**Oslobodjenje** pg 7, mentioned on cover, 'Banning 'Lijepa nasa' would devastate our identity' by <u>Antonio Prlenda</u> – In an interview to daily, the FBiH Defence Minister, Miroslav Nikolic, says that playing 'Lijepa nasa' Croatian hymn at the oath taking ceremony in Capljina has not violated the law, adding media politicised entire issuer. He stresses that Law on BiH state hymn and the Law on coat of arms and flag were also fully respected, while the text of the oath was appropriate. Asked is it true that Defence Minister, Nikola **Radovanovic**, has asked from him to stop playing the tune, Nikolic said Radovanovic "suggested for him to consider, according to my [Nikolic's] authorities, whether Lijepa nas will be played or not... I reconsidered it, but have not found a single legal obstacle in the law... I don't see why would somebody mind this... Is that aim to devastate the identity of a people? If the BiH armed forces are to be established this way, that he will come to the stage when Croats will not see this army as theirs." RTRS, BHT1 – Also carry Nikolic stated that Radovanovic only mentioned the change of protocol as a suggestion.

#### Update on case '1<sup>st</sup> BiH criminal organization'

BHT1, FTV, Oslobodjenje 'For embezzlement of 6.5 million KM, probations and fines' by <u>L.S., Dnevni List</u> pg 6 'Trial against Ferid Okic postponed until further notice' <u>by E.</u> <u>Mackic</u> – The BiH Court acquitted Sedinet Karic, Mehmed Salkic, Amira Zahirovic, Eldar Malinic, Novalija Zukic, Senida Karic and Besim Jahic of charges for organized crime,

customs fraud and bribery due to the lack of evidences. However, the accused in a case "Karic" was put on probation due to tax evasion and money laundering while Mehmed Salkic has been acquitted of the same charges. Sedinet and Senida Karic have been sentenced for possessing of illegal weapon. Sedinet Karic, owner of company "Sidoil" has been sentenced to 2 years in prison, but the sentence will not be executed if he does not commit any crime in the period of 4 years. Karic and Zukic have to pay a fine in amount of 1.440.000 KM. "We are not satisfied, who would be satisfied with such amount of money", said Sedinet Karic. Attorney Krstan Simic said that they are going to file an appeal because they believe there was no enough evidences. The Court of BiH estimates that these men damaged FBiH budget for 6 millions KM. BiH Prosecutor, George Halbah announced that he is going to file an appeal because he is not satisfied with the Court's verdict regarding this case. He feels that this verdict is unacceptable. Media have often speculated that Sedient Karic used the company "Sidoil" to illegally importing textile, shoes and some other goods from Hungary and Turkey to BiH, accusing his also of money laundering,

etc.

BHT 1, Glas Srpske pg 2 'End is not in sight' by N. Zelenovic- The decision on transfer of four non-Bosnian inmates found guilty on the charges of war crimes from Zenica to Kula prison has not yet been executed. Decision was made last week by the BiH Justice Minister, Slobodan Kovac, after the inmates were physically attacked by other inmates following the screening of Srebrenica execution snapshots. Assistant to the BiH Justice Minister, Resad Fejzagic, stated that he has no information whether the independent commission established to determine the facts on the incidents in Zenica prison has completed its task. FBiH Ministry will decide on possible transfer after consideration of the report made by this commission. Hayat -The Commission was established by FBiH Justice Minster Borjana Kristo and should have ended it work by the end of the last week.

Dzihanovic explained that proposal does foresee BiH as a centralized and unitary state. Its territorial organization would be founded on municipality, region and state. The state would consist of five regions -Sarajevo , Banja Luka , Zenica, Tuzla and Mostar. The document defines Sarajevo as the capital city of BiH , which encompasses 10 prewar municipalities, and its status would be ordered with a special session. The legislative authority would be exercised by the two-house parliament, executive power would be exercised by the government, and the judiciary would consist of the constitutional, supreme, regional and municipal courts. The state would have a president who would be elected by the parliament with majority of

'I hope we will use this to show the admittance of the crime that was committed, to show true respect and to show BiH can be a country that can leave its past behind it', HR concluded.
