<p>FBiH CC VNI Council: draft Law on FBiH PBS endangers Croats' vital national interests, unlike Sarajevo Cantonal higher edu. law and FBiH law on sale of apartments</p>	<p><b>BHT1</b> by <u>Damir Simic</u> – The Council for the protection of vital national interests of the FBiH Constitutional Court has ruled that the draft law on the FBiH public broadcasting service is detrimental to the vital national interests of the Croat people. The court's ruling says that some parts of the law did not offer guarantees that the Croats will not be discriminated against and that they will be equal in the realization of their rights under the FBiH Constitution. The procedure for the protection of vital national interests was launched at the request of a two-thirds majority of the Croat deputies' club in the FBiH House of Peoples. <i>"This decision [of the VNI Council] does not mean that those who support idea on establishing [separate] ethnicity-based channels have won, since the decision does not refer to [point] but to a decision making process"</i>, the Head of FBiH PBS Steering Board, <b>Slavo Kukic</b>. FBiH PBS Director General <b>Jasmin Durakovic</b> claims that the PBS cares a lot about representation of all ethnic groups. Proposed law will once more be sent to the Parliament. European Commission to BiH does not want to comment the FBiH CC's decision, until being submitted one in written. <b>FTV</b> – The Council found that solutions proposed under the Law on PBS in FBiH do not include safeguards which would ensure respect of rights and equality of all three peoples in terms of content productions, as well as the mechanisms to monitor and act in case of violation of this provision. <p>FBiH CC: Draft law on FBiH PBS endangers Croats' vital national interests, Croat MP Antunovic – decision opens door to establishment of TV in Croatian language</p>	<p><b>Vecernji List</b>, front pg splash 'Croats getting television in their own language', pg 2 'Channel in Croatian language is certainty', by <u>Ana Drmac</u> – regarding FBiH Constitutional Court's decision regarding Proposal of law of FBiH PBS, VL carries <b>Zdenko Antunovic</b>, the Head of Croat Caucus in the FBiH HoP and proponent of amendments to the said law (amendments foresee establishment of separate radio and TV channel in Croatian language), who says that the FBiH CC's decision in reality means that his amendments will have to be built in the future Law on FTV PBS. <b>Dnevni List</b>, pg 5, mentioned on front 'Croats endangered media-wise', by <u>D. <p>Session of Mostar City Council got interrupted on discussion of status of HTV Mostar</p>	<p><b>Vecernji List</b> pg 4, mentioned on cover 'Mostar: collapse of authorities and early elections?' by <u>Dalibor Vidacak</u> – VL reports on the session of Mostar City Council held on Wednesday which was interrupted during discussion on the status of HTV (Herzegovinian TV) Mostar. Croat councilors requested that the session be interrupted arguing the right to information is every people's vital national issue. This happened after SDA, SDP and SBiH councilors refused to accept the proposal of Mayor <b>Ljubo Beslic</b> and management of HTV according to which a 40% share would stay in City ownership whereas the remaining shares would be transferred to Canton 7 and 8 municipalities with Croat majority, Posusje, Grude, Siroki Brijeg, Ljubuski, Citluk, Capljina and Prozor-Rama. According to journalist's comment, it would appear that the legislative authorities of Mostar are facing collapse. (NB: SDA councilors reject that the HTV be funded from the city budget claiming that HTV's Statute is inconsistent with Statute of City of Mostar) <b>Dnevni List</b> pg 10 'Removal of Airport Supervising Board' by <u>Esmir Milavic</u> – Article in DL reads that Mostar City Council discussed a number of issues including the work of public companies. At the request of councilor <b>Adisa Vucina</b> (RZB), the Council adopted a conclusion requesting removal of Mostar Airport Supervisory Board. <p>DL on Law on rights and duties of MPs: HR and PDHR made contradictory requests to adopt and not adopt the law, OHR points finger at big benefits of MPs</p>	<p><b>Dnevni List</b>, pg 3 'Contradictory requests by Butler and Schilling', by <u>D. P. M.</u> – According to DL, by failing to enact the Law on rights and duties of MPs, the BiH Parliament was caught in the middle of 'contradictory requests' that have been made by two most senior officials of the OHR, the HR, <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b> and PDHR, <b>Larry Butler</b>. Namely, DL reminds that the HR originally asked from the BiH Parliament to propose sanctions against MPs who block the work of the Parliament, which were supposed to be a part of the abovementioned law, however the MPs 'obeyed' the PDHR, who appealed that the law should not be adopted. However, according to an OHR spokesman, <b>Mario Brkic</b>, " <i>the PDHR was criticizing certain parts of the law with regard to benefits and in particular pension benefits of parliamentarians in comparison to ordinary citizens and taking into account BiH's economic situation. Measures incorporated to prevent blockage of Parliament are unfortunately collateral damage of irresponsible action made by the proponents of benefits amendments.</i>"</p>
<p>DL on Law on rights and duties of MPs: BiH HoR did not have the courage to go against public and OHR</p>	<p><b>Dnevni List</b>, pg 3 'Unscrupulous – MPs refuse to be on miners' level', by <u>D. P. Mandic</u> – commenting on the failure of the BiH HoR to adopt the Law on rights and duties of MPs, the author argues it would appear the HoR did not have the courage to go against the public and harsh criticism, which had been coming from the OHR regarding some contents of the law. The article in particular criticizes one of proponents of the law, <b>Vinko Zoric</b> (HDZ 1990), who apparently said that the MPs should not be compared to miners, who according to him, live of pensions worth 150KMs.</p>
<p>NN op-ed critical of BiH delegates discussing Law on privileges</p>	<p><b>Nezavisne Novine</b> op-ed pg 7 'Delegates to open kiosks' by <u>Mirza Curbo</u> – The author is critical of the fact that not a single delegate at the State Parliament remembered to raise the issue of why discussion on Law on high education was postponed, and priority was given to Law on privileges of delegates. The author stresses: "<i>A complete indolence and insensibility of delegates for issues of lcrucial importance for this land prove the best how they deserve their salaries.</i>" Headline refers to statement delegate <b>Vinko Zoric</b> gave saying it is much better to open a kiosk than to be delegate.</p>

