	NATO and EU. The Summit decided that NATO would end its
	mission in BiH by end of year, and that EU forces would
	replace it. According to BiH Security Minister, Barisa Colak,
	the decision was expected. Furthermore, Minister Colak says
	the issue of possible presence of Islamic terrorists close to
	Al Qaeda will also be discussed at the Summit. "We have to
	handle the issue seriously. According to our current data,
	there are no signals that could be worrying, but we have to be
	careful. When it comes to that, we have to put in function all
	the security and Police services. We will intensify the work
	within the anti-terrorist team and close down enquiries into
	dubiously awarded citizenships", said Colak. As expected, BiH
	will not joining the PfP at the Summit, however Minister Colak
	says BiH will be a step closer to the PfP after the Summit. VI
	notes that the High Representative for BiH, Paddy Ashdown,

#### HR Ashdown wants to abolish RS and FBiH MoIs?

Slobodna Dalmacija, front and pg 13 'RS and FBiH Police to be abolished?', by <u>Zlatko Tulic</u> – Wondering whether the High Representative for BiH, Paddy Ashdown, will soon abolish the entity Police forces, SD claims that HR Ashdown will, after the NATO Summit in Istanbul, form a commission whose task will be to re-organize Police forces in the entities. The commission will be led by former Belgium PM, Wilfried Martens. SD goes on to say

that according to unofficial information, the commission's priority will be to disband and abolish the RS and FBiH Ministries of Interior. In that context, SD reminds that HR Ashdown had talks with Martens a few months ago, when HR Ashdown stressed that the existence of entity MoIs was unnecessary having in mind the fact

that BiH had the Ministry of Security, and on top of that OSA and SIPA were to be formed too. Furthermore, SD notes the plan is to appoint a commander for the whole Police in BiH within the BiH Security Ministry. SD goes on to report that HR Ashdown informed principals of the RS, Dragan Ivanic, Dragan Kalinic, Dragan Mikerevic and Mladen Ivanic, about his plans at his recent meeting with them at Banja Luka, when HR justified his plan with the fact that the RS MoI failed to arrest a single war crimes suspect. Allegedly, Kalinic, Cavic and Ivanic

opposed the plan, but HR Ashdown told them if they wanted to keep the RS MoI, Radovan Karadzic and Ratko Mladic needed to be arrested.

NN collocutor claims: "RS MOI failed

in regard to arrest of war crime suspects." Adnan Terzic, Chairperson of BiH Council of Ministers, stated that BiH police reform commission would be established by the end of June. He stressed this Commission would have completed its work by the end of this year.

**Oleg Milisic**, OHR Spokesperson, did not want to speak about possible instructions HiRep may give on this issue, according to NN. **Milisic** said: "Commission will be formed soon and its task and composition would be made known then."

### WHC PM Lasic on cantonal education laws

Dnevni List, pg 5 'Adoption of Proposal of law on education despite sanctions', by <u>V.</u> <u>Soldo</u> – The Proposal of law on elementary

and secondary education in West-Herzegovina Canton, for which the OHR and OSCE claim it is not in harmony with the State Framework law on elementary and secondary education, will be submitted to

the WHC Assembly for adoption at tomorrow's session by the WHC Government. WHC Prime Minister, Viktor Lasic, insists the Proposal of law is in harmony with the Framework law. "Although the OSCE and OHR claim our proposal is not in harmony with the Framework law, we claim it is. We will go to the extraordinary session of the Assembly with this proposal, where we will

adopt such article in the law".
Furthermore, PM Lasic says there cannot be
lectures in three languages in the same

time: "If a teacher uses his/her constitutional right and uses the language he/she opts to use, there will be a situation in which rights of pupils are endangered". Lasic continues: "Even some HDZ MPs voted for the Framework law, which does not mean anything because people can make mistakes. MPs are not experts in all the areas of the law, and the sanctions of 5% and announcements of other sanctions will not make us change our opinion. Only if we are proven that we are not right, by arguments, we will change our opinion".

FBiH Defence Minister on difficult financial situation in FBiH Army

Dnevni List, pg 3 'Responsibility for saving of Federation Army on BiH Presidency', mentioned on front, by Vedran Vujovic, Oslobodjenje pg 3, mentioned on cover 'Reception of July class (of regular soldiers) postponed', Dnevni Avaz pg 2 'Nikolic requested stoppage of recruitment' - The FBiH Defence Minister, Miroslav Nikolic, claims that the situation within the FBiH Army is extremely difficult, adding that a possible decision on sending troops home or reduction of forces rests with the BiH Presidency. DL reminds that the FBiH MoD requested for 2004 a sum of 360 million KMs in order to be able to provide normal conditions for the troops, however the MoD is to get only 229 million KMs, which is insufficient. According to Minister Nikolic, the funds cannot secure all the necessary conditions for the professional army and the conscripts. Minister Nikolic notes: "Instead of shifting all the responsibility onto the (FBiH) MoD, we must use the energy to find a way how to continue working with limited finances. We have nothing left but to talk to the competent people in the BiH Ministry of Defence and BiH Presidency in order to find a solution to the situation. One of solutions could perhaps be a postponement of military service".
