Reactions to HR/US Govt measures

Mladen Ivanic resigns, all other PDP members in state authorities to resign by Tuesday

Vecernje novosti cover and pg. 5 'There is no BiH without Srpska' by M. Labus – All Ministers and Deputy Ministers at BiH CoM, who are members of PDP, have resigned or will resign latest by Tuesday, as it was decided at a session of the Main Board of PDP party held in Banja Luka on Saturday.

BHT 1 – BiH Foreign Affair Minister, **Mladen Ivanic**, submitted his written resignation to the Chair of the BiH Council of Ministers, **Adnan Terzic**, following the measures against RS officials announced by the HR **Paddy Ashdown** and US Government. He also announced resignations of the BIH Minister of Transport and Telecommunications **Branko Dokic** and BIH Deputy Minister of Civil Affairs **Zoran Tesanovic**. Mladen Ivanic commented: *"We believe that the political atmosphere created has been directed against PDP, because this party always clear stance of supporting the reforms, but also defending the constitutional position of RS."* Speaker of the BiH House of Peoples, **Goran Milojevic**, stated that he is also ready to resign, but he will wait due to specific decision-making process in HoP. Ivanic emphasized that PDP is aware of the importance of cooperation with ICTY and claimed that party has done everything possible to meet this obligation. However the party condemned HR's efforts to use ICTY for constitutional changes in BiH. PDP announced that they will participate the meeting of Serb parties organized by RS President **Dragan Cavic** on Monday, as well as the establishment of the new government and plans to overcome this crisis.

Dnevni List cover pg splash and pgs 2 and 3 'BiH CoM before breakdown' by N. Bise – Goran Milojevic stated: *'Further PDP moves will depend to a great extent on the conclusion which should be passed at the meeting of representatives of all RS parties with RS President **Dragan Cavic**.'*

FTV – *"We have done everything for BIH's association with EU, but we can't imagine BiH in EU without RS. PDP believes that a part of High Representative's decisions, which oversteps constitutional status, is not acceptable for us and it obligates all PDP members not to implement it in their work,"* said Ivanic.

RTRS – *"HR put himself in a function of accomplishing the goals of only Bosniak people and its strongest party SDA",* said Ivanic.

<p>Terzic: Ivanic showed seriousness and responsibility, but others should not withdraw</p>	<p>RTRS, Dnevni List pg 3 'Ivanic showed seriousness and responsibility' by I.G., EuroBlic, cover and pg. 3 'Mladen Ivanic too has resigned' by <u>Tijana Veselinovic</u>– BiH Council of Ministers chairman Adnan Terzic stated that he was pleased with the fact that Mladen Ivanic resigned from his position of BiH Foreign Minister, adding that it showed that Ivanic is a serious and responsible minister. However, he added if Ministers and deputies from RS leave CoM that a crisis will occur in that institution.</p> <p>FTV – Terzic also added that he believes that the decision to resign was made too emotionally, stressing he hopes RS officials will reconsider it more rationally. According to Terzic, there are different suggestions on possible solution for political crisis, such as changes at CoM, establishing of a new majority at BIH Parliament Assembly and even new elections. Stressing he is willing to accept any proposal, Terzic warned RS officials that none of the solutions can postpone the deadline for implementation of reforms by April 2005. Otherwise, says Terzic, RS will be the only one to take the consequences.</p> <p>BHT 1 by <u>Almira Huseinovic</u> – In an interview to BHT 1, Terzic assessed that the PDP is not so strong party to cause a crisis of the BiH executive authorities. Terzic also said that SNSD's proposal for extraordinary elections is an attempt to transfer obligations of RS to state level.</p> <p>Dnevni list pg 3 'Ivanic showed seriousness and responsibility' – Terzic concludes that there is a tendency among the politicians of RS, but excluding Ivanic, to try to transfer the crisis to the BiH level in order to buy time as they are not dealing with the key issues.</p> <p>Dnevni Avaz pg 5 'Crisis in the authorities will not be long-term' by <u>M. Kukan</u> – Terzic said for DA that he was still not sure whether Ivanic's resignation was irrevocable, adding that he doesn't believe that the current crisis would be long-term and eventually demand from him to search for new governing partners.</p>

