Both sides in preparation for renewal of Alijagic case before the Court

Dnevni Avaz 2 'Alijagic: Cuk forgets this is not 1992' by A.M. – Head of Trebinje Municipality, **Dobroslav Cuk**, announced that this municipality will establish the expert team which will represent it before the court at the renewed trial in Alijagic case. Last year, the Trebinje District Court brought the decision ordering RS Government and Metalac company to pay out about 36 million KM of compensation for stolen property to Salih Alijagic, however the RS Supreme Court has recently returned the case to the new trial. "We will make expert study... and we will also check all documents submitted to the court. Those who brought forged documents will have to be held responsible for that," said Cuk referring to documents of company 'Obod' from Cetinje and some other companies from Western Herzegovina which prove the usage of stolen Alijagic's property. "I would like to remind that the RS MoI checked those documents and found nothing problematic. There was hothing disputable in previous verdict of the District Court, and it has been returned only because of the large pressure from both domestic and international officials," commented Alijagic. BHT, RTRS, Nezavisne Novine pg 6 'Initiative for return of money from Alijagic' launched' by <u>V. Duka</u> also reported on the issue and carried Cuk's statement.

Tihic believes that the same reasons that existed then exist nowadays and he says that Bozanic, by serving as the information minister in Radovan Karadzic's Government during the aggression against BiH, played a negative role and incited national and religious hatred. "Both the EU and USA adopted a clear position towards this issues when they refused to approve his appointment. I see no one he could work with here in the BiH Ministry of Foreign Affairs if all EU countries and USA are against his appointment", Tihic said. This appointment will again be discussed at the next session of the BiH Presidency when Bozanic could be appointed as the ambassador at large. **TV Hayat** carried an interview with Tihic on the issue.

FBiH Defence Minister laments Ashdown's ban on property sale

Medunjanin, Slobodna Dalmacija pg 14 'Damaging ban on sale of barracks' by F, FENA - Federation Defence Minister Miroslav Nikolic said on Tuesday that High Representative Paddy Ashdown's decision on a temporary ban on the sale of state property especially affected the Federation Defence Ministry, and that it could have negative repercussions on the consolidation of the financial situation in the defence sector. Speaking about the possible implications of such a decision, Minister Nikolic said at a news conference in Sarajevo that disused military locations (property of the former JNA - Yugoslav People's Army) currently owned by the Federation Defence Ministry represented a "ballast" which exacerbated the already difficult financial situation in which this ministry and the Federation of BiH Army were in. Our intention was to put these locations "into circulation" and so rid ourselves of their maintenance and security, Nikolic said, recalling that the funds secured by the sale of disused locations could be allocated for urgent needs in the defence sector. These funds, he said, could be used to improve the status of the members of defence structures and their housing, as well as the necessary maintenance of the Bosnia-Hercegovina Federation Army's armaments and equipment. According to Nikolic, although the Federation had in the meantime passed laws enabling the sale of disused army property, the OHR's decision overrode this, i.e. prevented the implementation of the established legal framework which regulated this area. Stressing that he welcomed in principle all measures aimed at protecting state property, the defence minister added that he was surprised that such measures had not been taken while the sale of military property was topical in the [Bosnian] Serb Republic where two thirds of military facilities that used to be owned by the Serb Republic Army were privatized. The Federation Defence Ministry owns 127 disused locations, buildings (barracks etc), corresponding to 150 business facilities which the ministry says could be put up for sale.
