Matijasevic meets Del Ponte today

RHB at 12.00- RS Interior Minister, Darko Matijasevic, announced that he would be talking to the Chief ICTY Prosecutor, Carla del Ponte, at The Hague today, from whom he will be asking for additional explanations regarding her address to the UN SC. Matijasevic stated at the RT RS on Thursday evening that he would be asking for additional explanations because there is a difference between what's stated in the report and what the Chief Prosecutor stated before the UN SC regarding noncooperation of the RS with the ICTY. Questioned whether he could be on a list of people that the High Representative could remove because of complaints that the RS does not cooperate with the ICTY, Matijasevic briefly stated "no".

Update to trial of Ljubicic

RHB at 12.00 — Tomislav Jonjic, a lawyer of Pasko Ljubicic, a BiH Croat charged with war crimes by the ICTY, stated at a status conference at the ICTY that both the Croatian and FBiH Governments refused to give guarantees, which should help secure a pre-trial release to his client. Jonjic notes that he addressed both Governments on numerous occasions, the last time being on November 3, 2004, however the Governments never responded.

First joint structure of BiH Armed Forces promoted

BH Radio 1 at 12.00 — For the first time in its history, BiH got its military unit of honor which is the first joint structure of BiH Armed Forces. The unit, to be engaged in protocol ceremonies in BIH, is made of 67 members. The first unit commander will be a representative of the Serb people. Asked by RTRS reporter whether this is a path towards joint BIH Army, Nikola Radovanovic, BIH Defence Minister, said that the unit is a joint structure and adds that BIH Armed Forces exists as it has been decided within the BIH defence legislation.

Political issues

Ceremonies marking 25 Nov held through the country Oslobodjenje pgs 4-6 'Through change of BiH Constitution towards better state', mentioned on cover, by S. Rozajac — Daily has dedicated three pages to 25 November and ceremonies held by WWII resistance movement throughout the country to mark this holiday. At the ceremony in Sarajevo, BiH Presidency member Sulejman Tihic stated on the failure of RS politicians to mark 25 November as BiH Statehood day: "The Law on holidays is still existing and those that do not respect this law also fail to respect DPA. One cannot take out of the Constitution only things they like, and reject all others. It is the same when it comes to the cooperation with the ICTY."

BHT 1, FTV, Nezavisne Novine, pg. 6 'The Statehood Day has no alternative' by R. Cengic — All participants of the celebration agreed that BiH today is far away from the one whose foundations were established in Mrkonjic Grad on November 25, 1943. "[On that day] all ideas about grand Serbia or Croatia were rejected, and BiH State was constituted on multi-ethnic principles," stated Sulejman Tihic.

BHT 1 — BHT 1 carries that RS politicians were ready to accept November 25 as Day of Anti-Fascism, but not as the Statehood Day. "If there was a willingness among Bosniak representatives, we would mark 25 November as the ZAVNOBIH Day. Unfortunately, I've got the feeling that they see something else in this date," said BiH House of Representatives Deputy Chair, Nikola Spiric.

FTV by Suzana Stambol — The Law on State and religious holidays waits in the parliamentary procedure since 2002. The new proposal which was submitted in April this year immediately came across obstacles. "It was hold up by the board of internal affairs, when it was said that there is need for political harmonisation," said BiH Minister of Civil Affairs and Communication, Safet Halilovic.

"The agreement initialled at Dayton nine years ago, and formally signed in Paris two weeks later, was a framework agreement. It didn't provide all the answers. It provided the foundations within which the people of BiH could find permanent solutions to the political and social challenges that confront them," read the letter. It added that building peace had not been accomplished at Dayton, and that Dayton was only the beginning. "Building peace has been a process, that is only now well on the way. And this is because there is a new and powerful incentive to look forward rather than back. If Dayton was about escaping from the nightmare of the war years, European integration is about arriving in a better place. That better place is a prosperous, democratic and secure Bosnia and Herzegovina engaged in (and benefiting from) the processes through which the Europe of the 21st century is beginning more effectively to serve its citizens. That is what Bosnia and Herzegovina Statehood Day is about. That is why every single person in this country, man, woman and child, of whatever religion or group, can and should celebrate this day," Ashdown emphasized in his message to the BiH

Slobodna Bosna on election of Mayor of Mostar Slobodna Bosna, pgs 50-52 'Each time nationalists agreed, Mostarians got hurt!', by Danka Savic — Talking about the election of new Mayor of Mostar, the author reiterates that the current Deputy Mayor, Ljubo Beslic, is the pick of an HDZ fraction that is led by Miroslav Coric, whilst other HDZ's fraction, gathered around Mile Puljic and Goran Bilic, is ready to "cut a deal" with the SDA and concede the office of Mayor of Mostar to the SDA, and in turn a Croat would be leading the Mostar City Council. As an explanation, the author says this scenario favour's the latter fraction because the OHR would not accept Bilic as the Mayor.

