Terzic to address

BH Radio 1 — The Chair of the BiH Council of Ministers, Adnan Terzic, today addresses the parliamentarians of the Council of Europe. Within the regular session of the CoE Parliamentary Assembly, Terzic will speak about the importance of BiH's fully pledged membership in this European institution. Terzic will accent the past reformatory processes and activities aimed at ensuring BiH's timely launch of negotiations for signing a Stabilization and Association Agreement with the EU by the end of the year. Meanwhile, BiH delegation failed to have a joint stance regarding the initiative of their delegation member **Senad Avdic** to offer the text of declaration on Srebrenica to CoE for adoption. Avdic stated he hopes that today delegation will harmonize their different views.

Hearing in Lijanovici case starts on Thursday FENA — The main hearing in the so-called Lijanovici case (against Lijanovici brothers, HDZ President Dragan Covic, President of the BiH Constitutional Court Mate Tadic and professor Zdravko Lucic will start on Thursday.

FBiH HoR in session

RHB, BH Radio 1 by Ljiljana Radl — FBiH House of Representatives has commenced the session today in Sarajevo. Representatives had already adopted the draft Law on Labour Inspections, which should, in words of FBiH Minister of Labour, Radovan Vignjevic, fight illegal labour. HDZ-led coalition has not taken any stance in voting, and the Chair of the Caucus Ivan Madunic compared this law to recently adopted Law on Inspections when Parliament rejected the HDZ amendments which defined the jurisdiction of inspections.

On occasion of the International Day of Refugees, Kebo confirmed over a million refugees returned to BiH. However, Mirhunisa Zukic Chair of BIH Association of refugees and displaced persons says this number is smaller. They both point to the problems returnees are facing after the return to their pre-war homes, such as difficulties in findings jobs. He stresses that Law on BiH state hymn and the Law on coat of arms and flag were also fully respected, while the text of the oath was appropriate. Asked is it true that Defence Minister, Nikola Radovanovic, has asked from him to stop playing the tune, Nikolic said Radovanovic "suggested for him to consider, according to my [Nikolic's] authorities, whether Lijepa nas will be played or not... I reconsidered it, but have not found a single legal obstacle in the law... I don't see why would somebody mind this... Is that aim to devastate the identity of a people? If the BiH armed forces are to be established this way, that he will come to the stage when Croats will not see this army as theirs." RTRS, BHT1 - Also carry Nikolic stated that Radovanovic only mentioned the change of protocol as a suggestion.

Update on case '1st BiH criminal organization' BHT1, FTV, Oslobodjenje 'For embezzlement of 6.5 million KM, probations and fines' by L.S., Dnevni List pg 6 'Trial against Ferid Okic postponed until further notice' by E. Mackic - The BiH Court acquitted Sedinet Karic, Mehmed Salkic, Amira Zahirovic, Eldar Malinic, Novalija Zukic, Senida Karic and Besim Jahic of charges for organized crime, customs fraud and bribery due to the lack of evidences. However, the accused in a case "Karic" was put on probation due to tax evasion and money laundering while Mehmed Salkic has been acquitted of the same charges. Sedinet and Senida Karic have been sentenced for possessing of illegal weapon. Sedinet Karic, owner of company "Sidoil" has been sentenced to 2 years in prison, but the sentence will not be executed if he does not commit any crime in the period of 4 years. Karic and Zukic have to pay a fine in amount of 1.440.000 KM. "We are not satisfied, who would be satisfied with such amount of money", said Sedinet Karic. Attorney Krstan Simic said that they are going to file an appeal because they believe there was no enough evidences. The Court of BiH estimates that these men damaged FBiH budget for 6 millions KM. BiH Prosecutor, George Halbah announced that he is going to file an appeal because he is not satisfied with the Court's verdict regarding this case. He feels that this verdict is unacceptable. Media have often speculated that Sedient Karic used the company "Sidoil" to illegally importing textile, shoes and some other goods from Hungary and Turkey to BiH, accusing his also of money laundering, etc.