<p>SD: BiH HoR failed to adopt changes to electoral law after OSCE's objections</p>	<p><b>Slobodna Dalmacija</b>, pg 8, mentioned on front 'OSCE prevents attempt of electoral rigging', by <u>B. Kristo</u> – SD notes that the BiH House of Representatives did not adopt Proposal of law on changes to the BiH electoral law, proponent of which was <b>Momcilo Novakovic</b> (MP, SDS) and which were foreseeing that people without CIPS ID cards would be able to vote in the October elections. According to SD, it would appear the MPs listened to what the OSCE Mission to BiH had to say about the law (OSCE objected against the proposed changes). On top of this, SD notes the MPs 'obeyed' the IC by not enacting the Proposal of law on rights and duties of MP after being subjected to pressure from the OHR, namely by the PDHR <b>Lawrence Butler</b>, who objected against big benefits the law would provide to the MPs.</p>
<p>OHR concerned over plans to stop hiring of new staff in state institutions.</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> – OHR said it was very concerned about the BiH House of Representatives' intention to call on the Council of Ministers to freeze all recruitment of civil servants and employees to Ministries until after the formation of a new government. It supports the position of the EC and urges political parties to refrain from blatant political interference in the integrity of the civil service by making such calls and instead to focus on the reform agenda. <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 8 'No interference in work of Agency for state service' by <u>FENA</u> – Senior Deputy HR <b>Peter Bas-Backer</b> stated that such political calls would constitute interference with the proper functioning of the Ministries and the work of the Civil Service Agency, adding that necessary positions should continue to be filled in line with existing legislation.</p>
<p>Council of EU supplements EUSR mandate</p>	<p><b>FTV, Oslobođenje</b> pg 6 'EUSR's mandate supplemented' by <u>FENA</u>, <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 'Mandate of EUSR supplemented' by <u>FENA</u> – EU Council has passed joint action, which supplements the EU Special Representative's mandate, in order to. EU Council press release reads <i>"The mandate of EUSR in BiH <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b> has been modified to include, as a policy objective, support to planning for a reinforced EUSR office in the context of the closure of the OHR, foreseen on 30 June 2007. The financial reference amounted intended to cover the expenditure related to the mandate of the EUSR is €1 million."</i></p>
<p>VN reports EUFOR to downsize for double as January 2007, HR to BiH denies this information</p>	<p><b>Vecernje Novosti</b> pg 5 'No withdrawal' by <u>not signed</u> – Daily reports referring to German press' announcement that the number of EUFOR soldiers in BiH will be downsized for double as of 1 January 2007, which would mean that 3500 soldiers would remain in this former Yugoslavia state as of this date. However, daily adds High Representative to BiH, <b>Christian Schwarz Schilling</b>, has denied this information, saying number of soldiers will not be downsized. Daily learns that reduction of members of European Military Mission in BiH is being under serious consideration. <b>Dnevni List</b>, pg 2 'EUFOR decreases number of troops in BiH?' by <u>A. B.</u> – also covered.</p>