Protests of decertified police officers

Kalamujic, Dnevni List, front pg splash and pg 2 'Protest in front of common institutions building: Police officers tear diplomas', by <u>D. Polovina-</u> Mandic — As a sign of protest against the de-certification, members of Association of de-certified police officers of BiH tear their diplomas in front of the common institutions building in Sarajevo on Thursday. The Association President, Ramo Sulic, says: "We have been educated by the IPTF, UN and domestic institutions and we have a great number of international certificates, but we do not need them because the fundamental right to work has been taken away from us for good (...) We have not moved one step in last two years because the OHR and domestic institutions, instead of arguments, use force. This is a problem of legal nature and it has to be solved through the legal system of this country". Sulic goes on to say that the Association will request BiH institutions to address the UN General Assembly in order to carry out a revision of the decertification process. Sulic notes the last resort, if all attempts fail, is blockade of border crossings.

Sarac -The Police Restructuring Commission chaired by Wilfred Martens is expected to hold its last session from December 12-13 in Sarajevo. The Commission members should ate the session agree on the final report on the future police structure in BiH. What has already been known to public is that the police will be organized at the state level, that there will be a single ministry and a single budget. This is a concept supported by EU but still strongly opposed by RS Interior Minister Darko Matijasevic. In addition, the police organized in five regions (Sarajevo, Banja Luka, Mostar, Tuzla and Zenica) represents the model currently supported by majority within the Commission.

Dnevni List, pg 8, mentioned on front 'Organization of State according to Police model', by <u>Zvonimir Jukic</u> - Speaking about integration processes in BiH and Police reform in particular, the author notes that the transfer of Police authorities onto State institutions, "which is one of key tasks of the HR, Paddy Ashdown, this year", will reach its final stages in December this year. The author argues that the Peace Implementation Council tasked HR in 2004 to secure signing of the SAA, accession to the PfP and establishment of Police forces at state level, and the author notes that since the first two are unlikely to happen in 2004, so HR Ashdown simply cannot allow another defeat, this time in unifying the BiH security structures. The author links the Police reform with the arrest of war crimes suspects, Ratko Mladic and Radovan Karadzic in particular, saying that the stern warnings to the RS authorities have given the said authorities a simple choice: either to arrest Karadzic or agree to unification of Police forces. In that context, DL says it is hard to believe the RS authorities will arrest Karadzic, so the choice is simple. Talking more about the Police reform, the author notes it is interesting that proposed models of Police reform envisage the existence of Police regions/areas. In that context, the author says that many analysts see the future BiH as a State of regions.

One such unsolved problems between BiH and Croatia is issue of port Ploce. Croatian President Stjepan Mesic stated that functioning of the port Ploce is in interest of both Croatia and BiH, but also a number of other countries especially in the future when Vc corridor it so be constructed. Day before Forum started, BiH farmers blocked borders indicating another problem BiH has with regional countries: the Free Trade Agreements [FTAs]. "Each country respects FTA, but Ministers always have in their drawers solutions which can undermine that agreement. I am talking about Croatia, Serbia and Montenegro, Macedonia, and Slovenia, before it joined the EU," stated Chair of the BiH Council of Ministers, Adnan Terzic.

He added that this process would restore trust in the privatisation, and stressed that objection to this law presents an example of some politicians protecting the criminals.

Speaking on the issue of Mostar Aluminij, Hays said that it was about a company that had been completely destroyed at the end of war, in 1996. "The current employees have been re-building the company from the beginning. Concerning the human right issue, meaning the rights of the former employees, I think some things have already been agreed. The issues to be solved include determination of the Government's share in the company and finding a way how to compensate loss the company had suffered during the war," said Hays. Hays also reiterated that the single VAT rate would be the best solution for BiH.

It also carries the information that the RS Government has set a deadline by December 31 for the concessionaire, Serbian-Russian firm "Slavija international" with a seat in Laktasi, to ensure all needed pre-conditions for the start of works.
