Ceremonies marking 25 Nov held through the country **Oslobodjenje** pgs 4-6 'Through change of BiH Constitution towards better state', mentioned on cover, by S. Rozajac –

Daily has dedicated three pages to 25 November and ceremonies held by WWII resistance movement throughout the country to mark this holiday. At the ceremony in Sarajevo, BiH Presidency member **Sulejman Tihic** stated on the failure of RS politicians to mark 25 November as BiH Statehood day: "The Law on holidays is still existing and those that do not respect this law also fail to respect DPA. One cannot take out of the Constitution only things they like, and reject all others. It is the same when it comes to the cooperation with the ICTY."

BHT 1, FTV, Nezavisne Novine, pg. 6 'The Statehood Day has no alternative' by R. Cengic – All participants of the celebration agreed that BiH today is far away from the one whose foundations were established in Mrkonjic Grad on November 25, 1943. "[On that day] all ideas about grand Serbia or Croatia were rejected, and BiH State was constituted on multi-ethnic principles," stated Sulejman Tihic.

BHT 1 - BHT 1 carries that RS politicians were ready to accept November 25 as Day of Anti-Fascism, but not as the Statehood Day. "If there was a willingness among Bosniak representatives, we would mark 25 November as the ZAVNOBIH Day. Unfortunately, I've got the feeling that they see something else in this date," said BiH House of Representatives Deputy Chair, Nikola Spiric.

FTV by Suzana Stambol – The Law on State and religious holidays waits in the parliamentary procedure since 2002. The new proposal which was submitted in April this year immediately came across obstacles. *"It was hold up by the board of internal affairs, when it was said that there is need for political harmonisation,"* said BiH Minister of

Civil Affairs and Communication, Safet Halilovic.

when the people of BiH mark nine years since the preliminary signing of the Dayton Peace Agreement, the HR, **Paddy Ashdown**, sent an open letter to BiH citizens. "The agreement initialled at Dayton nine years ago, and formally signed in Paris two weeks later, was a framework agreement.

It didn't provide all the answers. It provided the foundations within which the people of BiH could find permanent solutions to the political and social challenges that confront them," read the letter. It added that building peace had not been accomplished at Dayton, and that Dayton was only the beginning. "Building peace has been a process, that is only now well on the way. And this is because there is a new and powerful incentive to look forward rather than back. If Dayton was about escaping from the nightmare of the war years, European integration is about arriving in a better place. That better place is a prosperous, democratic and secure Bosnia and Herzegovina engaged in (and benefiting from) the processes through

which the Europe of the 21st century is beginning more effectively to serve its citizens. That is what Bosnia and Herzegovina Statehood Day is about. That is why every single person in this country, man, woman and child, of whatever religion or group, can and should celebrate this day," Ashdown emphasized in his message to the BiH citizens.

Speaking on the issue of Mostar Aluminij, Hays said that it was about a company that had been completely destroyed at the end of war, in 1996. "The current employees have been re-building the company from the beginning. Concerning the human right issue, meaning the rights of the former employees, I think some things have already been agreed. The issues to be solved include determination of the Government's share in the company and finding a way how to compensate loss the company had suffered during the war," said Hays. Hays also reiterated that the single VAT rate would be the best solution for BiH.