<p>SD: Opinion poll shows SDA and SDP two most popular parties</p>	<p><b>Slobodna Dalmacija</b>, pg 8 'Popularity of Jurisic's HSP going up', by <u>Zlatko Tulic</u> – according to a public opinion poll conducted in July on sample of 3450 citizens from 23 towns/cities in BiH (<b>NB:</b> article does not say who conducted the poll), if elections were held today, it would be the SDA and SDP that would come out on top. Apparently, the SDA would win 24,5, the SDP 17% of votes (of interviewees). SD notes that the SBiH's popularity is going down because only 3,8% of interviewees would vote for the said party. As for the Croat parties, the HDZ BiH enjoys support of 7,2%, whilst the HDZ 1990 enjoys support of 2,5% of interviewees. SD stresses it is HSP Djapic-Jurisic that is on the rise (4,8%). As for the Serb parties, the poll showed it is the SDS that is 'riding' at the front (9,5%) in front of SNSD (6,5%). The PDP is at 1,5%.</p>

## Police reform

<p>Sarajevo Police Commissioner Selimovic new PRD SB Chair; PRD SB extends deadline for proposal of new police structure to 30 November</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> by <u>Dejana Radovanovic</u> – Canton Sarajevo Police Commissioner <b>Himzo Selimovic</b> has replaced <b>Vinko Dumancic</b> in the position of Chair of Police Reform Directorate Steering Board [PRD SB]. Selimovic has been appointed because none of Serb representatives in the Board was willing to take over this position. At the session held on Wednesday, PRD Steering Board decided to postpone a deadline for completion of proposal for police restructuring from September 30<sup>th</sup> to November 30<sup>th</sup>. RS Police Director <b>Uros Pena</b> said that it is necessary to bring the restructuring process back into the framework of political agreement on police reform and stop with decisions which change essence of the agreement. Pena announced that he is going to stick to decisions of the RS Government and the RS National Assembly. Dumancic said that deadline for completing proposal on police restructuring model had to be postponed as it has become clear that the SB won't be able to complete the plan in originally set timeframe. The Board still needs to agree on model of police structures at the state level and new support institutions, such as Police Academy, Forensic Institute and Police Director. The debate on organisation of police structures on local level is scheduled for September. <b>BHT1</b> – Commenting the past work of PRD, Dumancic said that it has been slowed down by rejection of Serb representatives to accept the decision making process based on outvoting and not on consensus, as well as by frequent changes of the SB Chair [Bosniak, Croat and Serbs representatives are rotating every three months]. <i>"You are well aware of the fact that the RS representatives are now engaged in the PRD's work as observers and through our stances we wanted to reach consensus, which could not be reached"</i>, says Dumancic. <i>"Here, we are bringing proposals which oppose the Constitution...we are working on change in the Constitution, which would be a basis for police restructuring"</i>, said Pena on the other hand. <b>Hayat</b> – Dumancic stressed that the deadline for adoption of police structure will be extended until the end of 2006. <b>PINK</b> – According to Pink presenter, model of police organisation on a state level should be established by September 30. <b>FTV</b>, also covered. <b>Dnevni List</b> pg 5 'Influence of politics on police' <u>unsigned</u> – Dumancic stated the pace of PRD work has been influenced by politics. <b>EuroBlic</b> RSpg 2 'Police reform again in dead alley' by <u>D.S.</u> – Dumancic admitted SB has been operating on the principle of outvoting as of May. <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 3 'Deadline for agreement on police reform until 30 November', announced on cover 'Model of police forces until 30 November' by <u>M.Cubro</u>, also reported.</p>