<p>HR: resignations could be political game, but dangerous one and damaging for RS citizens</p>	<p>NTV Hayat by <u>Senad Hadzifejzovic</u> – In an interview to NTV Hayat, the High Representative Paddy Ashdown was asked whether submitted and announced resignations of politicians from RS are a political game, to which he answered that they could be, adding they are dangerous and that they could cause delays in reforms and integrations, adding that the biggest damage will be caused to RS citizens. HR stressed he will not change his final position, and that is that BiH must cooperate with ICTY stressing resignations can't change that. Asked to comment to the statement by RS President, Dragan Cavic, that this situation could cause homogenization of peoples with possible severe consequences, Ashdown said he believes Cavic said this out of anger, adding that there is no chance that 1992 will repeat, stressing that everyone should concentrate on future and underlying RS has not other future but the one to be part of BiH. On the calls for extraordinary elections, HR commented they are not in the interests of BiH since this would also further delay process of joining Euro-Atlantic integrations. In 'Face to face' feature, Ashdown also answered to the questions by the citizens. He stressed that latest measures had no intention to cause any tensions among citizens in RS. Answering to several questions on constitutional changes in BiH, HR stressed that this can be done only by the BiH citizens and not him. HR said that he believes that in ten or fifteen years BiH will either have no entities, or they will be reduced to smallest possible level, explaining that this can happen only when people feel safe enough to allow that and with full agreement of all peoples.</p>

A priority is to ensure meeting all given, necessary steps, and the representatives of the authorities in this country still have capacities to do so,"</i> stated OHR Spokesperson Kevin Sullivan .</p> <p>RTRS, EuroBlic, pg. 3 'Priorities remain the same' <u>not signed</u>– Sullivan says that negotiations on Association and Stabilization have to move forward and adds that RS authorities still have the responsibility to take necessary steps in order to meet their obligations.</p> <p>RTRS – RTRS carries that Paddy Ashdown announced in the interview with Nezavisne Novine that even more rigorous measures will be carried out against RS if it continues to disrespect Dayton Agreement. He doesn't exclude the abolishment of RS, says RTRS.</p>

<p>BHT 1: Dodik: CoM has no more legality; Paravac: BiH in deep political crisis</p>	<p>BHT 1 by <u>Sanita Lisica</u> – Journalist comments that a number of politicians believe that the resignations of BiH Foreign Affairs Minister and announcements of resignations of other BiH Ministers from RS could cause a political crisis in the BiH Council of Ministers. Ivanic's resign was expected after the decision of US government to ban PDP and SDS officials. However, this could become a problem for BiH CoM. Milorad Dodik, SNSD leader, believes that the problems at CoM will occur very soon, adding that the Council of Ministers lead by Adnan Terzic doesn't have a legality and that a new solution must be found. Mirsad Ceman, Chairman of Constitutional Commission at BiH Parliament, stated that there will be no problems if Ivanic's resignation remains the only one, adding resignations of other ministers would not be beneficial for RS and rest of the BiH citizens. Chairman of the BiH Presidency, Borislav Paravac, stated that announced resignations of the PDP officials leads BiH into a deep political crisis without visible solutions. According to political analysts, new Foreign Minister could also be PDP member, despite of present political crisis within this party.</p> <p>RTRS – journalist commented that only PDP members resigned which draws the question of relation between SDS and PDP.</p> <p>Oslobodjenje pg 4 'Crisis in BiH institutions' – carries Paravac's statement. <p>FTV: RS parties to form 'Govt of national unity'; Paravac submitted sealed resignation to SDS</p>	<p>FTV – RS President, Dragan Cavic, invited all RS parties to meet on Monday in order to discuss the future of RS government and work of BiH institutions. According to unofficial information, this meeting will establish a "Government of national unity", in order to postpone the implementation of international obligations for as long as possible. Also according to unofficial information, SDS will withdraw their members from BiH institutions. The chairman of the BiH Presidency, Borislav Paravac, said today that his sealed resignation is with the SDS and if it calls for him to resign he will respect the decision of the party. In his statement for FENA news agency, Paravac said that he expects SDS to follow and react adequately to the existing situation. <p>SNSD says it will present plan for exit from crisis on Monday</p>	<p>Oslobodjenje pg 4 'Tomorrow, SNSD's plan for exit from crisis' by <u>S.Se</u> – SNSD leader, Milorad Dodik, stated that this party will present the plan for the exit from current crisis at the Monday's meeting of RS parties organized by RS President Dragan Cavic. <i>"There is a need for new beginning of the international affirmation, importance and role of RS. That, above everything, means the cooperation with the ICTY, and this can be ensured only by those people who have flawless international credibility,"</i> stated Dodik for Oslobodjenje. He repeated that the crisis would be solved through extraordinary elections, as SNSD would exclude possibility of cooperating with SDA following the PDP and, as Dodik says, expected SDS withdrawals.</p>
<p>Tihic: RS politicians do not understand HR decisions are in interests of all citizens</p>	<p>Oslobodjenje pg 4 'I hope reason will win' by <u>S. Sehercehajic</u> – Commenting to the announced withdrawal of SDS ministers from CoM, the member of BiH Presidency, Sulejman Tihic, said that this was unrealistic adding that such announcements were a <i>"result of the RS politician's lack of understanding that the latest HR decisions were in the interests of the RS and BiH citizens."</i> In his statement for daily, Tihic added he hopes that RS politicians will not make decision which would jeopardize functioning of the authorities at the state level. SDS withdrawal would be a violation of the Dayton Peace Agreement, says Tihic, and postponements of the obligations RS undertook with this accord. <p>Novakovic of SDS says IC should take responsibility for situation in BiH</p>	<p>Dnevni List cover pg splash and pgs 2 and 3 'BiH CoM before breakdown' by <u>N. Bise</u> – Commenting on Ivanic's resignation SDS representative in the BiH Parliamentary Assembly Momcilo Novakovic stated that Ivanic's resignation is a logical move and he added: <i>'I believe that the crisis will deepen and that resignations of some other members of the BiH Council of Ministers are possible.'</i> Novakovic believes that the HR used up all possibilities he had. Novakovic also said: <i>'The International Community must take over absolute responsibility for everything that happens in BiH and say in public that this is about the protectorate that they (the IC) introduced.'</i></p>

