authorities have been grooming witnesses ahead of their testimonies before the commission. Information on the Srebrenica tragedy does exist, Branko Todorovic has said. He also said that this information cannot be gleaned and that the institutions of the RS are ready to submit it to the Srebrenica commission only under pressure from certain international community institutions. "It is mainly hidden and is still almost totally unavailable to both the commission and investigative bodies. Also, a part of this documented evidence – according to unchecked claims – has been probably transferred to Serbia," said Todorovic. According to Todorovic, new information supplied to the commission

investigating the Srebrenica events by the RS authorities is almost non-existent. However, there are some worrying findings. "We have also recently received information that the relevant authorities in the RS have been grooming some members of the army and police, who are being questioned, ahead of their testimonies and that the statements they make before the commissions have been actually prepared for them, are not authentic and do not contain anything new whatsoever," Todorovic added. Todorovic called on the president of the Srebrenica commission to tell the BiH public in clear terms whether the commission can discover something new and glean the total truth about the Srebrenica tragedy.