<p>DA: Some PRD SB members that even 30 Nov deadline would be respected; Dumancic says SB agreed on model of police structure at state level, to vote on 16 August</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 8 'Deadline for completion of proposal extended by 30 November' by <u>E.Sarac</u> – Daily carries that “<i>some of the PRD Steering Board members</i>” doubt that even newly extended deadline for finalizing proposal on police structure set [30 November] could be respected due to complexity of job and upcoming elections [referring to time it would take to constitute new authorities]. SIPA Director <b>Sredoje Novic</b> and his Deputy <b>Sead Lisak</b> were not present at the session. <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 2 'Reform proposal postponed for November' by <u>Az.K.</u> Inset 'Model of state organization of police settled' – Former PRD SB Chair <b>Vinko Dumancic</b> confirmed that PRD SB agreed on the model of police structure at the state level. New PRD SB Chair <b>Hilmo Selimovic</b> announced that PRD SB could vote on this proposal very likely at the next session on 16 August.</p>
<p>PDP: police restructuring implementation damages the entire reform process</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> – PDP believes that the method of police restructuring implementation damages the entire reform process and worsens the complete situation in BiH. PDP Executive Secretary <b>Anton Gavrilic</b> said that it's not clear why the police reform is being so rushed, when the talks on constitutional changes are going to be continued only after the elections in October.</p>
<p>DNS Vice President Cubrilovic: Serbs should participate in police reform</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> – DNS Vice President <b>Nedeljko Cubrilovic</b> said that it wouldn't be good for Serbs to miss the chance to participate in establishing of such an important institution such is the reformed Police. Cubrilovic stressed that DNS is against the police reform, as well as against joint Armed Forces. However, being a legalist party, DNS respects all laws and believes that the Serbs should participate in all processes regarding the Dayton Peace Agreement.</p>

## EU integrations

<p>BiH authorities present the Strategy on BiH Integration into the European Union</p>	<p><b>PINK</b> by <u>Zeljko Mandic</u> – BiH Directorate for the European Integrations on Wednesday presented the document titled “The Strategy on BiH Integration into the EU”, a comprehensive paper covering a period from the very beginning of the association process to the admission into EU. According to Pink reporter, this is the most important document for BiH, as it gives directives and sets a ground for BiH’s European path. <i>“The Strategy has been adopted by the BiH Council of Ministers. It is a document that BiH institutions have to follow; it contains 442 precisely worked out measures that should be taken during this process [of admission into EU]”</i>, stated Director of the International Bureau for Humanitarian Issues <b>Zarko Papic</b>. All fields covered by this strategy include basic review of current situation in BiH and EU, as well as all necessary measures; thus, according to Pink reporter, the Strategy discusses the criteria for joining the European Union, ability to take on the obligations that come from the EU membership, strengthening of administrative capacities, EU help and financial instruments, as well as other fields. BiH CoM Chair <b>Adnan Terzic</b> underlined that this Strategy is ‘a product of BiH intellectual force’ adding it represents hours of work of current CoM. Asked to explain when one should expect BiH to join the EU, Terzic said: <i>“If an atmosphere in BiH ‘after’ (RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad</b>) <b>Dodik</b> becomes as it was ‘before’ Dodik and politicians that brought him to power, than we have a chance to become a candidate by the end of 2008. And you know, when you become a candidate, then it is up to the EU to decide when you will become a full-time member”</i>. <b>FTV, Dnevni List</b> pg 5 ‘Big step towards European family’ by <u>R. Dautefendic</u> –</p> <p>The document has passed several revision processes and public discussions, after what the BiH Council of Ministers passed it on April 27<sup>th</sup>. <b>Hayat</b> – Director of the BiH European Integrations Directorate, <b>Osman Topcagic</b>, said the strategy defines issues and areas such as energy, agriculture, transport, environment, fight against organised crime and liberalisation of visa regime. <b>RTRS</b> – BiH Chief Negotiator with the EU <b>Igor Davidovic</b> noted Strategy would be very helpful, as it includes guidelines towards achieving the goal. <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 7 ‘BiH needs to fulfil 442 recommendations on the way to the Europe’ by <u>S.R.</u>, <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 ‘Document that defines steps towards EU’ by <u>T.L.</u>, <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 3 ‘Association depends on police reform’ by <u>M.Cubro</u> also reported.</p>