Glibusic</u> – Commenting on the HR's decision BiH Minister of Civic Affairs Safet Halilovic stated: <i>'The HR has taken minimal measures when he removed some Heads. This is not the right response to non-implementation of the Dayton Peace Accord at all and I would say that the HR's move damages more BiH than the RS.'</i></p>
<p>DSS: HR decisions will radicalize political situation</p>	<p>EuroBlic, pg. 3 'DSS severe consequences' by <u>Beta</u>, Vecernje Novosti, pg. 5 'DSS: wrong' <u>not signed</u> – Democratic Party of Serbia (DSS) has assessed that the decisions of High Representative Paddy Ashdown would not contribute to the regional stability but would only radicalize political situation. DSS emphasized that the measures brought by HR would have severe consequences and these measures represent yet another wrong step in the current complex political circumstances.</p>

European diplomatic officials think that, at the moment, it is the most important that RS President Dragan Cavic takes the right stance and they think he <i>'should not resign but he should take the responsibility for newly created situation'</i>. Asked to comment on assessments of some diplomatic sources that have stated HR Ashdown has used the strictest measures, European diplomats in Brussels have said that <i>'it is also true that Ashdown was under the strictest pressure of USA'</i>.</p>

She also arguments that resignations were not a respond to HR's measures, but to the US Government's decision to ban PDP and SDS officials to enter US. Noting that she was glad this happened so HR Paddy Ashdown can see who were the 'reformers' he worked with to change situation in BiH, Kurtovic also notes that it is true this will have negative consequences for BiH citizens who now cannot expect some country to lessen visa regime. Concluding that sanctions will most probably not change much, Kurtovic says: <i>"And were we stand now? Again, at the beginning. Seeking new reformers."</i></p>

<p>DA op-ed argues abolishment of RS has started</p>	<p>Dnevni Avaz pg 3 'Has abolishment of RS started?' op-ed by <u>Edina Sarac</u> – Editorial reads that the measures by HR and US are the harshest the international community imposed against RS up to date. She also notes that these measures showed that HR and US will not accept anybody, regardless to their position, to mess about with them. She further argues that measures ruined PDP credibility and made more space for SNSD. However, authority says that the hardest decision for RS is to abolish entities' Defence and Internal Affairs Ministries. <i>"Already now we can see the indications of the two processes launched on 16 December – obliteration of RS and its isolation,"</i> says the author. <i>"True, decisions could lead to larger political crisis in at both entity and state levels. Thus, it is left to be seen whether individuals on power in this country will know how to act in extraordinary situation and make moves best for this country and its citizens, leaving aside their own and party's interests,"</i> concludes the editorial.</p>

