This was about a denunciation of Transparency International in which it was stated that, allegedly, the employee, whose name I cannot reveal for understandable reasons, has threatened the leadership of a public institution in RS by saying that **Paddy Ashdown**, the High Representative, would remove them all if they fail to give back the job to a person they have fired earlier'. Boris Divjak, the Transparency International Director, has confirmed TI has received a letter from OHR, which explained in two sentences that the employee couldn't be held responsible of this. Divjak said he wanted to know how and through what kind of an investigation had OHR reached such a conclusion. OHR refused to comment on this case. OHR Banja Luka Spokesperson Ljiljana Radetic said OHR never comments on its correspondence.
