**Gregorian at
RSNA session**

RTRS – Co-Chairman of the Defence Reform Commission in BiH **Raffi Gregorian** spoke at the session of RS National Assembly on Friday. Gregorian gave a clear message, which says that there is no room for entity Defence Ministries. *"We have no hidden agenda with respect to the RS and this is not about changing the RS or abolishing it in any way"*, stated Gregorian. Gregorian stated that this reform will not be imposed but warned that the path towards EU and NATO depends on their decision. **RHB, TV Pink, NTV Hayat, FTV, Dnevni Avaz** pg 2 'NATO will not be changing because of BiH, mentioned on cover 'Mladic has helpers in RS Army' by J. Stojanovic, **Oslobodjenje** pg 4 'Individuals from RS under control of Belgrade' not signed and pg 8 'BiH is not ready for PfP yet' by O. Vukovic, **Nezavisne Novine** pg 4 'There are still no conditions for admission to PfP' by V. Popvic and 'Gregorian: Mladic under control of Belgrade' not signed, **Dnevni List** pg 7 'MPs against abolishment of Ministry of Defence' by A. Beus carry similar reports. TV Pink also carries BiH Minister of Defence, **Nikola Radovanovic** as saying: *"I think that Gregorian had given his vision on defence reform, and I have nothing to add"*, said.

RTRS carried report by Daliborka Predragovic from the RS National Assembly session, which says that the RS Government presented its conclusions regarding defence reform to RS NA deputies. RS Government feels that abolishment of the RS Defence Ministry is unacceptable and it stands for professional BiH Army. RS Government is also asking RS members of the DRC to actively participate in the work of the Commission. Members of SDS, SRS and Club Centre supported the conclusions of the Government whilst SNSD feels that the Government only copied SDS conclusions. DNS feels that citizens should voice their opinion on the defence reform through a referendum. RS PM **Pero Bukejlovic** concluded that the Government adopted these conclusions unanimously. RS NA should make a stance on these conclusions during the session.

<p>Cavic on defence reform</p>	<p>NTV Hayat – On Friday, RS President Dragan Cavic said in the RS Parliament that he is against the defence reform since BiH is not in the Partnership for Peace yet and that abolishment of RS MoD makes no sense.</p> <p><i>“I am aware of the fact that I will be considered as a man who is obstructing Defence Reform in RS but this entity needs its own army. I cannot remove from the office Mr Raffi Gregorian or HR Paddy Ashdown but they can remove me from the office”</i> said Dragan Cavic. <i>“That’s not for me to comment; I focus just on the work of the Defence Reform Commission and for something alike. You’ll have to ask the HR about that”</i> said Raffi Gregorian, Co-Chair of the Defence Reform Commission. ATV Banja Luka presenter stated that Gregorian wasted time talking about unfulfilled conditions of RS in connection to the Partnership for Peace and the presenter added that the closing words were about high – ranking officers from RS Army that helped Ratko Mladic in hiding from the authorities. BiH Bishops' Conference harshly criticizes DPA

Vasilj- A3 day session of the BiH Bishops' Conference ended in Mostar on Friday. BiH Archbishop, **Vinko Puljic**, is newly elected President of the BiH Bishops' Conference. Members of the conference gave a joint statement, which was read by Bishop **Ratko Peric** at the press conference in Mostar. The statement said that obvious injustices occurred with implementation of the Dayton Peace Accord and that human rights of the Croat people have been endangered on the ground of it. According to the statement, due to implementation of the DPA THE Catholic population in BIH has been reduced by half. It also said that international representatives in BiH are considered as representatives of foreign protectorate and seekers of own interest. The statement calls upon politicians to establish a just legal system and abolish the organisation of the country that was made on the ground of genocide and ethnic cleansing.

peoples demands that. Fulfilling of that
decree as well as the election of the Mayor
and deputy Chair of the City Council is
postponed until further notice.

BHT 1, NTV Hayat, FTV, RTRS, Dnevni Avaz cover pg splash 'Monster was going through village killing people' and pg 27 'Vojislav Planincic killed 4 persons by gun' by E.Ha., **Oslobodjenje** pg 43, mentioned on cover 'Old man killed 4 neighbours by gun' by D. Pavlovic, **Nezavisne Novine** cover pg splash 'He killed 4 neighbours' and pg 3 'Old man killed 4 neighbours by gun' by D. Muminovic, **Dnevni List** pg 36, mentioned on cover 'Old man killed 4 neighbours' by M. Maric, **Vecernji List** pg 21, mentioned on cover 'Old man killed 3 women and one man' by R. Soldo – 4 persons were killed on Friday morning in village Bereg near Sokolac. Victims are three women and one man. Local police identified and arrested a suspect, 71-years-old **Vojislav Planincic**. According to unofficial information, Planincic was walking around the village and shot anyone he saw. The police investigation is ongoing.

**Strike of
'Breza'

BHT 1 – Around 500 miners from coal mine “Breza” protested on Friday in front of the FBiH Government building in Sarajevo due to poor working conditions and low salaries. After negotiations with representatives of the FBiH Ministry of Energy, Industry and Mining that lasted the whole day, the agreement was reached, but the miners are still dissatisfied, reports BHT. The FBiH Government planned to support “Breza” colliery with 1,4 million KM this year. First part of these funds will be transferred to the mine next week and the rest of it will be transferred during April, informed Assistant to the FBiH Minister of Energy, Industry and Mining, **Ismet Sokolovic**. TV PINK – RS Ministry of Interior workers are facing difficult situation. During the session they held on Friday in Banjaluka, which RS Minister of Interior, **Darko Matijasevic** attended as well, it was discussed on possible solutions of the issue. *"We have agreed that February salaries to the workers should be as the ones given in December 2004, which means that the salaries are not going to be reduced"*, said Matijasevic. Matijasevic added that a concrete analyse on how to solve the issue, should be made within a month.

On the same issue **RTRS** carries that the RS MoI employees called upon RS policemen to go on a general strike on 12th of April. Chairman of Union of RS MoI employees **Dusko Jandric** says that RS policemen have the lowest salaries in the region. RS Minister of Interior **Darko Matijasevic** stated that February salary will be increased to the level of December one. He also stated that the RS MoI asked RS Government for a 20% salary increase. RS MoI intends to find a solution for improving the social status of RS MoI employees and the Union on the other hand states that they will continue their fight.
