A few of the facilities really needed for the country defense purposes will remain opened. This EUFOR program is based on the strong evidence according to which some of these facilities are being used for illegal activities and/or they represent part of the war crime indictees support network.</p>

<p>Political crisis following HR/US Govt measures</p>

<p>RS parties agree: 'Crisis in BiH institutions is not in our interests'; Mikerevic's resignation accepted</p>	<p>RHB, FTV – At the meeting with the RS President Dragan Cavic, representatives of the political parties in RS agreed that it was not in their interests to cause crisis in BiH. The meeting, organized by Cavic to take common stance on measures announced by HR and US Government on 16 December, was attended by the RSNA Speaker Dusan Stojicic, RS PM in resignation Dragan Mikerevic, BiH HoR Deputy Speaker Nikola Spiric, BiH HoP Speaker Goran Milojevic, Milorad Dodik from SNSD, Mladen Ivanic of PDP, Marko Pavic of DNS, Petar Djokic of RS SP, and Milanko Mihajlica from SRS. Mikerevic's resignation was accepted and participants all reached census to resolve the crisis as soon as possible. The mandatory for the new Government was not proposed, and Mikerevic will continue performing this duty "technically" for the time being. Cavic also announced that talks would also be continued with the other political parties in the RS. Unofficially, RHB carries that Milorad Dodik will be the new PM.</p> <p>BHT 1 by <u>Boris Gagic</u> – Cavic said: <i>"[Mikerevic] resignation has been submitted to RSNA; from the moment RS NA adopts... it, deadline, as regulated by the Constitution, under which new PM should be nominated, is 10 days...The existing crisis should not be spread on extremely difficult and serious issue – issue of cooperation with ICTY, and we all supported the fact that Interior Ministry and other institutions should continue their work no matter how the situation is going to develop...RS officials want to participate in the processes; they want to participate in the reforms, but in the way which is the result of compromise... suiting all."</i> BHT 1 journalist comments that Cavic denied the meeting was a 'confidential, Serb conspiracy'. Cavic invited representatives of other parties to meet him today, including SDA, SPD and SBiH.</p> <p>RTRS by <u>Sinisa Mihailovic</u>– Cavic said RS parties' stance on HR measures will be constructive, not destructive. <i>"We want to fight anyone who wants to impose or push solutions upon us that are opposing Dayton order of BIH"</i>, says Cavic. Dodik stated that cooperation with ICTY has to be accomplished regardless of the crisis. <i>"No one will obstruct the appointment of the new Govt"</i>, says Dodik. <p>RTRS int with Dragan Cavic: 'The crisis has to be overcome'</p>	<p>RTRS by <u>Drasko Milinovic</u>— In an interview to RTRS, RS President Dragan Cavic reiterates the messages adopted at the meeting of strongest RS parties on Monday. In addition, Cavic repeats that it was agreed that nobody will act destructively. When it comes to crisis in the Council of Ministers following the reports on resignations by several ministers and/or deputies, Cavic said that the functioning of the CoM at the moment is impossible but emphasized that this crisis has to be overcome. Cavic states that all political parties will define a joint approach towards CoM. Asked about the meeting that RS Vice Presidents Adil Osmanovic and Ivan Tomljenovic are expected to hold today [Tuesday], Cavic says they have a right to do so and added that everyone's opinion must be taken into account. He adding he hopes they will also invite representatives of Serb people, adding that the only reason he invited those parties at the meeting is because they are the strongest and not because he makes any difference between peoples. Cavic says: <i>"We want to solve certain matters together with others but we cannot accept to only nod our heads and accept solutions that were created somewhere else."</i> He concludes that certain goals of some parties from FBiH correspond to work of some parts of IC and adds that RS asks for its position to be acknowledged.</p>

