<p>RSNA discussing defence reform</p>	<p>BH Radio 1 by <u>Brana Markovic</u> – At an extraordinary session taking place in Banja Luka today, the RS National Assembly is discussing the continuation of defence reform in BiH. The deputies were addressed by Raffi Gregorian, the Co-chair of BiH Defence Reform Commission, who reiterated that a lack of full cooperation with ICTY remained the main obstacle to BiH's accession to PfP. Gregorian emphasized that the NATO Ministers were waiting for his report to consider at their April session the implementation of defence reform in BiH. He praised BiH authorities for the efforts made so far and achieved results. However, there are still things to be done including the proper staffing of BiH defence structures as well as resolution of the issue of reserve military forces.</p>
<p>US strongly supports ICTY</p>	<p>BH Radio 1 – US State Department strongly supports The Hague Tribunal in its efforts to bring the indicted war criminals to justice, said an unnamed State Department official commenting on the EU decision to postpone accession talks with Croatia. According to the official, the US is still calling on all the governments (in the Balkans) to establish full cooperation with ICTY that includes apprehension and extradition of all war crime indictees primarily Ante Gotovina, Radovan Karadzic and Ratko Mladic.</p>

C.— At the Thursday's session, the BiH Council of Ministers accepted the Report of the Ministry of Security on implementing the Decision under which ICTY indictees at large are disabled from disposing with their assets in BiH. The CoM demand from the all law enforcement agencies to carry out all measures to ensure this decision is implementation, also demanding the process to be checked. As the CoM's Acting Secretary General, **Karmelo Prlenda**, told a press conference, those verifications will be conducted in the banks, insurance companies, courts, and other institutions which could eventually have some evidences of ICTY fugitives' property. Prlenda added that Justice Ministry was asked to propose the state institutions which would do this on regular basis. He concluded that the CoM did not discuss the draft Law on extradition of persons indicted by the ICTY, explaining that the Justice Ministry submitted entirely new draft.

<p>Nikolic turns himself to ICTY</p>	<p>FTV – ICTY indictee, former security official of the RS Army's Zvornik Brigade, Drago Nikolic, departed to Hague on Thursday. Nikolic is indicted for genocide, crimes against humanity and violating laws and customs of war in Srebrenica in 1995. **NATO rejects

RTRS by Zorica Rulj – NATO has rejected the claim for compensations to the Orthodox priest **Jeremija Starovlah** and his son **Aleksandar**, who sustained the injuries in the SFOR action of searching for PIFWCs last April in Pale. Their attorney, **Miljkan Pucar**, stated that his clients will submit an appeal to this decision and adds that they will turn to the Governments of soldiers who participated in the action. Starovlah wouldn't comment the NATO decision, however RTRS reporter comments that they were informed that Starovlah family is highly disappointed with the decision. **Mitar Tanasic** priest of Mitropolija Dabrobosanska says that this decision shows the relation of NATO towards Serb Orthodox Church. **Derek Chapman**, spokesman of NATO in Sarajevo stated they currently negotiate with Starovlah family and therefore no final decision has been made. Sarac</u> – During the past two months there have been intensified activities on establishment and training of (para)military formations that would be engaged in creation of 1992 Bosnia-like chaos in case of holding of successful referendum for Montenegro independence. One of the most wanted ICTY indictees Ratko Mladic has allegedly been involved in these activities launched at the order of Serbian PM Vojislav Kostunica. FTV, Nezavisne novine pg 5 'EU welcomed more frequent voluntary surrenders to the Hague' by RTS – The European Union welcomes the trend of the frequent voluntary transfers and departures of the persons indicted for war crimes to the Hague, as of those from Serbia-Montenegro, including Kosovo, as well as those from BiH, was announced on Thursday by the Luxembourg EU Presidency. The cooperation of all Western Balkans countries with the Hague Tribunal represents the essential condition for their further EU integration, as it was stated in the announcement issued after the first day of the meeting between the EU diplomatic chiefs.

BHT 1 – Commenting EU's decision to postpone SAA negotiations with Croatia, SNSD President, **Milorad Dodik**, said that this was a clear message from EU: *"We cannot block our way to the European integrations, I think that extradition of the war crimes indictees goes very slowly."*

The author also criticizes the FBiH President and HDZ Vice President, **Niko Lozancic**, who earlier this week called on Covic not to step down, saying that by doing so, Lozancic is labelling the HDZ as a party that does not respect the rule of law and provokes a war with the IC. Court revokes
decision in
Alijagic case**

Dnevni Avaz pg 4 'Trial in Alijagic case to be renewed' by A.M. – The RS Supreme Court has cancelled the decision of the Trebinje District Court in case "Alijagic" and return it to the judiciary for a renewal, stated Head of Trebinje Municipality, **Dobroslav Cuk**. He added that the municipal bank account has been unblocked. Trebinje Court awarded brothers Alijagic 34 million KM as compensation for war damage which caused the blockade of the municipal account on January 11, and Cuk informed that to date 740.000 KM were transferred to the account of Alijagic brothers. **Salih Alijagic** states for DA that obviously Supreme Court was under the pressure, as it brought the decision in a record short time while other similar cases await for procedure for over a year. He noted that this brought the decision back to beginning, concluding: *"I am certain, just like the first time, it would take 5 years to bring the verdict. And than, this can repeat this."*

