**Herceg Bosna Radio, BHTV, FTV, RTRS, Oslobođenje** pgs 4-5, mentioned on cover 'NATO remains in BiH', **Dnevni Avaz** cover page, pg 3 'NATO will not leave BiH', **ONASA** – Members of the BiH Presidency met on Thursday with NATO Secretary-General **Jaap de Hoop Scheffer** and EU High Representative for the Common Foreign and Security Policy **Javier Solana** to discuss the handover between SFOR (NATO-led Stabilization Forces) and EUFOR (European/EU Forces). *"We expressed support to the replacement of members of SFOR with forces of the EU. That is a proof of stability and positive situation in BiH. We believe this replacement represents an important step on the way of BiH towards Euro-Atlantic integration,"* chairman of the BiH Presidency **Sulejman Tihic** said. According to Tihic, members of the BiH Presidency confirmed readiness of BiH for the fulfilment of conditions for the admission of BiH into the Partnership for Peace, which is particularly related to the arrest of persons accused of war crimes and to the cooperation with the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (ICTY). Scheffer said that NATO trusts the EU and the mission that it will take over by the beginning of the next year. *"NATO is not leaving BiH but it wants to support the EU and its mission. The main message is that we want BiH to get closer to the EU and NATO,"* he said. *"We are here to show our orientation to assist the people of BiH. The EU and NATO are two organizations whose member BiH wants to become and we will continue assisting you to realize that dream,"* Solana said.

**Herceg Bosna Radio, BHTV, FTV, RTRS, Oslobođenje** pgs 4-5, mentioned on cover 'NATO remains in BiH', **Dnevni Avaz** cover page, pg 3 'NATO will not leave BiH', **ONASA** – A visit to Sarajevo of NATO Secretary-General **Jaap de Hoop Scheffer** and EU High Representative for Common Foreign and Security Policy **Javier Solana** has showed that the communique from the NATO summit in Istanbul is a very serious project, which will contribute that BiH speeds up on the way towards Euro-Atlantic integration, chairman of the BiH Council of Ministers **Adnan Terzic** said on Thursday. After a meeting with Scheffer and Solana, Terzic said that the post-Dayton BiH has entered the Brussels era, which is encouragement for BiH authorities and citizens. Scheffer said they came to show their readiness to help BiH and that they agree with a decision on the completion of the SFOR mission to BiH. He added NATO will continue supporting the EU mission and helping the ambition of BiH to join Euro-Atlantic integration. According to Scheffer, it is very important for BiH to continue the defence reform and to arrest persons accused of war crimes. *"NATO and SFOR are here to help the arrest of persons indicted for war crimes. However, that is the primary responsibility of BiH authorities. Our message today is a message of support and hope,"* he said.

Thursday rejected accusations in Sarajevo that SFOR  
had done little or nothing to capture war crimes  
indictée Radovan Karadzic. After a meeting with the  
High Representative Paddy Ashdown, Scheffer said  
that it was *"incorrect to assert that there is a  
lack of will within NATO to arrest Karadzic,"*  
stressing that the BiH government, and particularly  
that of the RS were most responsible to carry out  
the arrest. *"I would rather see Karadzic in the  
Hague tribunal tonight than tomorrow. His arrest is  
a problem because a number of people in the RS are  
failing to do what they should be,"* Scheffer said.  
Asked whether NATO knew Karadzic's whereabouts on  
20 February, as was stated by the Hague tribunal  
chief prosecutor, Carla Del Ponte, Scheffer replied  
that this was not the case and further denied that  
there was any correspondence with Del Ponte in  
connection with this. Solana said that he did not  
anticipate any problems with a dialogue and the  
efficiency of NATO and the forthcoming EU  
peacekeeping mission (EUFOR) in BiH because, as he  
said, the two organizations had worked together in  
many other crisis-ridden regions, including the  
Balkans. Asked how the citizens of BiH could trust  
the EU mission given the behaviour of the European  
soldiers during the war, Solana stressed that both  
in BiH and Kosovo, as well as in other crisis-  
ridden regions, EU had always provided assistance.  
He went on to say that 80 per cent of the SFOR  
members came from EU countries. *"The mandate of the  
EU mission is the continuation of the SFOR one, but  
it will be adopted to the present situation which  
is substantially better than it was eight years  
ago,"* Solana said.

<p><b>ICTY Prosecution says NATO does not want to arrest Karadzic and Mladic</b></p>	<p><b>Herceg Bosna Radio, Dnevni List</b>, pg 8 'The Hague Tribunal no longer believes in NATO's operations in BiH', by <b>NINA</b> – according to a report from the Deutsche Welle, in beginning of 2004, the ICTY formed a team, whose task was to locate ICTY indictees at large <b>Radovan Karadzic</b> and <b>Ratko Mladic</b>. Allegedly, the team had forwarded the info from the ground to the High Representative for BiH, <b>Paddy Ashdown</b>, and <b>SFOR</b>, but nothing concrete happened. According to the ICTY Prosecution, the indictees are still at large because NATO did not launch an operation even after the ICTY had forwarded the information about the whereabouts of the indictees. ICTY Chief Prosecutor's spokeswoman, <b>Florence Hartmann</b>, stated that back in February this year, there were reliable information that Karadzic was in a village on the border between BiH and Serbia , however NATO did nothing. She also says that the ICTY Prosecution has had information about Mladic's whereabouts for two years, and which were regularly forwarded to NATO, however NATO did nothing.</p>

By this, NATO has replied to accusations of Chief Prosecutor <b>Carla Del Ponte</b>, who recently said that the Hague Tribunal forwarded information to SFOR on February 20 saying that <b>Radovan Karadzic</b> was located in Zaovine village, yet 'no action of NATO had followed'.</p>

