3, 'OHR forwarded draft law on intelligence for parliament procedure', Blic p 13 'Verification by March 1', FENA – The High Representative, Paddy Ashdown, in accordance with Article 66 of the Rules of Procedure of the Council of Ministers, on Wednesday sent a draft Law on the Intelligence Service of Bosnia and Herzegovina to both BiH Houses of Parliament for consideration and adoption by 1 March 2004. On Tuesday evening, BiH Prime Minister Adnan Terzic, and his Deputies, Barisa Colak and Mladen Ivanic, were unable to

reach consensus on adopting the law. "This is a regrettable failure of Government to ensure the safety and security of all its citizens — its most basic task," the High Representative said on Wednesday. "I have therefore sent this draft legislation to BiH's

Parliament to allow BiH's Parliamentarians to consider it." BHTV — High Representative Paddy Ashdown submitted draft Law on intelligence service to BiH Parliament, after Council of Ministers failed to agree on the issue. After three months chairman Terzic and his deputies Colak and Ivanic could not agree on the draft Law, which is one of key for EU conditions. OHR spokesman Oleg Milisic:

"It is pity there has been no agreement on this law, which is so important for security of BiH citizens." Main reason for failure was position of RS representatives who did not want to discuss it. Chairman Terzic: "There were no substantial objections on the text,

but RS representatives considered there was not constitutional basis for its adoption without discussing at entity level. I don't share that view". This may send a bad signal to EU on readiness to make reforms. Security minister Colak commented: "It is very likely

to have negative implications in EU institutions, but it is important the law will be passed in either way within given deadline." Deadline for fully functional security agency is March

1.

FTV — Senior Deputy HR Werner Wnendt made an exclusive statement for FTV on the HR decision to send the draft intelligence law to BiH Parliement: "BiH can not afford anymore to have intelligence service without parliamentary control...there will be professional,

depoliticised agency under parliamentary control." Political developments

Ashdown to make final decision on Mostar in January 2004 Croat Radio Herceg Bosna, BHTV, FTV, Nezavisne Novine, pg. 4, 'Mostar must get one administration by the end of January', Dnevni Avaz pg. 8 'Mostar to be a single town with six electoral units' – The current organization of Mostar, which is divided on the ethnic basis, is unacceptable and this must be changed if BiH wants to continue the process of drawing closer to the European Union (EU), the Senior Deputy High Representative, Werner Wnendt, said in Sarajevo on Wednesday. The German diplomat told a news conference that High Representative Paddy Ashdown would make a final decision on the future organization of this southern city in January, after the commission in charge of Mostar's new organization failed to reach consensus on the matter. Officials for the Party

of Democratic Action (SDA) insist that Mostar should continue to function as a city with six municipalities, namely three under the control of Croats and another three under the Muslims control. They have said any other solution will lead to the dominance of Croats, as they make up a majority of the city's population. The Office of the High Representative, however, strongly opposes the further division of the city into the Croat-dominated West Mostar and the Muslim-dominated East Mostar. International diplomats say the current administration is overstaffed, expensive and inefficient. "What is only

completely unacceptable is status quo," Wnendt said.

According to FTV, Mostar will be organized as a single town with a single administration and six electoral units.

On top of that, says Dnevni List, the SDA and HDZ will bear responsibility for a high probability that many world leaders do not show up at the opening ceremony of the Mostar's Old Bridge scheduled for July 2004.

Slobodna Dalmacija (back page "Mostar a test for future of BiH", by <u>Emil</u> <u>Karamatic</u>), Oslobodjenje pg. 3 'Interim Statute must be changed' carry the response of the High Representative for BiH, Paddy Ashdown, to the report that the Chairman of Mostar Commission, Norbert Winterstein, had submitted to him.

The response reads: "The solution you have found, with all its guarantees, safeguards and carefully negotiated power-sharing provisions, gives everyone in Mostar an opportunity to gain, while protecting everyone's vital interests. It

is now up to all parties to seize that opportunity - to put aside 'impossibilist' negotiating positions, and to engage seriously in the process of implementing this, the best chance we have had, or will have, to bring lasting peace, security and prosperity to the people of Mostar. The wider future of BiH, and its ambition one day to become a full member of the European Union, depend on the resolution of this long-standing and damaging problem" Dnevni List (front & p 11, "Mostar - 2nd worst city in Europe", not signed) carries parts of the interview which Richard Holbrooke gave to Voice of America and which deals with the Balkans, Kosovo and BiH. "We could talk for hours about what is wrong in Bosnia. Mostar is the 2nd worst city in Europe after Mitrovica. Yet, looking at it from the American point of view - vis-à-vis the drama going on in Iraq, it's fine", Holbrooke is quoted as saying.