Risojevic</u>, inset 'Terzic received two resignations' – Adnan Terzic, BiH COM Chair, on Monday welcomed the conclusions of the meeting between Dragan Cavic and leaders of political parties from RS describing conclusions as being reasonable and adding: <i>"The current crisis can solely be overcome with the clear head."</i></p>
<p>Osmanovic: 'Gathering of Serb politicians only means going back to the time of Karadzic'</p>	<p>Dnevni Avaz pg 2 'Osmanovic: Gathering of Serb politicians only means going back to the time of Karadzic' by <u>E. Sarac</u> – In a statement for the daily, RS Vice-president Adil Osmanovic said that the political positions presented in the past days by RS President Dragan Cavic did not reflect opinions of the Bosniak and Croat political representatives. <i>"This Entity (RS) cannot be the entity of one people only. The responsibility for its future lies with all of its three constituent peoples,"</i> said Osmanovic adding that the Bosniak and Croat political representatives should have therefore been invited to attend the Monday's meeting at Cavic's office. <i>"I believe that such a gathering of Serb politicians only represents a step back and an attempt to isolate RS in a way in which it was being done during the time of Karadzic,"</i> emphasized Osmanovic.</p>

<p>Updates to resignations in Council of Ministers and Presidency</p>	<p>BHT 1 by <u>Suzana Stambol</u> – The Chair of the BiH Council of Minister Adnan Terzic admits that the CoM is currently in the crisis. He said that he was going to accept all resignations offered, but stressed he believes that the solution should be reached by simple political agreement. Terzic said so far he received resignations by BiH Deputy Civil Affairs Minister Zoran Tesanovic and Mladen Ivanic. Terzic said: <i>“They are handing in resignations for reasons which I find irrational, and I have to accept them. If Serb representatives withdraw from BiH CoM, CoM will be illegitimate, but according to the Law on the Council of Ministers when there is no minister there is the deputy.”</i> HDZ Chairman Barisa Colak said: <i>“I think that this is not in the interests of either ruling or opposition parties. I think that we all have to be aware of the fact that reforms in BiH must not be stopped.”</i> HR Paddy Ashdown commented: <i>“I understand that the latest development made an impact on reforms, but I am serious and I am meant to be taken seriously. Persons responsible for the ongoing situation are those who have not cooperated with ICTY for 9 years now, and they make BiH’s way to European Union impossible.”</i></p> <p>RHB – BiH Presidency President Borislav Paravac stated that he will perform this function until SDS decides otherwise.</p> <p>FTV by <u>Jakov Avram</u>– Terzic said: <i>“No one can deny that the crisis is going on in BiH CoM As well as in FBiH, especially due to the fact that we are faced with issue of adoption of next year’s budget. I think that it is not wise to stop BiH’s admission to European integrations after we had stopped BiH’s admission into Partnership for Peace.”</i> On his resignation, Paravac commented: <i>“SDS has not asked me to resign. We have our resignations in sealed envelops in SDS.”</i></p> <p>RTRS – According to RTRS, in addition to Tesanovic, the resignations were already submitted by both Branko Dokic and Slobodan Kovac. As for BIH Defence Minister Nikola Radovanovic, RTRS was informed from his Cabinet stated that he will act in accordance with his political and functional responsibility. HR stated that all those who feel that his decisions are not in accordance with BIH Constitution can appeal to BIH Constitutional Court.</p> <p>Dnevni Avaz pg 2 ‘SDS and PDP ministers have not resigned after all’ by <u>F. Cardzic</u> – According to DA, nobody but BiH Deputy Civil Affairs Minister Zoran Tesanovic, resigned to the position in CoM. <p>Olli Rehn meets BiH Presidency, Terzic: current crisis must be overcome</p>	<p>RTRS, RHB – EU Enlargement Commissioner Olli Rehn said in Sarajevo on Monday that full cooperation with the ICTY and police reform were two basic conditions which BiH had to meet if it wanted to continue its progress towards the EU and start with the negotiations of Stabilisation and Association Agreement. At the meeting with the members of the BiH Presidency and the Chair of the CoM, Adnan Terzic, Rehn stressed that the current political crisis must be overcome, noting that BiH has a certain European future.</p> <p>BHT 1 by Lejla Redzovic– He also noted partial and slow progress with regard to meeting conditions set in the Feasibility study. Terzic added: <i>“We have made great progresses in numerous issues, and we hope that we will manage to do the rest by March 2005.”</i></p> <p>BiH has the aim to enter EU by 2009, which is in 5 years. Analysts believe that BiH is far from that; they hope that it will take at last 15-20 years for that to happen.</p> <p>FTV by Zeljko Tica– Rehn stated: <i>“The crucial criteria refer to locating war criminals and their transfers to Den Hag. Efforts have to be made on state level, but on entities’ levels as well.