The High Representative, <b>Paddy Ashdown</b>, and the Commander of SFOR, Major General <b>Virgil Packett</b>, accompanied the senior officials of EU and NATO. In addressing the members of EUPM and the BiH police officials, Solana indicated the importance of transferring SFOR's mandate to the EU peacekeeping mission. He indicated the necessity for enhancing the security capacities in BiH for the purpose of creating the conditions for country's accession to Euro-Atlantic and European integration. The High Representative, Paddy Ashdown, indicated that great expectations are linked with the EU military mission, simultaneously underlining the significance of the up to now engagement of SFOR, i.e. NATO in BiH. According to Ashdown, NATO has done a great job in BiH, especially in the field of improving the freedom of movement of refugees and displaced persons, and in the view of strengthening peace and the overall stability. After visiting the EUPM headquarters, the senior European and NATO officials visited SFOR camp in Butmir, where the NATO Secretary General addressed the members of the Stabilization Force and the diplomatic corps in BiH.</p>

**BiH prosecution  
widens investigation  
into IDs illegal  
issuance case**

**FTV** – After Wednesday’s arrests of a number of people in Banja Luka, the BiH Prosecutor’s Office took over a case involving the forgery/illegal issuance of personal documents, the Banja Luka Public Security Centre spokesman, **Rade Mutic**, told FTV. The state prosecution has forbidden any public statements on the case, Mutic said, because the operation was still under way. FTV learned that the BiH Prosecutor’s Office has extended an investigation to the Federation of BiH.

The Banja Luka police on Wednesday arrested three people on suspicion of forging/illegally issuing ID cards and driving licenses and the recipient of the forged documents. Two people worked in the RS Ministry of Interior and the other two were unemployed, Mutic confirmed. The arrests took place in the Medical Electronics building in Banja Luka where the premises of the CIPS (Citizen Identification Protection System) project are based. The directorate for the implementation of the CIPS project said that not a single directorate’s employee had been arrested or involved in the incident.

Soldo** – Spokesperson of the Public Security Centre in Banja Luka **Rade Mutic** stated that members of this centre arrested 3 persons, while one person turned himself/herself in, because of grounded suspicion that they were falsifying personal documents. According to Mutic, all arrested persons are CIPS employees. VL also carries employee of the BiH Ministry of Civil Affairs **Sinisa Macan** who denied these allegations claiming that CIPS employees are not among the arrested ones. Spokesperson of the CIPS Agency **Sanela Turkovic** stated that this Agency and its employees were not involved in this case and added that those who are involved in this case are the employees of the RS Ministry of Interior. The CIPS Agency also denied the information that members of the RS MoI were searching the CIPS premises in Banja Luka yesterday.

<p><b>Editorial on falsified personal documents</b></p>	<p><b>Vecernji List</b> pg 2 'The end of another illusion' by <u>D. Jazvic</u> carries an editorial on the case of falsified personal documents and the author says that this is another disappointment for BiH citizens and he concludes: <i>"Corruption and crime that are deeply rooted in the authority system will be a constant stumbling block on the BiH's way to Europe. The struggle against these phenomena should start at the top, within the institutions that are in charge for implementation and protection of law."</i></p>
<p><b>Second letter by former Al Qaeda officer</b></p>	<p><b>Dnevni List</b>, pg 5 'Mujahiddin could make a living chain from Zenica to Sarajevo', mentioned on front, by <u>Miso Relota</u> – the daily apparently received a second letter from an alleged former officer of Al Qaeda, <b>Ali Hamad</b>, who is currently serving prison sentence in Zenica. He reiterates that he was a former officer of Al Qaeda and that he had left the organization after the September 11 attacks.</p> <p>Furthermore, he warns of presence of mujahiddin in BiH, who are using the political and ethnic intolerance among the BiH peoples as their tools. In that context, Ali Hamad notes that the ICTY Chief Prosecutor, <b>Carla del Ponte</b>, is failing to recognize that there are foreign and domestic mujahiddin in BiH, who were killing and slaughtering people that do not belong to Islam between 1992 and 1995. <i>"There are so many mujahiddin in BiH they could make a living chain from Zenica to Sarajevo. I recommend the Americans to make her (del Ponte) new spectacles, so she could clearly see the foreign and domestic mujahiddin and bring them to justice"</i>, concludes Ali Hamad.</p>

The money belongs to 19 juristic persons.</p> <p>Bearing in mind last years' number of resources blocked (BAM 433 million), Department officials say that the money-launderers have changed the method of their work, noting: <i>"Now, more juristic persons fictively settle debts through one firm, which meets all formal and legal conditions for work. It is observed as a mediator between legal tax payers and "phantom" firms."</i></p>

The Bishops also call on the international and domestic officials to show a bigger political will, which should result in a bigger economic aid to the people in the need, and the Republic of Croatia to help the Croat returnees.</p>

He said that Stojicic is currently the only candidate for this position, since other parties had nominated no person. RS NA has decided to hold a special session on Tuesday, at which it will elect RS NA President and verify mandates of seven SDS delegates that will replace delegates removed by HR Ashdown.

**EuroBlic** RSpg2 'Much ado about nothing' – **Sefket Hafizovic**, RS NA Deputy Speaker, confirmed that the special session of the RS NA should be held on 20 July, when new RS NA Speaker should be elected and mandates to new MP' should be verified. He also expressed expectation that resumption of regular 18<sup>th</sup> session would follow this special session.

**Tanja Topic**, political analyst, excludes the possibility of seeing early elections held, *"because the international community does not accept it"*. She also said that removals of SDA Ministers from RS Government are unlikely to happen.
