<p>Media speculate car-bomb threatened OHR and UK Embassy</p>	<p>Dnevni Avaz cover splash, pg 3 'OHR threatened by a truck loaded with explosive?' by <u>M.K.</u> – According to information DA obtained from well informed sources, the OHR building was evacuated on Tuesday following a tip that a truck loaded with explosive would hit the building. OHR stated on Wednesday that its officials have been returned to their jobs with an increased presence of police. SIPA is in charge of investigation, and it issued a press release explaining <i>"police structures in Sarajevo received information on a security threat to the OHR building in Sarajevo at approximately 17:00 on Tuesday. This was a reason for immediate measures on ensuring the OHR building and diplomatic-consular offices in Sarajevo."</i></p> <p>Oslobodjenje pg 3 'Unknown persons threatened OHR with car-bomb?', mentioned on cover, by <u>A.O.</u> – Daily says that OHR was evacuated under the threat of car-bomb. It also learnt that the police possess information that another car-bomb was also directed against UK Embassy.</p> <p>Vecernji List, front pg splash 'Panic in OHR', pg 5 'Car-bomb threat against Paddy Ashdown's office', by <u>Dejan Jazvic</u> – According to unofficial information that VL obtained, an anonymous threat with a car-bomb caused the evacuation of the OHR in Sarajevo.</p> <p>Slobodna Dalmacija, front pg splash and pg 7 'Car bomb attack planned on OHRBuilding?', by <u>Zdenko Rerig</u> – According to unconfirmed information, the reason which triggered the evacuation of the OHR building is the foreign intelligence information.</p>

**RS and
Serbian agree
to cooperate
in fulfilling
obligations
towards ICTY**

Hayat, Oslobođenje pg 7 'Meet all international obligations', **Dnevni Avaz** pg 4 'More surrenders could be expected', **Dnevni List** pg 5, mentioned on cover 'Relations between BiH and Serbia and Montenegro aggravated' by M. Batarello, **Nezavisne Novine** pg 6 'Tadic: to determine truth on sufferings of Serbs in Sarajevo as well' by Srna, **EuroBlic** pg 3 'RS leadership in Belgrade' not signed, **Glas Srpske** pg 3 'Truth on Sarajevo as well' by Srna– RS President, **Dragan Cavic** and RS Prime Minister, **Pero Bukeylovic** on Wednesday met with the Serbian President **Boris Tadic** in Belgrade. Later they were joined by the RS MoI **Darko Matijasevic**, and Serbian PM **Vojislav Kostunica**.

BHT 1, PINK, RTRS – In a meeting between Cavic, Tadic and Bukeylovic, it was stressed that it is necessary for both RS and Serbia to fulfil all obligations toward the International Community, including the cooperation with the ICTY. They expressed a support for all activities aimed at disclosing the truth about war crimes in BiH. They pointed out to the positive example of the Srebrenica Commission, stating that such approach should be applied in the case of finding truth on mass killings of Serbs in Sarajevo during the war. Officials also noted that the model of voluntary surrenders gives the results.

FTV–Tadic's office stated that the activities of the RS institutions in past three months marked a positive progress in cooperation with the ICTY. Cavic, Bukeylovic and Tadic jointly stated that determination of the truth on war crimes committed by all sides in the war would create conditions for renewing of mutual trust in the region.

SRNA – Dragan Cavic said that during the talks the officials reached an agreement on further steps towards improving cooperation with the ICTY. He told SRNA news agency that in this connection, a document is being prepared and signed by the end of March that will define the relations between the RS and Serbian police ministries.

M., Glas Srpske pg 2 'Investigation commenced' <u>not signed</u> – The Embassy of the Russian Federation to BiH issued press release regarding the media reports which speculate that persons indicted for war crimes were hiding in Russia. The Embassy underlined that Russian has an unambiguous stand that all war crimes suspects must be brought to justice and that authorities have never considered the matters of granting asylum or citizenship to indictees. It is also stated that the Russian side is in constant contact with the ICTY. <i>"It is also necessary to consider the fact that the liberalized regime of travels between the citizens of Russia and the former Yugoslav countries, except for Slovenia, largely burdens the control of entries of the citizens of the said countries to Russia,"</i> was announced, adding that Gojko Jankovic could have taken advantage of this circumstance on the occasion of traveling to Russia on basis of false travel documents. In conclusion, the Embassy of the Russian Federation stressed that the relevant bodies are conducting an investigation into this matter and that the ICTY would be informed about the results of the taken measures.</p> <p>RTRS – Russian Security Service refused comment allegations.</p>