<p>EC Head Humphreys: Strategy is important, for it gives directives for EU integration in predictive future</p>	<p><b>PINK</b> By <u>Zeljko Mandic</u> – Commenting the ‘The Strategy on BiH Integration into the EU’, Head of the EC delegation to BiH <b>Michael Humphreys</b> said that the Strategy was an important document, because it gives directives for European integration in predictive future. <b>FTV</b> – <i>“The EU wants to see BiH as European states club member. Negative results in constitutional reform could bring the whole issue in question... however there will be no progress in SAA talks without progress in police reform”</i>, says Humphreys, adding that full cooperation with the ICTY should as well be established. <b>BHT1</b> – Humphreys said that he would support every government elected at the forthcoming elections that accepts the European principles. <b>Hayat, Oslobodjenje</b> pg 7 ‘BiH needs to fulfil 442 recommendations on the way to the Europe’ by <u>S.R.</u>, <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 3 ‘Association depends on police reform’ by <u>M.Cubro</u> – also covered.</p>
<p>EU SAA negotiation team welcomes BiH strategy on EU integrations</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> by <u>Radan Skripina</u> – The EU team negotiating the Stabilisation and Association Agreement with the BiH welcomed the adoption of Integration Strategy and said that in addition to the police reform there are others that must be completed to sign SAA. Head of EU team for negotiations with BiH <b>Dirk Lange</b> said that EC has set several other important conditions, such as cooperation with ICTY, PBS reform and public administration reform. <b>FTV</b> – FTV comments that despite slow processes and obstructions in the course of reforms, EU representatives say that they ‘can’t wait to see BiH in the EU’. <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 7 ‘BiH needs to fulfil 442 recommendations on the way to the Europe’ by <u>S.R.</u>– <i>“Issue of police reform is very important for getting BiH closer to the EU, but that is not the only thing that BiH Institutions need to work on in the following period. Trough fulfilling of recommendations, mentioned in the Strategy, BiH has to harmonize itself with all European standards,”</i> said Lange.</p>

<p>3<sup>rd</sup> round of SAA talks between BiH and EU to commence on Thursday</p>	<p><b>BHT1</b> by Marina Boskovic – Third round of Stabilization and Association Agreement (SAA) negotiations between BiH and the EU should commence on Thursday, in Sarajevo. As BiH Council of Ministers Chair, <b>Adnan Terzic</b>, claims BiH is able to become a candidate state for EU membership by 2008. Terzic claims that the CoM does a lot in terms of implementation of crucial reforms and finds the RS Government culpable for halt in reform processes. <i>“There are changes for BiH to become a state-candidate by the end of 2008, if situation in BiH changes into the one we had before appointing <b>Milorad Dodik’s</b> as the RS Prime Minister”</i>, says Terzic. Public Broadcasting System and police reforms, as well as full cooperation with the ICTY, are the main SAA terms. <i>“Our main term is cooperation in terms of search for indicted ones”</i>, said <b>Dirk Lange</b>, EC’s team Chair. <b>Dnevni List</b> pg 8 ‘Negotiations on free movement of goods’ <u>unsigned</u> – Article reads that the main agenda item during the 3rd technical round of SAA talks will be free movement of goods, i. e. customs concessions. <b>FTV, Oslobodjenje</b> 7 ‘Trade, taxes and customs on agenda’ <u>not signed</u>, <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 2 ‘Resumption of talks today’ by <b>FENA</b> also covered.</p>