Apparently, the Special Department for organized crime of the BiH Prosecution has intensified an investigation against Cengic in last few months because of alleged financial illegalities and involvement in organized crime. In this context, DL reports that competent bodies in the FBIH have already established that Cengic had already taken at least 8 million US\$ from donations that were sent during the war to Bosniaks in BiH from Islamic countries via the Third World Relief Agency (TWRA).</p>

Orahovac, **Oslobodjenje** gp 6 'Jelavic, Covic, Prce and Luzanski were protected by fictitious names' by A.N., **Dnevni List**, pg 3, mentioned on front 'Jelavic, Covic, Prce and Luzanski used false names in the bank', by Erna Mackic, **Slobodna Dalmacija** pg 16, mentioned on cover 'Covic, Andric and Prce had secret accounts' by Z. Tulic, **Nezavisne Novine** pg 2, announced on cover 'Money was given to politicians, judges, ministers, prosecutors...' by R. Cengic – At the trial against former HDZ President, **Ante Jelavic**, in the "Hercegovacka bank" case, a witness, Deputy Provisional Administrator for the 'Hercegovacka Bank', **Marina Bogojevic**, confirmed on Thursday that Jelavic, **Miroslav Prce**, **Dragan Covic** and **Ivo Andric Luzanski** had bank accounts on false names. Employee in the HB **Julijana Cubela**, who changed the names, stated before the court that they did it in order to prevent that someone from the bank's employees publishes the amount of deposits of the high-ranked Croat officials. Asked whether the aforementioned officials asked the bank to do it, Cubela said that they did not and that the people from the bank did it by themselves. Witness Bogojevic also stated that Mostar-based "Mondo" company transferred 1 million KM to the accounts of 258 persons in 1999, and aforementioned HDZ officials were also among these persons.

<p>Fagus owner was arrested</p>	<p>RTRS by <u>Sinisa Mihailovic</u> – Police confirmed on Thursday that the owner of company Fagus Miroslav Malijevic has been arrested. He is suspected of tax evasion and misuse of company accounts. Police searched the building of the company's administration on Wednesday and confiscated business related documentation. Unofficial sources say that the entire case is connected to audit report carried out for Srpske Sumo. The report mentions connections that Malijevic had with RSNA member Velimir Sakan. Sakan is also mentioned in the affair of dismissal of chief of Kotor Varos police station Zoran Jotanovic and suspension of police officer Jovica Djuric, who confiscated Fagus truck.</p> <p>Sakan denied all allegations over the telephone. Disputed establishment of Sarajevo City Council: Decision to be made by BiH Constitutional Court?

RTSR by Marina Marjanovic – Head of Vukosavlje municipality, **Amir Zahirovic**, appealed on the RS National Assembly Speaker **Dusan Stojicic** for assistance after the municipal account has been blocked. The municipality faced with this istuation after the court ruling which authorized the pay out of about 600.000 BAM to the favour the company “Doboj Putevi” for works they carried out in 2002. Zahirovic says that Vukosavlje is a small municipality that mostly consists of refugees and returnees. Stojicic says that RS Government needs to help Vukosavlje, adding this has happened due to irresponsible work of the municipal leadership [SNSD].

Nezavisne novine pg 3 ‘SNSD: Stojicic is creating a negative political climate’ by V. P. – The Chairman of Vukosavlje Municipal Board of SNSD party, **Rajko Bozic**, has stated it was unacceptable to let the parties on power to create a bad political climate and accuse former SNSD authority of the bad position of Vukosavlje.

Slobodna Bosna pgs 22-26 'Entities to be abolished; European BiH to be composed of five economic regions' Asim Metiljevic – The latest and the recent Neum meeting of leaders of the ruling political parties in BiH showed clearly that there were no consensus inside the country on the need of constitutional and especially territorial re-arrangement of BiH. A few weeks later the Venice Commission, a respectable non-governmental organization, sent a message indirectly subliming actual political will of the European diplomatic circles: *"The current BiH Constitution is anachronistic and with such constitutional structure BiH cannot count on admission into European Union."* However, according to the author, the transition of BiH from the Dayton to the Brussels phase is discretely being realized through establishment of the five economic regions, which actually represent a foundation for new constitutional and territorial re-arrangement of BiH. It is about ARDA – Northwestern Region, NERDA – Northeastern Region, REDAH – Herzegovina Region, REZ-RDA – Central BiH Region and SERDA – Sarajevo Region that have been officially promoted by EC Delegation in BiH and BiH Council of Ministers.
