aids on their positions.

Lyon stressed: *"Serbian Government knew Mladic's whereabouts in 2004 and 2005, if they wanted to, they could have arrested him. Why it would do that now?"* Commenting possible separation of Montenegro from SCG and status of Kosovo, Lyon noted: *"By not-arresting Mladic and breaking negotiations with EU, they [Serbian authorities] sealed the issue of Montenegro independency... Kosovo has nothing to do with BiH. Serbia must be aware that demanding RS in compensation for Kosovo would bring other borders under question: Vojvodina, South of Serbia... But, until solving issue of Kosovo, Montenegro and ICTY cooperation, it would be hard to reach progress in BiH."* Lyon concluded that BiH is far from being priority for International Community [IC]: *"Bosnia became ancient history. Its path depends of itself, IC will not pay bills and play leading role anymore. That time has passed."* Inset 'Serbia would be under additional pressure for Karadzic as well' – Lyon said that he expects IC would also increase its pressure on Serbia due to the fact that **Radovan Karadzic** is still not arrested, adding that IC also bears part of responsibility for Karadzic is still not in the Hague.