BHT 1, Glas Srpske pg 2 'End is not in sight' by N. Zelenovic— The decision on transfer of four non-Bosnian inmates found guilty on the charges of war crimes from Zenica to Kula prison has not yet been executed. Decision was made last week by the BiH Justice Minister, Slobodan **Kovac**, after the inmates were physically attacked by other inmates following the screening of Srebrenica execution snapshots. Assistant to the BiH Justice Minister, Resad Feizagic, stated that he has no information whether the independent commission established to determine the facts on the incidents in Zenica prison has completed its task. FBiH Ministry will decide on possible transfer after consideration of the report made by this commission. Hayat -The Commission was established by FBiH Justice Minster Borjana Kristo and should have ended it work by the end of the last week.

Sarac — Avaz learns that the FBiH Interior Minister, Mevludin Halilovic, submitted late last month a criminal report against the Director of FBiH Police Administration, Zlatko Miletic, accusing him of breaching legal provisions pertaining to purchase of official cars valued at some 1,4 million KMs. Halilovic's report says Miletic made a deal on October 25 last year about taking a loan from the Hypo-Alpe-Adria Bank to purchase 19 vehicles, and Halilovic insists that Miletic breached the corresponding procedure. Miletic reacted by denying all the charges, saying he received the necessary consent from the FBiH Finance Minister Dragan Vrankic on May 6, 2004.

Avaz: Update to 'Leutar case' investigation

S. - Avaz learns that the Chief FBiH Prosecutor, Zdravko Knezevic, after the FBiH President Niko Lozancic requested an urgent investigation that would reveal perpetrator of assassination on late FBiH Deputy Interior Minister Jozo Leutar, requested the FBiH Financial Police to find out who received half a million KMs that were allocated as a reward for revealing of the identity of the killer and find out who issued the order. According to unofficial information, the Financial Police's request, which was forwarded to the FBiH Interior Ministry some 20 days ago, is still with the FBiH MoI because allegedly, the FBiH Police Administration Director, **Zlatko Miletic**, is calling upon official secret, which resulted in no answer to the aforementioned requests. Avaz reminds that the FBiH Finance Ministry paid on April 27, 2001 half a million KMs to an account of an unknown UN official for the help in the Leutar investigation. The latest information say the account was opened in the Raiffeisen Bank, from which protected witness Merim Galijatovic received 237.122 KMs.

Simonovic was charged on 13 June by the District Public Prosecution for violations of international humanitarian law in Brcko in May and June of 1992, seen in torture, inhumane treatment, illegal imprisonment of non-Serb civilians in the Luka concentration camp, infliction of physical suffering and rape. Simonovic was arrested on December 29 last year, and has been in custody since. The first hearing has been announced for 21 June when he will plea on indictment.

240 bodies exhumed near Zvornik

BHT 1, Dnevni Avaz pg 3 'They tortured dead too' by A.H. Oslobodjenje pg 2 '240 incomplete bodies exhumed', mentioned on cover, by <u>S. Smajlovic</u> – Exhumation work on the mass grave in Liplje near Zvornik ended on Monday, with 240 incomplete bodies and 168 minor bones unrelated to the bodies found, the Tuzla County prosecutor's office has said. The victims, who hail from Srebrenica, were killed in July 1995. The exhumation works lasted from 16 May, and were carried out by teams of experts of the FBiH Commission for Missing Persons, ICMP, the Tuzla County Interior Ministry, the Tuzla Health Centre and the Tuzla Commemorative Centre, under the supervision of the Tuzla County prosecutor's office. Preparation work for the exhumation of a grave in the area of municipality of Bratunac is expected to start on Tuesday.

ICTY Prosecution has been in possession of the recording of execution of Serb civilian in Bosnian Krajina by the members of BiH Army in 1995 [recently broadcasted in Serbian media] for longer time. "Obviously, that recording, which was available to everyone for four year, was brought up now in order to amortize, in a very trivial way, recently publicly reveal snapshots of execution of Srebrenica men," commented journalist of Sarajevo based Dani magazine, Emir Suljagic.

Apart from the persons of the Bosniak and Croat nationality the names of over 200 foreigners, who were fighting for the BiH Army during the war, are also mentioned in the criminal charges. The RS Secretariat for relations with the ICTY informed that all criminal charges would be sent to the BiH Prosecution and on the ground of the investigation the Prosecution would decide which persons would be processed.

