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<p>US Ambassador to BiH McElhaney's pc: Political leaders close to agreement on constitutional changes</p>	<p><b>BH Radio 1</b> – Senka Jasarspahic– US Ambassador to BiH <b>Douglas McElhaney</b> told at the press conference in Sarajevo that BiH political leaders are close to signing the agreement on constitutional changes, since the only disputable and unresolved issue remained to be election of the BiH Presidency members. <i>"Various options were on the table on that issue and parties agreed to ask for a legal stance of the Venice Commission, on which of the options is in accordance with the European standards"</i>- said McElhaney. He added that after that parties' leaders are to meet and to discuss this last issue.</p>
<p>Main hearing in ICJ continues: BiH team presented evidence on occupation of BiH cities</p>	<p><b>BH Radio 1</b> – The main hearing in BiH's lawsuit against SCG for aggression and genocide continues before the International Court of Justice in The Hague. BiH legal representatives continued with presentation of evidences. They made a chronological presentation on how 'Serb forces' conducted occupation of BiH cities, conducting ethnical cleansing of majority Bosniak populations. The BiH team placed accent on Eastern Bosnia cities, claiming that all this was a part of the planned political activity, whose goal was to erase the eastern border on Drina.</p>

<p>Agreement on constitutional changes not signed/Politicians unable to agree on election of BiH Presidency members, they ask for stand of Venice Commission</p>	<p><b>BHT1</b>– Leaders of key BiH political parties met on Wednesday in Sarajevo to finalize the constitutional changes talks, however, they did not sign the agreement on constitutional changes, because they could not agree on the election of the BiH Presidency members. <b>Hayat</b> says that HDZ disagrees with the way in which the BiH President and Presidency members are to be elected. <i>“It was agreed for the Venice Commission to take the stance on the issue of the election”,</i> said SDA leader <b>Sulejman Tihic</b>. HDZ insists on the direct way of election. <i>“My opinion is that the proposed solution is in line with the Human Rights Convention’s regulations, but I can understand their fear that it does not guarantee that a Croat would be appointed as a BiH Presidency member”,</i> said PDP leader <b>Mladen Ivanic</b>. <i>“We have agreed that the whole package presents a complete and concrete agreement, but we have also agreed the whole package should not be sacrificed due to an issue, we failed to reach agreement on”,</i> said SDS leader <b>Dragan Cavic</b>. <i>“I think that we are having problems with systematic solutions. Obviously, Croat representatives want to solve the issue of internal organization. I have nothing against the idea of having 3, 5 or 10 entities within BiH itself. What is clear is that the RS’ existence is unquestionable”,</i> said SNSD leader <b>Milorad Dodik</b>. US representatives find talks extremely useful and productive. <b>RTRS</b>– Parties’ leaders agreed to send proposals to the Venetian Commission to give its opinion. Three versions regarding the BiH Presidency’s election will be sent to the Venetian Commission. The first version refers to direct voting on the election within one election unit. The second version refers to the earlier way of election, while the third version refers to the indirect election in the BiH Parliament. US Ambassador to BiH <b>Douglas L. McElhane</b>y said that not much time has left and that this would have to be finished soon. <b>FTV</b>– HDZ President <b>Dragan Covic</b> stated that for HDZ, the direct election method is absolutely unacceptable. <b>Milenko Brkic</b> from HNZ repeated his demand for the indirect election method, claiming that this method only can secure equality for all BiH peoples. US State Department official <b>Rosemary Di Carlo</b> also attended Wednesday’s meeting of BiH political leaders. She stated after the meeting that she is satisfied with the course of the negotiations. She said that the political leaders had promised to meet after they receive the recommendation of the Venice Commission and sign the agreement on time, so that the necessary legislation can be adopted before the October elections. <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 6 ‘Solution in ten days’ by <b>Az.K.</b> – Lagumdžija stated that Venice Commission should come up with the response in ten days. <p>Danas: US, OHR embittered with Silajdzic's attitude in process of constitutional changes talks</p>	<p><b>Danas</b>, front pg splash 'Silajdzic and Orucevic parting ways' and pgs 18-21 'USA puts Silajdzic on margins', by <b>Zvonimir Jukic</b> – According to <b>Danas'</b> sources, the US Embassy in BiH and <b>OHR</b> are embittered with recent actions by the founder of SBiH, <b>Haris Silajdzic</b>, who, for the sake of his own interests, wants to preserve the status quo in BiH and prevent gradual constitutional changes in the country. <b>Danas</b> quotes <i>"an OHR official"</i> as saying that Silajdzic wants to prevent any constitutional changes in order to preserve the confusing situation in BiH, which would subsequently create new national tensions, the situation in which Silajdzic sees his chance to be elected as the Bosniak member of BiH Presidency. Moreover, <b>Danas</b> also learns that long-time partners Silajdzic and <b>Safet Orucevic</b> (former Mayor of Mostar, believed to have strong ties with Silajdzic) have clashed over the constitutional changes, since Orucevic is allegedly in favour of the US and UK embassies' plans to carry out gradual changes, instead of no changes whatsoever. The weekly also says that the US are fed up with Silajdzic's attitude towards constitutional changes, which is the reason why Silajdzic was recently denied a visa to enter the US to attend constitutional changes talks.</p>
<p>DL: BiH Presidency members' behaviour shows BiH needs one President</p>	<p><b>Dnevni List</b>, pg 2 'United BiH consisting of three pieces', by <b>Zvonimir Jukic</b> – the author argues that the handover in the office of Chairman of BiH Presidency and speeches by members of the Presidency held on that occasion (members were presenting opposing stances) showed what kind of state BiH citizens live in and what kind of the Presidency the country has. <b>Jukic</b> notes that all three members were talking foremost as advocates of narrow interests of their respective people, which, according to <b>Jukic</b>, confirms the need to have one President and two Vice Presidents who would rotate each 16 months, because each diplomat when talking to the Presidency members would get a feeling that there are three states in BiH.</p>