<p>Terzic: BiH Intelligence has information on Russians hiding some PIFWCs</p>	<p>Oslobodjenje cover splash, pgs 4-5 'BiH Intelligence possess information that war criminals hide in Russia' by <u>Nadzida Cano</u> – The Chair of the Council of Ministers, Adnan Terzic, in a statement to Oslobodjenje confirms that BiH intelligence services possess information which apparently prove that the Russian Federation provides protection for some war crimes suspects. "I think that the writings of the Guardian and the New York Times are true," said Terzic adding that he and BiH Foreign Minister, Mladen Ivanic, decided to invite the Russian Ambassador to BiH, Alexander Grischenko, for a meeting to express the concern over these allegations.</p>

He allegedly visited Foca in November last year where he obtained from police contacts false documents, and he also changed personal appearance.</p>

Sarac</u> – Commenting to media speculation on allegedly Russian officials support to PIFWCs at large, SDA Vice President Seada Palavric, stated if confirmed for these claims are true that would be "catastrophic". <i>"That would explain a number of things that happened at the BiH political theatre following 16 December, when HR's measures were diminished... It would be clear in that case why Anti-Dayton option won,"</i> said Palavric. The leader of Party for BiH, Safet Halilovic, believes that PIC must clear up these allegations, adding if information was true it is scandalous. Munira Subasic and Bakira Hasecic, chairs of associations of victims from Srebrenica and Foca respectively, said they were not surprised by the allegations at all adding they have been saying for quite a time that war crimes suspects have been hiding in Russia .</p>

The main hearing in this case is scheduled to start on February 27, 2006. The Court is, according to Softic, due to re-examining its competence/authorization during the entire process and that will be used by the SCG legal representatives. Softic concludes that there is a danger of linking the BiH lawsuit against SCG for aggression and genocide with SCG lawsuit against NATO. The Court declared itself unauthorized for this matter on December 15 last year.</p>

Ljiljana Radetic, OHR Spokesperson, on Wednesday stated that <i>"OHR will analyse report, after which it would announce its stance on information provided."</i></p>

DA learns from Brussels that the EC deems it is unacceptable for an official to maintain his position after BiH Court has confirmed the indictment. DA also has confirmed that the international community in BiH has no contact with Covic, apparently Peace Implementation Council has been discussing the measures to undertake if Covic doesn't resign soon. **Vecernji List**, pg 3, mentioned on front 'European Unions sends demarche to Dragan Covic', by Zoran Kresic – VL also learns from "*diplomatic sources in Sarajevo*" on the demarche, adding that it will be directly mentioning a possibility of use of the Bonn powers by the High Representative, in other words a removal.

This is just about a journalist's invention since there have been no talks on the issue inside HDZ BiH, according to Merdzo.

Hayat, Nezavisne Novine pg 5 'Dragan Covic is still thinking' by A. Sisic, V. Coric – HDZ Spokesperson, **Pero Pavlovic** rejected to either confirm or deny allegations regarding the collective resignations. Pavlovic said that HDZ would take a stance on the issue after HDZ Presidency session.

RHB, PINK, BHT 1, Dnevni Avaz pg 2 'Mesic told Paravac: In addition to Jasenovac, you have to mention Srebrenica' by agencies, **Oslobodjenje** pg 2 'Who mentions victims could not have skipped mentioning Srebrenica', **Vecernji List**, pg 16 'Paravac: Hundreds of thousands of Serbs died in Jasenovac', by Jasmina Popovic, **Slobodna Dalmacija**, pg 5 'Paravac's provocation', 'Mesic on Paravac', **Dnevni List**, back pg 'Mesic: Paravac should not have omitted Srebrenica', **Nezavisne Novine** pg 4 'To learn a lesson from stance of Jewish people towards the holocaust' by Agencies, **Glas Srpske** pg 2 'Past as a warning' by Srna – The Chairman of BiH Presidency, **Borislav Paravac**, who is taking part in a solemn session entitled 'Remembering the past, shaping the future' at the 'Yad Vashem' museum of holocaust at Jerusalem, reportedly unpleasantly surprised the Croatian delegation by constantly mentioning the 'Jasenovac' prison camp (Ustasha concentration camp during the WWII) in his speech before representatives of 40 states. Dailies say Paravac abused the occasion to say that several hundreds of thousands of Serbs were killed at Jasenovac, which triggered the Croatian President, **Stipe Mesic** to react: *"I do not know what Paravac was adding, probably all the Serbs in Serbia that died during the WWII. When he was mentioning victims, he should not have overlooked Srebrenica"*.

Oslobodjenje pg 9 'Holocaust of our own' by Edin Krehic – Daily's editorial is highly critical of Paravac's attendance at the ceremony, stating he is absolutely insensitive to the victims of the crimes in his own country.

