Political crisis following HR/US Govt measures

RS parties agree: 'Crisis in BiH institutions is not in our interests'; Mikerevic's resignation accepted

RHB, FTV – At the meeting with the RS President Dragan Cavic, representatives of the political parties in RS agreed that it was not in their interests to cause crisis in BiH. The meeting, organized by Cavic to take common stance on measures announced by HR and US Government on 16 December, was attended by the RSNA Speaker Dusan Stojicic, RS PM in resignation Dragan Mikerevic, BiH HoR Deputy Speaker Nikola Spiric, BiH HoP Speaker Goran Milojevic,
Milorad Dodik from SNSD, Mladen Ivanic of PDP, Marko Pavic of DNS, Petar Djokic of RS SP, and Milanko Mihajlica from SRS. Mikerevic's resignation was accepted and participants all reached census to resolve the crisis as soon as possible. The mandatory for the new Government was not proposed, and Mikerevic will continue performing this duty "technically" for the time being. Cavic also announced that talks would also be continued with the other political parties in the RS. Unofficially, RHB carries that Milorad Dodik will be the

new PM.

BHT 1 by Boris Gagic – Cavic said: "[Mikerevic] resignation has been submitted to RSNA; from the moment RS NA adopts... it, deadline, as regulated by the Constitution, under which new PM should be nominated, is 10 days...The existing crisis should not be spread on extremely difficult and serious issue – issue of cooperation with ICTY, and we all supported the fact that Interior Ministry and other institutions should continue their work no matter how the situation is gong to develop...RS officials want to participate in the

processes; they want to participate in the reforms, but in the way which is the result of compromise... suiting all." BHT 1 journalist comments that Cavic denied the meeting was a 'confidential, Serb conspiracy'. Cavic invited representatives of other parties to meet him today, including SDA, SPD and SBiH.

RTRS by Sinisa Mihailovic- Cavic said RS parties' stance on HR measures will be constructive, not destructive. "We want to fight anyone who wants to impose or push solutions upon us that are opposing Dayton order of BIH", says Cavic. Dodik stated that cooperation with ICTY has to be accomplished regardless of the crisis. "No one will obstruct the appointment of the new Govt", says Dodik. Asked to comment possibility of his appointment to Prime Minister position, Dodik answered SNSD doesn't not run away from

responsibility.

Olli Rehn meets BiH Presidency, Terzic: current crisis must be overcome RTRS, RHB – EU Enlargement Commissioner Olli Rehn said in Sarajevo on Monday that full cooperation with the ICTY and police reform were two basic conditions which BiH had to meet if it wanted to continue its progress towards the EU and start with the negotiations of Stabilisation and Association Agreement. At the meeting with the members of the BiH Presidency and the Chair of the CoM, Adnan Terzic, Rehn stressed that the current political crisis must be overcome, noting that BiH has a certain European

future.

BHT 1 by Lejla Redzovic- He also noted partial and slow progress with regard to meeting conditions set in the Feasibility study. Terzic added: "We have made great progresses in numerous issues, and we hope that we will manage to do the rest by March 2005."

BiH has the aim to enter EU by 2009, which is in 5 years. Analysers believe that BiH is far from that; they hope that it will take at last 15-20 years for that to happen.

FTV by Zeljko Tica- Rehn stated: "The crucial criteria refer to locating war criminals and their transfers to Den Hag. Efforts have to be made on state level, but on entities' levels as well. This refers to Ratko Mladic and Radovan Karadzic." Talking about meeting with Rehn, the chairman of the BiH Presidency Borislav Paravac said: "We have discussed current BiH circumstances and we stated our opinion that this was just a small internal political crisis, which we are going to solve successfully." Rehn also met with now former BiH Foreign Minister, Mladen Ivanic. Reha said: "We in EU have normal working relations with Ivanic." He did not want to comment whether EU was going to undertake similar measures as US Government and ban SDS and PDP leaderships to enter its countries. Terzic pointed out that International Community had to have harmonized policy.

Dodik and Kondic received 66,000 convertible marks each and the total sum paid out to the officials was 1,494,000 convertible marks. **FTV** – Milorad Dodik said he is surprised by the charges against him. Dodik told journalists in Banja Luka that "some people have been working against me regarding this issue" for the past four years. RTRS - He added that all those who waited for 4 years to destroy him are wrong since his