**Update on new RS Government**

<p>New RS Government established/New RS PM Dodik promised to implement all measures stated in expose</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> By <u>Marina Marjanovic</u>- During the extraordinary session of RS National Assembly, held on Tuesday with only one item of the agenda – to elect and appoint a new RS Prime Minister and his Cabinet, <b>Igor Radojicic</b> took over position of the RSNA Speaker on Wednesday. Radojicic said that the RSNA session would be held soon in order to discuss the budget and some laws that the new RS Government announced. Transfer of the RS PM and Ministers' duty will be done on Thursday, only <b>Stanislav Cadjo</b>, a new RS Interior Minister took over duty on Wednesday. <i>"I would like to say again that the Government has intention to implement all the measures that we stated in exposé, and that we have no intention to lose time"</i> said <b>Milorad Dodik</b>, a newly appointed RS PM. <b>Pero Bukejlovic</b>, a former RS PM congratulated newly appointed PM Dodik. <i>"I would like him (Dodik) to continue what we started, to correct our mistakes, and to do all that is for well- being of peoples in the RS"</i>, said Bukejlovic. <b>Dusan Stojicic</b>, a former RSNA Speaker expressed his discontent for not getting word after Dodik's expose [because of which SDS representatives left the session at the end and did not vote at all]. <i>"Has it ever happened in this RSNA that you ask for word on behalf of the Caucus and you do not get it"</i>, said Stojicic. <b>Hayat</b>– <i>"The Coalition, which has taken over the governing, is extremely shaky and unnatural..."</i> said Stojicic.<b>BHT, Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 4 'Radojicic officially took over the duty of Chairman' by <u>V. Dodik is described as a pragmatic social democrat that has fight for social justice and against organized crime on his agenda. Daily also carries that he announced forming <i>"special police forces"</i> that would hunt ICTY indictees, for they represent jeopardy the existence of the RS, that he wants to <i>"ensure through reforms."</i></p> <p><b>Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung</b> 'Change of Government in RS' – also praises Dodik's abilities calling him <i>"a west oriented pragmatist"</i> at whose agenda, the economy issues are top priority, stressing also his promise that he would fight against organized crime tied with SDS structures. FAZ adds that Bosniak and Croat representatives expect Dodik to implement the reform of local self-governance, blocked now for past two years, which would improve status of the minorities.</p>

## **BiH's Independence Day/Other political issues**

<p>BiH Independence Day marked only in FBiH/ RS representatives say other date can be chosen since this one reminds them of 'bad things'</p>	<p><b>BHT1</b> – March 1 is the BiH's Independence Day. On this day, 14 years ago, over 66% of BiH citizens voted at the referendum, and almost 98% of voters decided on BiH's independence. Most of the Serbs boycotted the referendum. The BiH Independence Day is not being celebrated in the RS and Serbs believe that this date has negative connotations and that it cannot be celebrated as a state holiday. Member of SBiH <b>Beriz Belkic</b> expressed his hope that after some time all BiH citizens would accept this holiday and celebrate it. BiH Presidency member and SDA President <b>Sulejman Tihic</b> stated that this day is a symbol of a multi-ethnic state. SNSD's <b>Krstan Simic</b> stated that there are many other dates that are more suitable to be celebrated as the Independence Day and that March 1 is a date selected by only one entity. BiH Presidency member <b>Ivo Miro Jovic</b> stated that he is proud to belong to Croat people, who voted for independence at the 1992 referendum.</p> <p><b>Hayat</b>– Although invited to the ceremonial academy, in honour of the Independence Day, the RS representatives did not appear. Serb BiH Presidency member <b>Borislav Paravac</b> marked the Day of Civil Protection on Wednesday. <i>"Serbs do not mark this date (The Independence Day)...It reminds them of something very bad...and do not provoke me with such questions"</i>, explained Paravac. Members of the BiH legal team mostly spoke about the Convention on Prevention of Genocide, in order to relate to the definition and facts, which have been confirmed. It was also spoken about war prisons in BiH, people in charge of such prisons, which were established in order to destroy Bosniaks and Croats in BiH. <b>BHT1</b>– The BiH legal team also presented videotapes and other materials that prove the existence of concentration camps, along with materials showing planned destruction of cultural and religious monuments. <b>RTRS</b> – It was stressed that members of SDA and HDZ were arrested the most. <b>Magda Karagiannakis</b>, a BiH team attorney, said that former Yugoslav politicians and Army had supervision over around 500 prisons in BiH and presented some evidences to prove that BiH Serbs cooperated with Serbs from other side of Drina. The BiH team will finish the first round of presentation by March 7 and after that SCG team will make its presentation. Media reported that <b>Francis A.
