Dokic and Pavic are indicted for misuse of power and authority while working as ministers of communications and transport in RS government, and for disappearance of almost 900 thousand KM from the state and entity budgets. In his statement for media, Dokic said that the mail goal of this indictment is to discredit him politically. He added that he was working absolutely in line with the government decisions. He added that he was not even thinking about to resign.

Both sides in preparation for renewal of Alijagic case before the Court

Dnevni Avaz 2 'Alijagic: Cuk forgets this is not 1992' by A.M. - Head of Trebinje Municipality, **Dobroslav Cuk**, announced that this municipality will establish the expert team which will represent it before the court at the renewed trial in Alijagic case. Last year, the Trebinje District Court brought the decision ordering RS Government and Metalac company to pay out about 36 million KM of compensation for stolen property to Salih Alijagic, however the RS Supreme Court has recently returned the case to the new trial. "We will make expert study... and we will also check all documents submitted to the court. Those who brought forged documents will have to be held responsible for that," said Cuk referring to documents of company 'Obod' from Cetinje and some other companies from Western Herzegovina which prove the usage of stolen Alijagic's property. "I would like to remind that the RS MoI checked those documents and found nothing problematic. There was hothing disputable in previous verdict of the District Court, and it has been returned only because of the large pressure from both domestic and international officials," commented Alijagic.

The Committee's President, Srdjan Dizdarevic, noted that the six citizens extradited by BiH had been in the US "Guantanamo" prison in Cuba for three years and points out that although they had been arrested and extradited on terrorism charges, there was no investigation against them. He also noted that the extradition had been carried out contrary to the decision of the BiH Federation Supreme Court and the Human Rights Chamber. Sarajevo media also covered the issue.

Dragan Bozanic appointed Ambassador at large

In his statement about this decision, member of BiH Presidency Sulejman Tihic said that Bozanic couldn't be ambassador, not even in the office of Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Sarajevo, and that he was therefore against his appointment. Dragan Bozanic was recently nominated for the position of the BiH Ambassador to the Council of Europe in Strasbourg , but EU refused to approve that appointment.

Dnevni Avaz pg 4 'Who will Bozanic cooperate with if US and EU are against him' FENA — BiH Presidency member Sulejman Tihic voted against the appointment of Dragan Bozanic as the ambassador at large in the BiH Ministry of Foreign Affairs. "Today, just like before when we voted on his appointment as the ambassador to the Council of Europe, I voted against his appointment", Tihic told FENA on Tuesday. Tihic believes that the same reasons that existed then exist nowadays and he says that Bozanic, by serving as the information minister in Radovan Karadzic's Government during the aggression against BiH, played a negative role and incited national and religious hatred. "Both the EU and USA adopted a clear position towards this issues when they refused to approve his appointment. I see no one he could work with here in the BiH Ministry of Foreign Affairs if all EU countries and USA are against his appointment", Tihic said. This appointment will again be discussed at the next session of the BiH Presidency when Bozanic could be appointed as the ambassador at large.

Cavic responds to Gregorian:
SDS supports defence reform

Nezavisne Novine pg 7, announced on cover 'SDS supports defence reform' by Dragan <u>Cavic</u> - This is a letter **Dragan Cavic**, RS President, wrote as a response to accusations of Rafi Gregorian, DRC Chair, where Cavic denies SDS is impeding the defence reform. Cavic brings details related to previous flow of defence reform, saying this level of reform would not have been achieved without the support and assistance of the SDS. He stresses that SDS is of the view a full implementation of reform called "Path towards PfP" should mainly be achieved, after which the process of adjustment and re-structuring for BiH admission to NATO should be launched. He underlines that "SDS supports a full professionalisation of the armed forces in BiH, which stipulate a complete abolishment of any sort of obligatory training. SDS is also of the view that this process may commence immediately."