'Karadzic's Judges still judge in RS' by A. Avdic— Daily reads that at least seven persons who were appointed by **Radovan Karadzic** in 1992, are still employed in the RS judicial institutions. Namely, daily came into possession of Karadzic's decision from 1992, according to which these people were appointed to their positions. **Alija Zvizdic** current President of Bijeljina Municipal Court, was appointed by Karadzic to the position of a judge in that court. **Slobodan Krstic**, was appointed as Judge in Bijeljina Municipal Court, and he still occupies same function. **Alma Salihbegovic** also still occupies the position of the judge in Bijeljina District Court. Daily carries that there are people employed in prosecutions as well, such as **Muhamed Gluhonjic** current Deputy District Prosecutor in Bijeljina, and current District Prosecutor in Bijeljina **Nebojsa Jovanovic**, who were both appointed by Karadzic. Carrying these names, daily stresses that these people are still on same positions, "*even after the judiciary reform*". [Note that half of these names are of Bosniak ethnicity].

Effendi Ceric supports idea of NBS leader Latic on establishment of NGO of fabricate processes' victims

Effendi Ceric gave support to NBS initiative to establish a foundation to investigate political repression of Bosniaks. *"For 100 years Bosniaks lived in fear,"* said Ceric. Following the meeting, Latic said: *"I am extremely proud and encouraged that the authority, such as Effendi Ceric has supported the initiative to establish a NGO for the victims of fabricated processes, where [SDP leader **Zlatko** **Lagumdžija** as organizer, was only the cause for an initiative on establishment of the future institution..."* He stressed that they are planning to start publishing of publications and booklets, in which all fabricated cases and their victims would be described in details. [**Note:** Talking of the 'cases organized by Lagumdžija', Latimc mentions Pogorelica. In 'Pogorelica case', several high-ranking police officials were charged with espionage as well as with setting up and running terrorist training-camp in Pogorelica, which was dismantled in 1995 by IFOR, former NATO's International Forces.].

Technical issues related to trade, industry taxes, customs and agriculture are on the agenda. EC estimates that technical negotiations with BiH are progressing well but reform processes, such as PBS, police and public administration reforms must keep up as well. **Adnan Terzic**, CoM Chair, estimates BiH has a realistic chance to become a candidate for admission into EU by 2008.

<p>BiH HoP in session discussing series of laws and projects, ranging from new ministries to Vc corridor</p>	<p><b>BH Radio 1</b> by Vanja Ilicic – BiH House of Peoples commenced the session today, and at the time of broadcast the MPs were discussing the agenda, which should count several proposal laws as well as information on security situation in BiH for 2005. If the agenda is adopted, MPs should discuss the proposal Law on BiH Central Bank, amendments to the Law on Police Officers and amendments to the Law on BiH Custom Tariff. in first reading, MPs should discuss the proposal Law on Security on Roads, which was proposed by MP <b>Halid Genjac</b>. BiH HoP should also appoint four members of Steering Board of BiH Public Broadcasting Service and establish duration of their mandates. <b>RHB</b> – HoP will also discuss report on the activities related to VC corridor. Feasibility study on the project assessed the VC as a profitable project having a 16.3 % rate of return on investment. HoP will also discuss the issues of BiH citizenship and two new ministries: Ministry of agriculture and rural development and Ministry of technology and environment protection.</p>

In light of this, the RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad Dodik</b>, who also chairs the Council, announced annulling 37 of RS Government acts and would change 31 law ins the process known as “guillotine of regulations”. <i>“In regard to certificates, permits and other formalities, where there are total of 332 of them on RS level and 19 on BiH level, the Council has accepted suggestions of working groups...to preserve 102 formalities or 29.6% to change 43% of formalities and to abolish 27.9% of these regulations,”</i> said Dodik.</p>

