In a statement given to RTRS, she said RS Government has no intention of filing resignation since it has done its work well. She also said that whenever TV cameras were off, MP's commented on proposed budget, saying there has never been a better budget prepared and such proposal should be adopted. However, other statements appear in the media on the eve of the RS NA session, according to her.

RTRS, FTV, Hayat, BHT1, PINK, Dnevni Avaz pg 5 'Government launched dismissal of directors in RS Elektroprivreda and Srpske Sume', Oslobodjenje pg 7 'Urgent removal of directors demanded', Nezavisne Novine pg 4, announced on cover 'Removals of Tesic and Culic demanded' by <u>D.Risojevic</u>, <u>EuroBlic</u> RSpg 2 '13 Directors removed, two more waiting for dismissal' by T.V., Glas Srpske pg 2 'Removals of Culic and Tesic' by G.Dakic, Nezavisne Novine pg 4 '14 directors at "RS Forest" removed', EuroBlic RSpg 2 '13 Directors removed, two more waiting for dismissal' by <u>T.V.</u> – After discussing the audit report on dealings in RS Elektroprivreda (EP), Government ordered EP Supervisory Board to remove the director of Gacko mine and thermal power plant Dragomir Culic and RS EP' Finance Director Arsen Tesic. According to RS Minister of Economy, Energy and Development Miladin Gligoric, Culic and Tesic will not be able to assume any managerial position until the investigation related to charges against them completes. RS Govt also discussed the situation in public company 'Srpske Sume'. This company implemented the majority of Government's conclusions related to audit report, stated Director Vladimir Topalic. According to him, the Supervisory Board has been set up, single bank account formed, and the number of forest units has been reduced from 42 to 23. The directors of 13 forest units have been urgently removed, because they violated the regulations on public procurements. RS Govt also defined the proposal of the Law on the realisation of the 2006 budget, which stipulates the rights and the obligations of public institutions and it adopted the amendments to the law on RS budget system, regulating budget relations between RS, cities and municipalities. **Dnevni Avaz** pg 2 'RS Government introduces the position of minister without portfolio' by Onasa -RS Government announced after Monday's session that the RS Ministry of Defence will cease to exist on January 1st 2006, noting post of minister without portfolio would be introduced.

Oslobodjenje, front pg splash and pgs 4-5 'Increases of prices are already getting out of control', by Marina Kavaz-Sirucic – The article in general is warning of possible bad consequences of the introduction of VAT, carrying statements of Mediha Bakalovic (Association of consumers of Tuzla) and Edhem Biber (leader of BiH Unions), who are worried that the VAT will cause increase of prices of basic groceries in particular. Biber reminds that the Unions have recommended to the BiH CoM and BiH Parliament to use experiences of other countries, which started with single VAT rate, after which they realized they had been wrong. RTRSby Nada Arlov — RTRS says that even before the VAT introduction citizens have already felt some consequences, as some companies increased the service costs in order to take a better position on the eve of VAT introduction. In order to prevent the uncontrolled increase of prices, RS Government formed the team for monitoring the prices after the VAT introduction; those who try to gain some extra profit would be penalized. PINK by Ljubisa <u>Davidovic</u> — Despite increases of prices to follow the VAT, the growth in prices cannot be immense and citizens have no reason to be worried, the RS Market Inspection claims. RTRS 'Pecat' magazine by <u>Bojan Kecman</u> — Also dedicates the feature to VAT discussing whether or not the prices would be significantly increased, however doesn't bring any conclusion.

FTV '60 minuta' current affairs programme by Bakir Hadziomerovic - Programme entirely dedicated to the VAT introduction in BiH discussed both economic and political aspects of the taxation reform in the country. The BiH CoM Chair, Adnan Terzic, stressed: "Our determination to go move forward with the VAT introduction is our response to businessmen, as we promised, and... we have obligation to create business environment in BiH, one which would enable BiH to live on its economy." Terzic added the VAT has become the political issue, where it is very profitable to attack the one rated VAT and stir talks about upcoming alleged chaos. "I am convinced that there will be no chaos, I am convinced that some disturbances will occur, that some prices will increase, but some will also reduce, so... in few months we will be in situation to say: Thanks God we have VAT," Terzic concluded. SDP leader, Zlatko Lagumdzija, stressed that nobody argues that VAT is not necessary for the country, however opposes onerate solution. In line with this, he strongly attacked Terzic, stressing the state and banks [mostly foreign] will have most use while "healthy businesses" will have to take credits from the banks to continue functioning. Lagumdzija also presented arguments claiming the prices of food and basic goods would be significantly increased, and demanded from Terzic to advise people to prepare for the holidays before 1 January. Terzic declined this stressing the prices would not go that high.

FBiH Govt to appoint VAT monitoring team

Dnevni Avaz pg 9 'All members proposed, confirmation at the FBiH Government's session on Thursday' — Members of the FBiH expert team tasked to monitor the prices of the basic goods following the VAT introduction have been proposed on Monday, confirmed the advisor to the FBiH Trade Minister, Ibrahim Tirak. About 15 team members will be approved by the Government at the session on Thursday.