RS MoD denies Gregorian: SDS is not impeder Nezavisne Novine pg 6 'SDS is not impeder' by N.M., Glas Srpske pg 2 'Gregorian without arguments' by M. Dzepina — The RS Ministry of Defence has reacted upon an open letter published Tuesday by Rafi Gregorian, DRC Chair. The Ministry released a press statement, viewing Gregorian's claims (that SDS is impeding the process of defence reform in BiH) as non-argumented. The release notes: "The conclusions and declaration referring to defence reform adopted at the latest session of the RS NA (supported by SDS, PDP, DNS) showed we want to join NATO on the principles RS Parliament has enacted."

Medunjanin, Slobodna Dalmacija pg 14 'Damaging ban on sale of barracks' by F, FENA - Federation Defence Minister Miroslav Nikolic said on Tuesday that High Representative Paddy Ashdown's decision on a temporary ban on the sale of state property especially affected the Federation Defence Ministry, and that it could have negative repercussions on the consolidation of the financial situation in the defence sector. Speaking about the possible implications of such a decision, Minister Nikolic said at a news conference in Sarajevo that disused military locations (property of the former JNA - Yugoslav People's Army) currently owned by the Federation Defence Ministry represented a "ballast" which exacerbated the already difficult financial situation in which this ministry and the Federation of BiH Army were in. Our intention was to put these locations "into circulation" and so rid ourselves of their maintenance and security, Nikolic said, recalling that the funds secured by the sale of disused locations could be allocated for urgent needs in the defence sector. These funds, he said, could be used to improve the status of the members of defence structures and their housing, as well as the necessary maintenance of the Bosnia-Hercegovina Federation Army's armaments and equipment. According to Nikolic, although the Federation had in the meantime passed laws enabling the sale of disused army property, the OHR's decision overrode this, i.e. prevented the implementation of the established legal framework which regulated this area. Stressing that he welcomed in principle all measures aimed at protecting state property, the defence minister added that he was surprised that such measures had not been taken while the sale of military property was topical in the [Bosnian] Serb Republic where two thirds of military facilities that used to be owned by the Serb Republic Army were privatized. The Federation Defence Ministry owns 127 disused locations, buildings (barracks etc), corresponding to 150 business facilities which the ministry says could be put up for sale.

OHR, BiH Minister Halilovic on state property: Halilovic says it is alarming that State **Property** Comm. doesn't work

Dnevni Avaz pg 8 'Safet Halilovic: Lack of work by the State Property Commission is alarming' by M. Drinjakovic -OHR Spokesman Mario Brkic said on Tuesday that the decision of the HR to temporarily freeze the sale of public property should allow the State Property Commission to do its work. The HR also specified that the Commission, established in December last year by the BiH CoM with a task to recommend authorities steps to undertake to ensure protection of the state property, must present its report

to the CoM by 30 November this year, however the Commission hasn't met yet. The BiH Civil Affairs Minister, Safet Halilovic, commented that the CoM has no information on the activities of this Commission: "Of course, the focus of the Commission's work is extremely important issue, and since it has not done in a span of several months, I think that is alarming.. I think this body should urgently create the register of the BiH property," said Halilovic adding it is necessary to propose the audit measures in the cases in which state property was disrupted by anybody.

FBiH HoR adopts law on sale of unclaimed apartments

RHB, Pink, FTV, RTRS, Oslobodjenje pg 6, mentioned on cover 'Purchase for vouchers for those being employed before 1991' A. Terzic, Dnevni Avaz pg 10 "Law on return, allocation and sale of apartments adopted' A. Basic, Dnevni List pg 5 'Changes to Law on Privatisation of Companies refused' by I. Glibusic — At the session in Sarajevo on Tuesday, the FBiH House of Representatives adopted the draft Law on return, allocation and sale of unclaimed apartments. According to the law, these apartments, which served as the alternative accommodation for refugees, should be returned to the companies which owned them in 1991. In order to purchase such apartment, 600 KM per square meter in cash should be paid, or in very specific cases the payment can be made through Federation. The law doesn't regulate the purchase of the
