FBiH HoR to discuss amendments to the Law on Privatization of Apartments, initiative for no confidence vote to the Government

who live in nationalized flats' not signed, **FENA** – At a session scheduled for Tuesday, the FBiH House of Representatives is expected to discuss amendments to the Law on Privatisation of Apartments that include provisions to allow purchase of nationalized apartments by the current occupancy right holders. Following the announcements of the session, the citizens who live in nationalized apartments will hold a peaceful protest in front of the Parliament building. The protest was organized by "Dom" Association due to permanent delay in adoption of these amendments. The protests will, as announced, begin one hour before the official beginning of the session. HDZ Caucus Head Ivan Madunic however says that his party will vote against the amendments because that would mean legalization of robbery. "The nationalized apartments must be returned to their initial owners," said Madunic. The apartments were nationalized after the second world war by then communist government. Party for BiH believes that the issue of nationalized apartments must be resolved as SDA still does not have official position on the amendments. **Oslobodjenje** pg 7, mentioned on cover 'Ruling parties consider opposition arguments insufficient' — The agenda of the session also includes the proposal made by 23 representatives of the opposition, who have requested a vote of no confidence to the current FBiH Government. According to NN inset 'OHR: Probation does not disqualify Dokic', Sanela Tunovic, OHR Spokesperson, stated that "Branko Dokic tendered his resignation in order to defend himself before the courts and uphold the principle of high standards in public life. He continued to work in technical mandate, until he officially delegated his authorities to his deputy by declaring himself to be 'absent'. The court did not subsequently find him quilty of abuse of office, but found him guilty for a lesser offense. Such a sentence does not legally disgualify him from holding elected office. However, it is now up to the CoM to decide how to proceed."

"Bringing negotiations down to entities government again, without presence of the international community, would be to award those responsible for a halt in reform," says Tihic.