Hurtic: VAT to be introduced even if entities fail to adopt budgets PINKby Zeljko Mandic — Advisor to BiH Council of Ministers Chair, Zlatko Hurtic said on Monday that VAT was going to be introduced even if entities do not adopt budgets. Hurtic believes that entities are going to adopt budgets and that there will be no greater increase in prices. Hurtic says that profit of tradesmen are to be monitored in order to prevent citizens from becoming victims of profiteers. He hopes that entity Parliaments will respect the agreement and introduce social programs along with VAT. Hurtic added that BiH CoM, together with BiH Indirect Taxation Administration Managing Board, was trying to make publishing free of the VAT.

DL: BiH CoM got consent from ITA SB to exempt press from VAT, Spiric refuses to convene session of BiH HoR Dnevni List, pg 3, mentioned on front 'Press exempt from VAT', by Danka Polovina-Mandic - According to DL, the BiH Council of Ministers got the consent from the Steering Board of Indirect Tax Authority (ITA SB) to exempt books, brochures, magazines, publications and newspapers from VAT. According to an ITA SB member, Haris Basic, during the last session of the ITA SB, it was him, Joly Dixon and minister Ljerka Maric, who supported the BiH CoM's proposal, whilst Miodrag Kudic abstained from voting and Sefika Hafizovic voted against the proposal. Basic explains that the entity Finance Ministers, Dragan Vrankic and Svetlana Cenic, gave positive opinions too, therefore the issue can go to the (BiH) Parliament. However, according to DL's source, the Speaker of the BiH House of Representatives, Nikola Spiric, is refusing to convene a session of the BiH HoR by the end of the year because of his position made earlier since he (Spiric) would rather exempt bread, milk and medicines from VAT.

Distribution of VAT in first quarter of 2006 to base of rates from 2005 Nezavisne Novine pg 4 'First three months, distribution will ground on rate from 2005' by R.Cengic — The BiH Ministry of Finance and BiH ITA Monday confirmed that the money collected through VAT on single account in first three months of 2006 will be divided amongst beneficiaries on the basis of percent from 2005, until new percentage system is put in place. However, Dragan Vrankic, F BiH Finance Minister and member of ITA Administration says that percentage could not have been defined "since no tax has been recorded".

DL: FBiH Pension Fund worried with introduction of VAT Dnevni List, pg 5 'New burdens will lead to decrease of pensions', mentioned on front 'Into new year with decreased pensions', by Danka Polovina-Mandic — DL carries the Deputy Director of the FBiH MIO/PIO, Ivan Rogic, who fears that extra funds that will have to be allocated in order to alleviate consequences of the VAT, could lead to decrease of pensions in the FBiH unless the FBiH Government secures the necessary means.

Dnevni Avaz pg 3 'Increase of bread prices in Mostar' op-ed by Faruk Vele — Reporting of the increase of bread by Mostar-based 'Zitoprerada' company, DA editorial says that this case shows that a fear of irregular price increases following the VAT introduction are justifiable. While the company has said that the reason was the increase of price of oil, author argues that there is no doubt that VAT was the reason and strongly urges authorities to deal with such practice: "fishing in trouble waters must not be a foundation for lobby which would profit from reforms that should bring well-being for all of us."

SDS calls on parties to endorse proposed budget RTRS, BHT1, Dnevni Avaz pg 12 'Call to all parties to endorse proposed budget', Nezavisne Novine pg 5 'SDS will vote for budget' by V.P., Glas Srpske pg 2 'They will support budget' by Z.M. — Following the session of the party's Presidency on Monday, the SDS issued a statement expressing the support to a proposal of the RS budget which foresees the increase of education and police salaries and of the pensions. SDS believes that the proposed budget is realistic and balanced, and that it enables the fulfilment of public expectations. SDS called on all parties in the RS National Assembly to adopt the RS budget at the next RS NA session.

FBiH budget expected to be harmonized on Wednesday

Dnevni Avaz pg 2 'Budget for 2006 should be increased for 15 million KM' by Az. D. - Joint Commission for harmonization of the laws adopted in different texts at the level of the FBiH Parliament will hold session on Wednesday to harmonize the FBIH budget for 206. The FBiH House of Representatives adopted the 27 amendments to the budget, which were rejected by the House of Peoples who on the other hand adopted its own 5 amendments. Member of Commission, Irfan Ajanovic, says that most probably amendments of both Houses would be endorsed. "I don't think that there will be a great damage to the proposed budget if we exceed it for 1.1 percent, i.e. 15 million KM," says Ajanovic adding the most important thing is to harmonize texts on time in order to avoid delays in VAT introduction.

RS Pension Fund warned the funds collected so far would not be enough to pay the December pension BHT1, FTV, RTRS, Dnevni List, pg 2 'Too little means for payment of pensions', not signed,
EuroBlic cover pg splash, RSpg 3 'Only bread, water and promises at holiday dine' by SRNA, Glas Srpske pg 2 'Pension as per usual?' by S.R.T.— RS Pension-Disability Insurance Fund (PDIF) warned that the funds collected so far would not be enough to pay the December pension. PDIF Director Slavko Basic explained that only seven out of necessary 42.5 millions KM are currently on a PDIF's bank account.