EU Enlargement Commissioner says enlargement processe to continue

'Joining of western Balkans was confirmed'

Oslobodjenje on BiH getting closer to EU in light of recent events Oslobodjenje, pg 9 'European time-out', by <u>Zija Dizdarevic</u> — Commenting on the process of enlargement of EU and recent events pertaining to EU constitution and budget, Dizdarevic says the current mood in the EU is that the EU is afraid of the enlargement and one of reasons is the factor called 'Moslems', something that could affect BiH's chances. Talking more about BiH's chances, <u>Dizdarevic</u> says it is an advantage that the UK will take over the chairmanship as of July 1 since it is the country of the current High Representative, and in that context the author raises the issue of future character of international engagement in BiH, saying it is not good to ask for the transformation of the OHR into the EUSR at this moment. Finally, the author concludes that the most important priority of BiH at this moment should be to become a PfP member and speed up the way to become a NATO member.

Authors of the proposal are Chair of BIH Election Commission Vehid Sehic, FBIH Vice President Sahbaz Dzihanovic, professors in Sarajevo, Mostar and Banja Luka Universities Mirko Pejanovic, Slavo Kukic, Miodrag Zivanovic and Stasa Kosarac. Dzihanovic explained that proposal does foresee BiH as a centralized and unitary state. Its territorial organization would be founded on municipality, region and state. The state would consist of five regions -Sarajevo , Banja Luka , Zenica, Tuzla and Mostar. The document defines Sarajevo as the capital city of BiH , which encompasses 10 prewar municipalities, and its status would be ordered with a special session. The legislative authority would be exercised by the two-house parliament, executive power would be exercised by the government, and the judiciary would consist of the constitutional, supreme, regional and municipal courts. The state would have a president who would be elected by the parliament with majority of votes.

Cubro — carries a page-long interview with HR Paddy Ashdown in which he state: 'I did not give up from sanctions against RS and I will use this should RS and SDS choose isolation instead of integration to EU'. Asked whether he believes one can achieve a progress towards EU with parties that have been blocking reforms for ten years, HR has stated he does not support parties - SDS was on power in years that have passed, yet a lot had been done. 'People elected nationalistic parties and, if these can implement reforms, then I can continue working with them. It is important to say that should nationalistic parties fail to transform into European conventional parties they would have no future', HR said. He refused to say whether he had reached an agreement with RS President Dragan Cavic on police reform, but he said especially brave and encouraging initiatives are lately coming from Milorad Dodik. Asked to comment the announcement on arrival of Serbian President Boris Tadic to Srebrenica commemoration, HR said it is important for Serbian President to come to Srebrenica and it is important that he had expressed his wish to attend this event. 'I hope we will use this to show the admittance of the crime that was committed, to show true respect and to show BiH can be a country that can leave its past behind it', HR concluded.

Presidents of SCG, Croatia and BiH to sign joint statement on future priorities

Oslobodjenje, pg 5 'Presidents of BiH, Croatia and SCG in Belgrade on July 27', by A. Omeragic— Reports that the Chairman of BiH Presidency, Borislav Paravac, President of Serbia and Montenegro, Svetozar Marovic, and Croatian President, Stipe Mesic, should sign in Belgrade on July 27 a joint statement that will reflect on the current and future situation in the region. Although the statement has not been harmonized yet, Oslobodjenje learns it will seek responsibility of war criminals, stress the priority of joining the EU and underline strengthening of cooperation among the three countries. Apparently, Croatia and SCG have already agreed to the statement, and BiH is yet to declare itself. Paravac's media advisor, Drago **Vukovic**, says the Presidency will declare itself about the declaration on Wednesday. Jazvic - VL says that after adoption of the law on local self-rule many Municipalities in BiH might be abolished. VL says that the new law would prescribe criteria that the Municipalities must meet and according to some estimations, about 30 Municipalities do not meet these criteria. Federation of BiH Vice President Sahbaz Dzihanovic also shares this opinion and he warns that many current Municipalities were created as the result of political compromises.

VL: BiH Presidency to discuss tomorrow crisis in CoM Vecernji List pg 2 'New round of negotiations' by dja — VL says that, most probably, on Wednesday the BiH Presidency would discuss the BiH Council of Ministers' crisis for the first time.

According to the article, Chairman of the BiH CoM Adnan Terzic and BiH Foreign Minister Mladen Ivanic should also attend this session. According to VL information, it is not realistic to expect some bigger results from this session and a possibility to schedule a new meeting of the parliamentary majority has been mentioned as the only realistic option.