<p>'IPSA' and Croatian Construction Institute complete feasibility study on Vc Corridor highway: project will cost 6.9 bn KM and is economically justified</p>	<p><b>FTV</b> by <u>Zlata Behram</u> – Sarajevo company 'IPSA' and Croatian Construction Institute, in cooperation with an Italian partner, have completed feasibility study on Vc Corridor and presented it in Sarajevo on Wednesday. Tender for selection of concessionaire for Vc Corridor should be issued by the beginning of October. Twenty companies from BiH, Croatia and Italy have been engaged in creation of the feasibility study. The highway should connect Budapest with port Ploče, with Neum also connected. <b>RTRS</b> – According to the Feasibility Study, the entire project will cost 6.9 billion KM, including VAT. The total length of highway will be 290,6 km, with a south end point near border crossing in Metković. Experts estimate construction would cost approx. 24 million KM per kilometre of highway. <b>PINK</b> by <u>Adriana Domazet</u> – Reporter notes that Feasibility Study – which has been completed after eighteen months of work and submitted to the BiH Ministry of Communications and Transport – demonstrated the economic justification of this project. <b>BHT1</b> – In case no concessionaire appears, the Ministry has prepared three alternative solutions, however it gave no details. The Ministry has also proposed establishing special department tasked to exclusively deal with the corridor issues. <b>Hayat</b> by <u>Alem Karamešić</u> – <b>Esref Gacanin</b> from IPSA stated that it is hard to find a more valuable project than Vc corridor in this part of the world. Reporter comments that the Feasibility Study has been sent for an audit after which the final version will be announced. Cheapest route of the corridor is Svilaj – Karuse whilst the most expensive one is Tarcin – Konjic. <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 4 'Profit guaranteed to future investors', announced on cover '5C corridor will cost BAM 6.9 billion' by <u>D. Muminović</u> – daily unofficially learns at BiH Ministry of Traffic and Communication that it is unlikely concessionary, who would accept to build the entire highway immediately, will be identified. <p>BiH Transport and Communications Minister Dokic, BiH CoM Chair Terzic: Corridor Vc is very profitable for potential concessionary</p>	<p><b>FTV</b> by <u>Zlata Behram</u> – Referring to the potential of the Vc corridor building, the BiH Minister of Transport and Communications, <b>Branko Dokic</b> BiH Council of Ministers noted the experts found the project worthwhile, as its refund rate has been estimated to 16.3%. <i>"[To a] concessionaire, namely a person with money, while thinking whether to put the money in the bank or invest in this project... this study says that it pays out to invest means in the project since resources would be refunded together with 6.67 % interests rate"</i>, says Dodik. <b>RTRS</b> –He also noted the construction of highway through BiH as part of European Corridor represents state's interest. <b>PINK</b> – <i>"[Feasibility Study] enables us to make a concrete steps that should lead to the real beginning of construction [of a highway]"</i>, stated Dokic. <i>"As of today [Wednesday], Corridor 5c is not a fiction any more. Terzic stressed that BiH has already gained billion euros from international financial institutions and it is expected that now, when feasibility study is done, European Commission would support it is as well.</p>

<p>RS Govt takes over RS Telecom facilities in Banja Luka and Eastern Sarajevo</p>	<p><b>BHT1</b> By <u>Zoran Sarenac</u> – The RS Government has take over from Telecom Srpske two facilities, which are being constructed in Banja Luka and Eastern Sarajevo. Namely, 8 years ago, RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad Dodik</b> promoted a location, where RS Government and RS National Assembly facilities should have been built. RS Minister of Traffic and Communications <b>Nedeljko Cubrilovic</b> says that he does not remember the particular event. The RS Government is going to spend 35 million KM for the project, claiming that it is a better solution than to rent premises for numerous services at different locations in Banja Luka. <b>RTRS</b> – Money invested in these two facilities so far will be refunded through 2006 dividends. It this way, RS Government will have a new building in Banja Luka. The building in East Sarajevo will be used by RS Ministry of Interior. Cubrilovic said that RS Government needs additional space for offices, which are currently being rented.