Mi.</u> – The Chief to OSCE Mission to BiH, Douglas Davidson, met with RS Minister for Refugees and Displaced Persons, Jasmin Samardzic, in order to discuss problems the Ministry is facing. Samardzic said that the greatest problem was 7.000 persons who were using alternative accommodation. Samardzic said these persons are not facing only housing issues but social welfare problems, as well. Davidson said that OSCE was interested in plans and tasks of this Ministry in order to find a way for cooperation in future.</p> <p>Glas Srpske pg 5 'Formula for compromise' by <u>G. D.</u> – Davidson also held separate meeting with the RS Education Minister Milovan Pecelj. The dailies say that the BiH MVP Press Office said that Ivanic has been in Brussels and for this reason he could not comment on the aforementioned information. Osl. also carries Secretary General of the BiH MVP Faud Sabeta who stated that he was not informed that Ivanic put forward Bozanic's candidacy and that the Collegiums of the BiH MVP has not been informed about it as well.</p>

<p>Venice Commission's Thomas Markert: The time has still not come to abolish entities</p>	<p>Dnevni Avaz pg 5 'The time has still not come to abolish entities' <u>Sead Numanovic</u> – Venice Commission Deputy Secretary Thomas Markert said in an interview for the daily that the Commission members considered the structure of the Federation of BiH as too complicated and too expensive. On the other side, according to Markert, not a single Serb in Banja Luka is ready to talk on the abolishment of Republika Srpska. Since such the change to the Constitution cannot be made without consensus of all the constituent peoples, the Venice Commission believes that the abolishment of the entities is not possible right now. The functioning of the state bodies should be improved instead, while accepting the existence of the entities as BiH's reality. Regarding the powers of the High Representative, Markert says that they should be gradually reduced. It is however unrealistic that these powers/HR mandate are changed in the course of this year.</p>

BL Mayor confirms he received threatening letter

Cubro** – Dismissed employees of OSA established their Association in Sarajevo Wednesday. The Chairman of Intelligence-Security Information Association of Former OSA employees, **Predrag Ceranic**, and Deputy Chairman of the Association **Edhem Besic** have explained that the aim of establishing of the Association was to provide with free-of-charge legal and any other help to former OSA employees. Member of the Association Steering Board **Slavko Jovicic** has warned that OSA officials might try to present establishing of this Association as establishing of a parallel intelligence service in BiH and he emphasized the Statute of the Association will have to clearly state that the Association is a non-political association with the task to protect rights of dismissed OSA employees.

BHT 1 – Dismissed OSA officers claim that in this Service are working the separate entities' services, which were made according to the measure of ruling national parties. They claim that **Almir Djuvo** and **Risto Zaric** brought the decision on dismissals. They also claim that all the officers who weren't suitable for SDS, SDA and HDZ were dismissed.

RTRS – Ceranic stated that OSA is now made of 3 ethnically divided services that are only joined formally.

**Police raids
Fagus company**

RTRS, Nezavisne Novine pg 2 'Documents were confiscated at "Fagus" firm' by G. Arbutina and P. Klincov, announced on cover – Inspectors of Banja Luka PSC, RS Tax Administration and Prosecutors searched the seat of "Fagus" firm Wednesday in Kotor Varos, co-owned by **Miroslav Malijevic**, a member of PDP Main Board. Business premises of the firm in Banja Luka were also raided, as well as Malijevic's house and apartment. Inspectors confiscated documentation on business conducting of the firm. According to some information, the search was conducted in frame of an investigation of the Prosecutor's Office on business conducting of "Srpske Sume" and its suspicious business transactions with "Fagus". The Audit Report on Srpske Sume mentions suspicious business deals of a firm owned by a businessmen from Kotor Varos ("Fagus") and reads that under his pressure and pressure of PDP delegate at RS NA (Velimir Sakan) and Director of Forestry Firm "Vrbanja" police officer **Jovic Djuric** was suspended because he had stopped truck of "Fagus" illegally transporting unmarked wooden logs. Two month later, commander of local police station was suspended too, due to "unsatisfactory cooperation" with a local businessman.

The Report was designed following the ten-month systematic review of public administration in BiH. Michael Humphreys Chief of EC delegation on BIH stated that the report is not only information on present condition but an indicator of future obligations that will improve daily work of public administration. Some of recommendations from the report cite internal control and audits, precise planning of finances, establishment of better communication between all levels of authorities and making the state service more attractive for young educated people.</p> <p>Hayat –The review includes 237 institutions, from 14 systems of the Public Administration. The project lasted for over a year, and the EU allocated 1.5 million Euros for the project.