Brod Refinery RTRS, Dnevni Avaz pg 8 'It is urgent to launch production in Bosanski Brod Refinery', Nezavisne Novine pg 4 'They demand urgent assessment of bids for Refinery' by R.S., Glas Srpske pg 3 'Solutions or new strikes' by M.M.-B.T. — The RS Trade Union of the energy security urged the RS Government to urgently launch the negotiations, and form an expert team that would offer the concrete solutions for the Oil Refinery Bosanski Brod and its workers. Along with Branko Popovic, Branko Grujic, Ivan Korac, Dragan Slavkovic and Dragutin Dragicevic, Filipovic is indicted for killing 22 and expelling more than 1,800 Bosniak civilians from Zvornik. The trial of members of 'Yellow Wasps' unit will be continued on Wednesday before the District Court in Belgrade. Also covered by Sarajevo press.

"This is truly scandalous and I could not have expected anything better from the Government of Pero Bukejlovic", said Osmanovic. - RS Govt's decision was also opposed by Tahirovic, deputy chair of RS POWs Association, Slavko Jovicic, Head of RS Helsinki Board Branko Todorovic and Hasecic Bakira, Head of "Women - war victims" association.

NN says that senior officers of R BiH Army were not processed over crimes committed in Sarajevo Nezavisne Novine cover pg splash, pg 3 'Kazani case is not under investigation' by M.Cubro — Daily learns from the BiH Prosecutor's Office (P0) and Sarajevo Cantonal PO have not processed neither have they been engaged in investigations against any senior officer of the R BiH Army over crimes committed against Serbs at the locality of Kazani near Sarajevo. All those charged and found guilty for murders at Kazani were members of the 10th Hill Brigade under command of Musan Topalovic.

Bjelica's lawyer, Ekrem Galijatovic, claims the indictment has not been properly written. Daily learns that the BiH Court has explained that Ratel grounds indictment on statements by 60 witness, whose names he only listed in the document. Ratel is obliged to submit completed indictment by 31 January next year. Nezavisne Novine pg 5 'Detention against Mirko Sarovic expires tomorrow' by A.D. - reports on reversal of indictment against Sarovic and others, highlighting that detention against Sarovic, Govedarica and Bjelica expires tomorrow. BiH prosecutor's Office could not confirm whether Prosecutor Rattel filed motion for extension of detention. BHT1 by Mirela Cosic — Reporter stated that although the Sarajevo District Court issued a decision stating that IPTF's decision had no legal basis, the officers who were decertified by the UN International Police Task Force are still without the work. Attorney of decertified police officers, Asim **Kadribasic**, condemned the situation adding that even international regulations were violated by this behaviour. "We are going to organize hunger strake in order to point out the injustice and political lawlessness in BiH. We era going to file charges against Council of Ministers Adnan Terzic and BIH Presidency", said the Chair of FBiH Association Ramo Suljic. He stated that Authorities had to solve this issue by December 15th, but nothing has happened. Terzic stated that he personally informed UN and requested the resolution in the entire situation. "I asked UN to accept the recommendation of the Venice Commission. That is all I can do but if they want, I would be very happy to defend myself at the court which is finally outrageous," stated Terzic.

RTRS by <u>Sanja Stankovic</u> — The director of the BiH Directorate of European Integration Osman Topcagic denied the information that European Commission could establish a special team to monitor the reforms process in BiH. The only change in the mechanism of BiH negotiations with the European Union refers to the change of the name of Consultative Working Group into Reform Process Monitoring, stated Topcagic. "I do not know anything about some new and special team... the only announced mechanism are the regular meetings within this Reform Process Monitoring. BiH is not receiving any special treatment, because other countries have the same mechanisms, only under different names", explained director of the BiH Directorate of European Integration. BiH priorities remain the same: cooperation with The Hague Tribunal, police and administration reform, organisation of the united BiH market, changes to the BiH Election Law, and the adequate preparation of the BiH Directorate of European Integration. Topcagic announced that, after the phase of political dialogue with the European Union, in 2006 BiH would enter the phase of economic dialogue, which Topcagic believes is the proof that BiH is ready to join the European integration.

UK Minister for Europe Alexander on BiH 10 after Dayton

This reform is the start of the process of BiH's association with NATO. However, it remains unclear what is to happen with the surplus staff of entity Ministries and their property. Head of the Defence reform Commission Raffi Gregorian explained that the reform of defence is going to be implemented step by step, where one sector after the other is going to be integrated in the state Ministry and Army. RS Minister of Defence Milovan Stankovic explained that most of the staff of entity Ministries and Armies are going to be transferred to the equivalent state institutions. All surplus staff is going to be supported by social programs. BiH Minister of Defence Nikola Radovanovic confirmed this, emphasizing that all employees are going to be taken care of. All property of the entity Ministries is going to be transferred to the State Ministry. Reporter concludes that the whole process of defence reform might be useless if ICTY indictees Radovan Karadzic and Ratko Maldic are not arrested soon.