<p>Ashdown: Mladic was assisted by RS authorities and Army</p>	<p>Oslobodjenje pg 3 'RS authorities are allied with war criminals' by Fena – The HR Paddy Ashdown reiterated on Friday that ICTY indictee, Ratko Mladic, was in Han Pijesak this year and added that Mladic could not be hidden there without the cooperation with the RS Army and institutions of RS. In a statement for RTRS, Ashdown said these was reliable information, and not just journalists speculations. The Government in BiH has 18 ministries, among them the Ministry for Inter-national and Inter-religious Relations, the Ministry for Youth and the Ministry for Diaspora and Cooperation with NGOs. The Government's goal is to prepare its own vision, conception and development strategy of BiH, which will be offered to citizens and those political parties backing the Government prior to the 2006 elections.</p>

<p>SDP Main Board in session: OHR reforms give no results</p>	<p>BHT1, Oslobođenje pgs 4-5 ‘Reforms are still just a letter on the paper’ <u>not signed</u> – SDP Main Board held session on Friday concluding that the implementation of all reformatory laws prepared by the OHR, with pressures on carriers of the reforms – SDS, SDA, HDZ, PDP and SBiH – was nothing but a letter on a paper. SDP said it is finally a time for HR and the governing coalition to start implementing promised changes, including the assured cooperation with the ICTY. SDP members also concluded that the current situation, for which both ruling parties and HR were responsible, shows that crisis of authorities takes root not only in RS but entire BiH.</p>

Johnson warned that the new members of the Government have to commit to building of trust among peoples, to support trial to persons indicted for war crimes, and fight against organized crime.</p>

**NTV Hayat's
update to
Alijagic case**

NTV Hayat comments by Senad Hadzifejzovic
– NTV Hayat broadcast feature on the verdict of the Trebinje District Court who ruled in favor of **Salih Alijagic** and ordered Municipality Trebinje to pay 36 million KM of compensation for war damage. After municipality has failed to pay out the amount within deadline, its bank account should have been frozen. However, as Hadzifejzovic comments, at the time the politics got involved, i.e. RS Government, and it blocked the Court's ruling. He further stressed that the international community encourages independent judiciary, but once judges become independent the IC allows politics to get involved concluding that this is hypocritical. Prosecution in Trebinje considers the ruling to be final and obligatory. Howeverm **Stevo Pamucina**, justice at the Trebinje District Court said that the audit of the case was demanded by the by Municipality Trebinje and RS authorities. According to Hayat, RS Supreme Court accepted to carry out audit following anonymous demand and has put aside all other cases. **Dobroslav Cuk**, Major of Municipality Trebinje, admitted that Alijagic was robbed, however added that he should seek responsibility of those who have committed this. According to Hayat, Cuk is also a on a list of 50 persons suspected for war crime of ethnical cleansing and genocide in Eastern Herzegovina and that he would be tried at the Mostar Court.

BH Steel to hold warning strike on Tuesday	BHT1, FTV, Oslobodjenje pg 8 'Two-hours warning strike on Tuesday', mentioned on cover, by <u>Mi.D.</u> , Dnevni Avaz pg 2 'BH Steel Trade Union announces two-hours strike on Tuesday' by <u>A. Dzonlic</u> , Dnevni List pg 4 'Warning strike scheduled in BH Steel' by <u>Zeda</u> – The Trade Union of the 'BH Steel' company announced two-hours strike to be held on Tuesday. The strike is a warning for the new owner, Indian-British company 'LNM' due to failure to meet obligations within 'the social package'. Chair of the Union, Islam Imamovic , stated that LNM employed 12 people less than promised in December, that November salaries were not increased as agreed and failure to pay overdue salaries. Union says that unless LNM meets these demands, they will face with overall strike to take place as long as requests are fulfilled.

<p>DA on privatisation in FBiH</p>	<p>Dnevni Avaz pg 2 'Mehmedovic: not to allow pull out of capital from BiH', mentioned on cover, by <u>A. Basic</u> – Article reads despite the fact that FBiH Government on Thursday established the changes to the Law on privatization with an aim to speed up this process, the heads of the caucuses in the FBiH Parliament still have divided opinion on this issue. Head of SDA Caucus, Semsudin Mehmedovic, says that nobody should be prevented from participating the privatisation, but that situation of the company must be looked into it. <i>"Of course, it must not be allowed to pull out capital from BiH,"</i> adds Mehmedovic. Head of HDZ caucus, Ivan Madunic, says that it is clear that there is a wish to prevent foreign state companies to participate in the privatisation of enterprises in FBiH.
